CONDITIONS

1. The contest is open to all students of the University of Oregon, for one essay each.
2. The essay must deal with some phase of the relations between the United States and the Far East. Students from China, India, Japan or the Philippines may write on the international problems affecting their native country.
3. The essay must not be more than 5,000 words long.
4. It must be submitted to the Committee on or before April 1, 1930.

The University is anxious to promote the study of the international relations of the Orient. Several courses dealing with the Pacific or the Far East are offered. Term papers written for these courses may be submitted in the contest.

The essays may discuss any phase of the American relations with the Orient, whether artistic, cultural, economic, educational, geographic, historical, political or religious.
