FOREWORD

This Index was prepared by my son under my direction. It gives a list of articles, names of authors and book reviews found in *the Journal* from Volume I to Volume LIV. The method followed in this Index differs from that on which I had been working at intervals for several years and was adopted on the suggestion of my son. Great care has been taken in checking the numbers and it is hoped that few mistakes will be found.

PREFACE.

In making an index one has the choice either of using a standard method or of creating a system suited to the material. Mrs. F. W. Ayscough in Volume XLIII of the Journal arranged a classified index of the material which had theretofore appeared in the Journal according to the Dewey Decimal System, in use in The Library of the North China Branch of the Royal Asiatic Society. The valuable articles in the last eleven volumes of this Journal 1913-1923 are a sufficient excuse for the making of a new index. For the adoption of a new method of classifying the articles, departing from that of the Library, I can simply make the apology that the Dewey Decimal system seemed too rigid, that it did not allow for the most helpful sort of cross-indexing, and that on the whole a system devolved especially to meet the peculiar needs of the Journal would be more satisfactory. At best such an index must be faulty, for scarcely any index can be arranged which will meet the desires of everyone. I have attempted to follow the guidance of common sense, abandoning arbitrary rules, and so to place the articles that they could most easily be found both by the general reader and by the student.

As regards the classified index of articles, a glance at the summary of the headings will give one the outline of the system. Although a slight usage of the index itself will acquaint one with what quirks there may be in it, perhaps a few pointers will help, for in some cases the line is hard to draw and I may appear arbitrary. What there is about the early history of China has been placed under HISTORY, not under MYTHOLOGY, nor under the legend of LITERATURE. Special sub-divisions have not been made under HISTORY, ART, etc., for the few articles which take one out of China proper into Japan, Indo-China, etc. Confucius I have kept under the heading RELIGION—CONFUCIANISM, not under PHILOSOPHY, TRAVEL; GENERAL DESCRIPTIONS includes general observations made from travels; where any subject is gone into in any detail it is cross-indexed under its own heading, but the student of some specific subject may perhaps be able to find under a general article about some one part of the country which he is studying slight details which may help him. It would be impossible without enlarging and perhaps encumbering this

index to cross index all such small though possibly valuable statements. Those articles which deal only with routes and distances and, treating them specifically, leave out any descriptive matter, are classified under COMMUNICATIONS. The heading GEOGRAPHY, on the other hand, is in this case useful rather for the student of mediaeval and modern geography than the general reader or traveller. Perhaps SOCIAL CUSTOMS may seem to some to steal away some of the thunder which rightfully belongs to ETHNOLOGY AND ANTHROPOLOGY; under this latter are included the racial and social characteristics of the primitive tribes or some custom of the Chinese when it is viewed purely from the limited light of one of these two sciences. Public finance is a part of GOVERNMENT, etc., private, of ECONOMICS. The economic side of money is under ECONOMICS, while its other aspects are under COINAGE, a word perhaps little more inclusive than "numismatics." What distinction I have made between AGRICULTURE, an industry or trade, and BOTANY, a science, will, I hope, be apparent. Cross-indexing has been less necessary than under an alphabetical index, but I have done it whenever the matter of an article could really be divided into different headings, or if it would be of interest to students of various subjects.

A few of the items under Notes and Queries, Literary Notes, Correspondence, etc., which would be of almost no use to the student, I have omitted. The proceedings of the Society have also not been included, though extremely interesting especially for one who wants to know about the growth and accomplishments of the Society. The Reports of The Curator of the Museum, which are included for most of the years, valuable in showing the development of the Museum, could be omitted, since the latest catalogue of the Museum could furnish the information which anyone desired on the Collections of the Society. For the same reason I have left out the "Additions to the Library."

I have followed exactly in each case the particular Romanization of Chinese names which each author has used without any attempt at standardization. The classification by authors may help many, for the time has come when scholars of things Chinese are earning the fame which their work deserves, and when a name will mean authority in a specific field of Chinese research. I have included here the obituary notices, which have appeared in the Journal, of the famous scholars, even though they are not actually authors of articles.

The list of Book Reviews is an innovation, but one which I hope may be of service since the number of books on China is so fast increasing that one often would like for reference a resumé or criticism of a certain book before turning to it or buying it. A classification of these books by material, that is a small bibliography, would have been a great task in itself, and really beyond the purpose of this index.

The method whereby the four numbers of the Old Series are arranged into volumes is not regular, and therefore it seemed best to refer to them by their original numbering rather than by the arbitrary way in which any one set of these early issues happened to be bound.
