Then I will go directly to New York where I will have my exhibit at the Arden Studios, 57th and Park Avenue.

This seems rather soon to go to America again but they wrote and asked me to come and it seems too wonderful an opportunity to miss. Eric's furlough is due next May so it will only be a matter of my being home a few months ahead of him.
