Dear Colonel Magill:

Subsequent to my writing you a few days ago regarding an American-born Japanese who desires to move from Military Area No. 1 where he is attending school to his home in Military Area No. 2, another circumstance has arisen.

A Hawaiian-born Japanese is going to school at this institution. His home is in Honolulu. He has been advised by the Southern Pacific Company that they can sell him transportation from here to San Francisco without restriction but he has asked us to find out if, when he reaches San Francisco, he will be able to proceed to Hawaii. He can apparently provide the funds for such transportation. He feels that he will be of more use in Hawaii where he is familiar with crop and living conditions than were he to remain here and be evacuated to some part of the United States about which he knows little or nothing. Is it possible for him to go to Hawaii and how can he obtain the necessary permission? Your help will be appreciated.
