Dear Mr. Pfeiffer:

To connect with the recent letter to you concerning the construction of the bridge over the river at the village of Ixtapa, I am enclosing a copy of the original plan which was submitted by the architect, Mr. Gómez, to the government of Mexico. This plan shows the proposed bridge across the river at Ixtapa, consisting of two arches, each 100 feet long, with a central pier. The total length of the bridge is approximately 200 feet. The plan also shows the existing road leading to the village of Ixtapa, and the proposed alignment of the new road. The plan is in Spanish and is dated January 1, 1938.
