### CONDITIONS

1. The contest is open to all undergraduate students of the University, for one essay each.
2. The essay may deal with any one phase of the economic or political problems of the Far East, and must not contain more than 5,000 words.
3. It must be submitted to the Committee not later than April 25, 1931.
4. If for any reason it seems impracticable that the winner in Division I should go to the Orient, the Committee reserves the right to substitute a cash prize of \$250.
