Academic Dress

The cap and gown and colorful hood so prominent in commencement ceremonies resemble to some extent articles of dress worn by church and university dignitaries in the Middle Ages. The cap and gown indicate that the wearer is a member of a university or college. The hood shows the degree the wearer holds.

The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves and is designed to be worn closed. The master's gown has closed sleeves, square at the end, the arms coming through a slit at the elbow; it may be worn open or closed. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves and may be worn open or closed. Down the front the doctor's gown has a facing of velvet and three bars of the same material on each sleeve. The facing and bars may be either black or the color distinctive of the subject to which the degree pertains. The cap is worn for all degrees; the doctor may wear a golden tassel.

Hoods are normally black with a colorful lining rolled outward. Bachelor's hoods are three feet long, master's three and one-half feet, and doctor's four feet.

For all academic purposes, including trimmings for the doctor's gown, edgings of hoods, and tassels of caps, the colors associated with the different subjects are as follows:

As juniors they enter departmental honors programs where they attend seminars, pursue reading programs, and conduct independent research culminating in a thesis that is presented at an oral examination. State Scholarships:

Under law created by the State legislature partial tuition and fee scholarships are awarded by the State Scholarship Commission equal in number to 2½% of the enrollment in State-supported institutions. Entering freshmen are eligible to apply if ranked in upper one-half of their high school class. College students may apply if they have achieved a term and cumulative GPA of 2.50 or better. Applications available from Scholarship Committee of the State institution student desires to attend or from high school principals.

In addition, the State Scholarship Commission will award annually one four-year scholarship for each Oregon county and one for each State legislative seat. These scholarships are transferable within the State System after the initial year of the award.

Fee remissions not to exceed \$570 of the \$996 nonresident fee may be granted to students from Alaska or Hawaii whose residence has been in Alaska or Hawaii during the major part of the two years immediately preceding such application.

State Cash Scholarships:

Outstanding high school seniors are eligible to apply for cash scholarships awarded by the State Scholarship Commission. These awards have an annual possible maximum value of \$500 and are renewable until graduation provided a term and cumulative GPA of 2.50 is maintained. Selection based on academic achievement and financial need. The Commission provides each high school principal with scholarship application forms. Recipients may attend any State or private accredited institution.

Gifts

OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION

The Oregon State University Foundation, the nonprofit corporation through which interested persons or organizations may make gifts and bequests to the institution or any of its divisions, has brought indirect as well as many direct benefits to Oregon State. The Foundation fills the need for a legally sound, inclusive, and permanent agency apart from, but working in close coordination with, the Administration. Its purpose is to aid and promote educational and charitable activities and specifically, to receive, hold, manage, construct, exchange, and dispose of all kinds of property, whether acquired absolutely or in trust, for the benefit of the public served by Oregon State University through education, research, and service.

Memorial Gifts

Each year, under a plan promoted by "Friends of the Library of Oregon State University," books are added to the Library as gifts of individuals and groups, in memory of deceased friends and relatives, and particularly in memory of persons who have been closely associated with Oregon State University. Each of the books is appropriately marked with a special memorial bookplate recording the name of the person memorialized and the donor. For the present year \$1,535 has been given the Library for memorial books. In total, 237 volumes memorializing 39 persons have been added to the Library. Since 1943, when the Memorial Book Plan began, 3,372 books have been placed in the Library. These books constitute constructive memorials of enduring worth.

Other Gifts

In addition to memorial volumes, the Library has also received book gifts with an estimated value of \$1,037. These have included the continuing annual gift of the Portland Chapter of the American Society of Metals in the amount of \$100 for the purchase of books honoring W. J. Kroll, internationally renowned metallurgist, who until recently resided in Corvallis. Professor Anaita Jurgenson has continued her annual gifts to the Library with the presentation of two beautiful volumes, Spasskii, I. G. Foreign and Russian orders through 1917, and Amir-anachvili, Chalva, Les Emaux de Georgie.

Gifts of current periodical subscriptions, continuations, and back files of periodicals, with an estimated value of \$1,207, have been received from publishers, industrial firms, individuals, and faculty members. In addition, many books, periodicals, bulletins, serial publications, reports, reprints, pamphlets, and subscriptions to current trade and technical periodicals numbering thousands of pieces have been received from various individuals and companies. The total estimated value of all gifts to the Library, including memorial books, is approximately \$3,779.

HORNER MUSEUM

Since its inception the Horner Museum has enjoyed the support of the public it serves. During the past year many individuals have brought specimens, heirlooms, and personal treasures to all departments of the Museum to be enjoyed by the public. These donations vary in scope from individual items to entire collections. The Museum makes grateful acknowledgment of these gifts and loans that have contributed so much to its progress.
