# Academic Dress

The cap and gown and colorful hood so prominent in commencement ceremonies resemble to some extent articles of dress worn by church and university dignitaries in the Middle Ages. The cap and gown indicate that the wearer is a member of a university or college. The hood shows the degree the wearer holds.

The gown for the bachelor's degree has pointed sleeves and is designed to be worn closed. The master's gown has closed sleeves, square at the end, the arms coming through a slit at the elbow; it may be worn open or closed. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves and may be worn open or closed. Down the front the doctor's gown has a facing of velvet and three bars of the same material on each sleeve. The facing and bars may be either black or the color distinctive of the subject to which the degree pertains. The cap is worn for all degrees; the doctor may wear a golden tassel.

Hoods are normally black with a colorful lining rolled outward. Bachelor's hoods are three feet long, master's three and one-half feet, and doctor's four feet.

For all academic purposes, including trimmings for the doctor's gown, edgings of hoods, and tassels of caps, the colors associated with the different subjects are as follows:

**State Scholarships Awarded by the State Scholarship Commission—****State Scholarships—**

Under law created by the State legislature partial tuition and fee scholarships are awarded by the State Scholarship Commission equal in number to 2½% of the enrollment in State-supported institutions. Entering freshmen are eligible to apply if ranked in upper one-half of their high school class. College students may apply if they have achieved a term and cumulative GPA of 2.50 or better.

In addition, the State Scholarship Commission will award annually one four-year scholarship for each Oregon county and one for each State legislative seat. These scholarships are transferable within the State System after the initial year of the award.

**State Cash Scholarships—**

Outstanding high school seniors are eligible to apply for cash scholarships awarded by the State Scholarship Commission. These awards have an annual possible maximum value of \$500 and are renewable until graduation provided a term and cumulative GPA of 2.50 is maintained. Selection based on academic achievement and financial need. The Commission provides each high school principal with scholarship application forms. Recipients may attend any State or private accredited institution.

The Foundation fills the need for a legally sound, inclusive, and permanent agency apart from, but working in close coordination with, the Administration. Its purpose is to aid and promote educational and charitable activities and specifically, to receive, hold, manage, construct, exchange, and dispose of all kinds of property, whether acquired absolutely or in trust, for the benefit of the public served by Oregon State University through education, research, and service.

## OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

### *Memorial Gifts*

Each year, under a plan promoted by "Friends of the Library of Oregon State University," books are added to the Library as gifts of individuals and groups, in memory of deceased friends and relatives, and particularly in memory of persons who have been closely associated with Oregon State University. Each of the books is appropriately marked with a special memorial bookplate recording the name of the person memorialized and the donor. During the past year 150 gift volumes, memorializing 38 persons, have been added to the Library. Since 1943, when the Memorial Book Plan began, 3,702 books have been placed in the Library. These books constitute constructive memorials of enduring worth.

### *Other gifts*

This year, the Agricultural Research Foundation and the Oregon State University Library established an agricultural book fund as a memorial to Kenneth C. and Bonnie Miller. Money for this book fund was made available to the Agricultural Research Foundation from part of the Kenneth C. and Bonnie Miller estate. Kenneth C. Miller was a son of Henry B. Miller, the fourth president of Oregon State University.

Another recent memorial contribution was a fund established by the friends of Robert J. Chrisman, class of 1914. The Chrisman Fund will be used to purchase material in the fields of Horticulture and Floriculture.

A truly significant gift this past year was received from the estate of the late Dean Emeritus M. Elwood Smith. His personal library of over 2,000 volumes contained several first editions and a valuable collection of theater handbills dating back to the beginning of the nineteenth century.

Another major gift was the Warren R. Randall Collection of about 250 books given by the School of Forestry.

Gifts of current periodical subscriptions, continuations, and back files have been received from industrial firms, faculty members, and citizens of the community. In addition many books, periodicals, reports, reprints, pamphlets, and subscriptions to current trade and technical journals have been received from numerous individuals. The total estimated value of all gifts, including memorial books, is approximately \$14,308.

#### HORNER MUSEUM

Since its inception the Horner Museum has enjoyed the support of the public it serves. During the past year many individuals have brought specimens, heirlooms, and personal treasures to all departments of the Museum to be enjoyed by the public. These donations vary in scope from individual items to entire collections. The Museum makes grateful acknowledgment of these gifts and loans that have contributed so much to its progress.
