WILL OF NATHANIEL COLVER,
JUNE 10, 1805. Written at
CHAMPLAIN, CLINTON COUNTY, NEW YORK.

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN:

I, Nathaniel Colver, of the town of Champlain and county of Clinton, and state of New York, on this tenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner following; that is to say, IMPRIMIS; knowing it is appointed for all men once to die, I give and bequeath my Soul into the hands of God who gave it, and my body I resign to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but that I shall receive the same again at the resurrection of the dead by the mighty power of God; & as touching such worldly estate wherewith God hath been pleased to bless me, I give and bequeath in manner following; IMPRIMIS; I give and bequeath to my loving and dear wife, Ruth Colver, the use and improvement of all my estate, both real and personal during her natural life.

As these of my children have received their full portions of my estate, both real and personal, namely; Nathaniel, David, Ruth and Samuel, I give and bequeath to each one of them so much as the law demands to ratify a Will & make it valid in law. And the remainder of my estate, both real and personal, I give and bequeath to my children which have not received their full portions; namely; Susanah, Philomela, Joseph, Elizabeth, Angelina, Charles, Orondatus and Abigail; and I do hereby appoint and ordain my two sons, David Colver and Charles Colver, Sole executors of this my last Will and Testament.

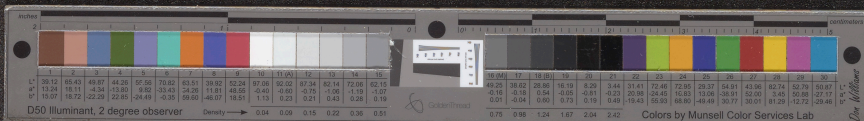
IN WITNESS WHEREUNTO, I have set my hand this, the tenth day of June, 1805.

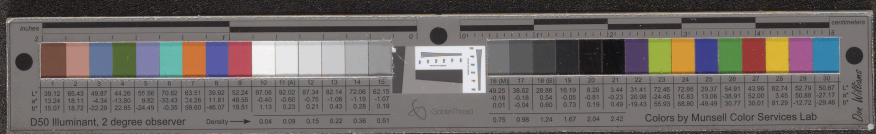
