Dear Mrs. Maris:

The executive officers of the Northwest College Personnel Association selected you to serve on the Student Relocation Committee, whose function is to work with Japanese Americans, Italians, and German students who will be evacuated from this area.

One of our chief functions, as I understand it, will be to accumulate information about each of the students, for the Army and the institutions to which they transfer. Evacuation of the Nisei college students in Oregon and Washington is imminent. The latest information as to acceptance of evacues students is essentially this: the larger state institutions are not accepting American-born Japanese students until the Army or evacuation authorities indicate their quota. A number of the better smaller colleges have indicated a willingness to take a limited number. Correspondence should be made to these institutions directly regarding specific students.

The following is a list of schools who, so far as we know, are still willing to consider the admittance of a few select Nisei students:
