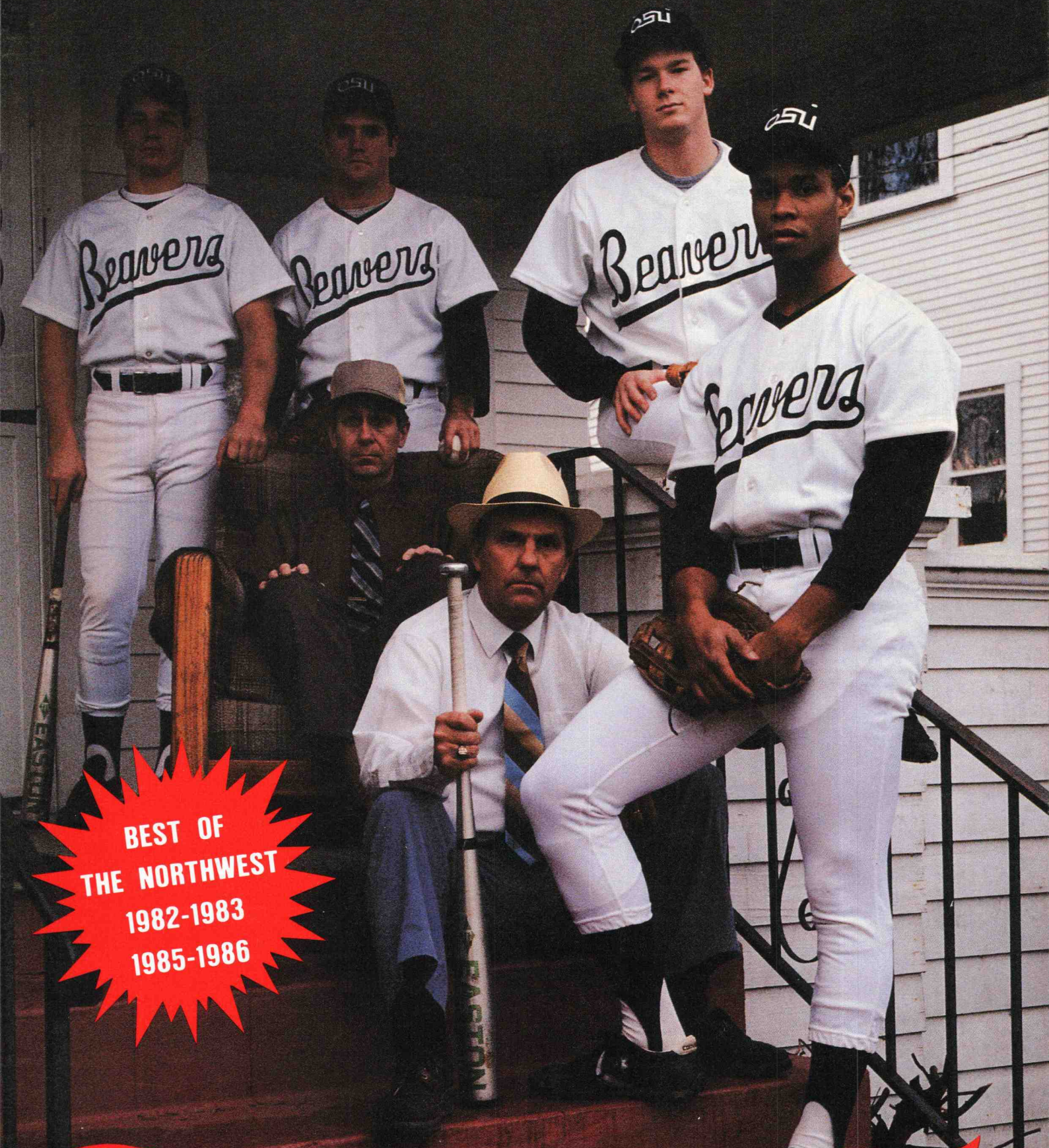

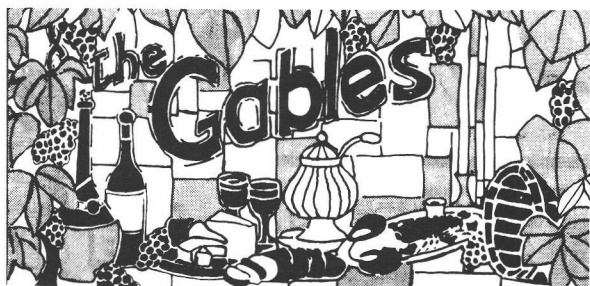

**JACK RILEY**  
**Head Baseball Coach**  
**Linfield, 1960**  
**15th Year**  
**(379-241, all at OSU)**

There have been players that didn't know what to make of Oregon State head baseball coach Jack Riley upon first inspection. Or second inspection. Some didn't realize what he was trying to get through to them until their junior or senior years. Some, sadly, never did.

Riley has weathered a lot of storms through his 15 years of manicuring Coleman Field into one of the nation's finest collegiate playing surfaces and getting his proteges to punish it with hard, aggressive play. As the years have progressed, the message keeps seeping in at a steadily increasing rate.

The 1960 graduate of Linfield College not only instills his own competitive fires into his regulars, but sees them mature into winners off the field as well. Take, for instance, his four returning senior starters from three years under Riley. Not only are all four excelling at their diamond positions, but all are well on their way to degrees with honors.

Winners with educations. Riley molds and motivates his teams. He relishes the work he can do inside McAlexander Fieldhouse during the inclement months as much as he does the bottom of the ninth of a pivotal division game.

He has been the Pacific-10 Northern Division's coach for the 1980's. Coach of the Year in 1982, 1983 and again last year, he has also taken the honors to the regional level and been named as one of the nation's top nine coaches as recently as 1982. In this decade, he has assembled teams that have accomplished the implausible to win division pennants and he has, as in 1986, run away from the field, to post the school's winningest season ever at 39-15 and a final finish of third at the NCAA Midwest Regional. His squads have now been the Northwest's NCAA representative four of the last five years.

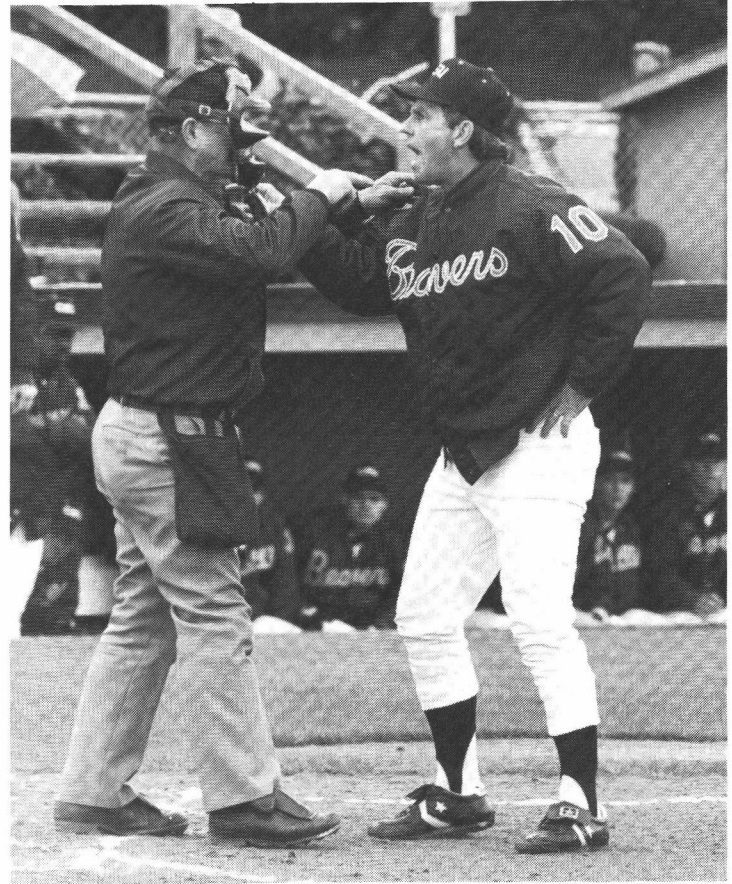
Riley excelled in basketball and baseball at Portland's Grant High School. His days at Linfield earned him all-conference honors four straight years in basketball and three more in baseball. As a senior, he was the NAIA's stolen base champ. He was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers and played for their Salem farm club from 1961 through 1963.

Riley has a wide coaching background which began at Portland's Jefferson High School. He served as an assistant with the baseball and basketball programs until he was named head basketball coach and led the Lions to the state's final four twice.

From Jefferson, it was on to Lower Columbia College as head baseball and basketball coach and athletic director in Longview, Washington. During his tenure at LCC, his baseball teams won four straight Coastal Division titles, while winning the state title in 1970. His overall record there was 97-31.

He obtained his master's degree from Oregon State in 1971 and began his first season as baseball coach here in 1972. His record of 379-241 in those 14 years is impressive and actually overshadowed by a home mark of 170-65 (72%) at Coleman Field. In the last five years, OSU is 94-23 at home (80%).

Jack and his wife, Jean, have two sons, Mike, 28, and Mickey, 26. The latter starred for the Beavers from 1980 through 1983 and is now assisting with the national program in Australia. They also have one daughter, Pam, 24.

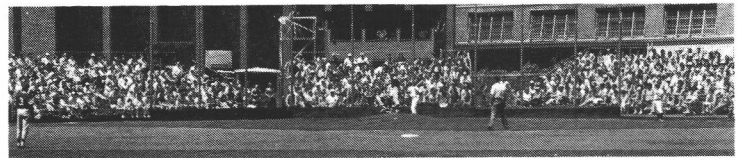

**Coleman Field: Home of the Baseball Beavers**

All of the Beavers' home games are played at Ralph Coleman Field, located on Washington Way, next to the Dixon Recreation Center and one block from Gill Coliseum on the Oregon State campus. Coleman Field has a seating capacity of 2,000 permanent bleachers and may be expanded to accommodate 3,000 with portable seating. Over 3,000 fans have been known to gather for the annual Washington State twinbill. The natural grass playing surface has long been considered one of the finest in collegiate baseball. It is surrounded by a six-foot fence that rises to 20 feet in left field. The distances are 355 to the left field line, 400 to deep centerfield, and 330 down the right field line. It is 385 to the left center field and 365 to the right center field gap. Five years ago, the facility was renovated with the dedication of the field to Ralph Coleman through donations by baseball alumni and the help of the OSU Beaver Club. Orange plastic seat covers were added and the entire seating area was paved. In 1981, the Coleman dedication honored the Beaver alum and head coach of Beaver baseball from 1923 through 1931 and 1938 through 1966—36 years as head baseball coach and 47 all told with the OSU coaching staff. Coleman compiled a record of 560-317, a winning percentage of .639. Further improvements to the field have been accomplished through the hard work of the staff and players as well as through various generous donations.

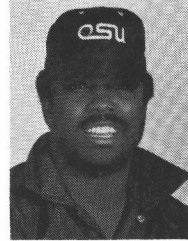


**DEL KERBER**

(Oregon State, 1964)

**PERSONAL:** Originally from Salem, Del is a 1964 graduate of OSU. He received a B.S. degree in Physical Education and returned to OSU for his master's degree in 1967. Del married in 1982. He and his wife, Vicky, have two daughters, Amanda, 8, and Melody, 3. Del was born 1/30/41 in Salem.

**PLAYING CAREER:** A four-sport athlete in three years of competition at Serra High School in Salem from 1955-59. Pitched at Oregon State in 1960.

**COACHING CAREER:** Before joining the OSU staff, Kerber was one of the more successful high school coaches in the state. He started his career at Dallas (OR) High School from 1965 through 1970. His teams claimed one league championship along with two second place finishes and three third place finishes. From Dallas, Kerber returned to OSU to coach the junior varsity program for two years (1970-71). He also coached at Grants Pass High School revitalizing the school and summer programs there before returning to OSU for the third time. On the field, Kerber serves as Jack Riley's assistant coach and the team's pitching coach. Off the field, he is the events manager for all athletic facilities at OSU.

(Oregon, 1975)

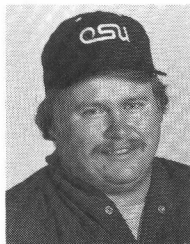

**PLAYING CAREER:** Six letters at Corvallis High in basketball, football and baseball. All-state football player as running back and defensive back. All-state baseball player as first baseman and outfielder. Played football and baseball at Oregon. Rushed for over 1000 yards his junior year. Lettered in football four times, three in baseball. 18th round pick of San Diego Padres in 1975 making the big league roster in 1978. Drove in two runs with his first hit in his second major league plate appearance at Atlanta vs. Phil Niekro. Played several years with San Diego, Brother, Harold, is a second baseman with Seattle and another brother, Larry, played in St. Louis organization.

Back in 1951, enroute to the Northern Division championship of that year, Oregon State baseball compiled the longest winning streak in the school's baseball history. The Beavers won 18 straight before finally losing to Washington State in Pullman, 7-3. Gene Tanselli, former OSU head coach, was a star senior shortstop for that team.

The closest that streak came to being threatened was last year when OSU's winningest team ever put together a 15-game winning streak. This one, too, was snapped by Washington State in extra innings after a controversial call eliminated OSU's winning run in the bottom half of the final regulation inning. It was to be OSU's lone home loss of the year.

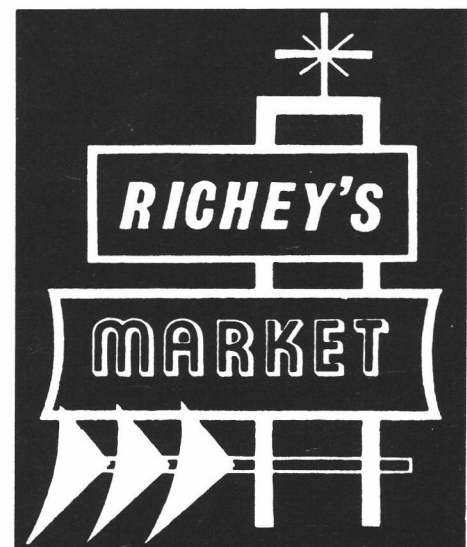

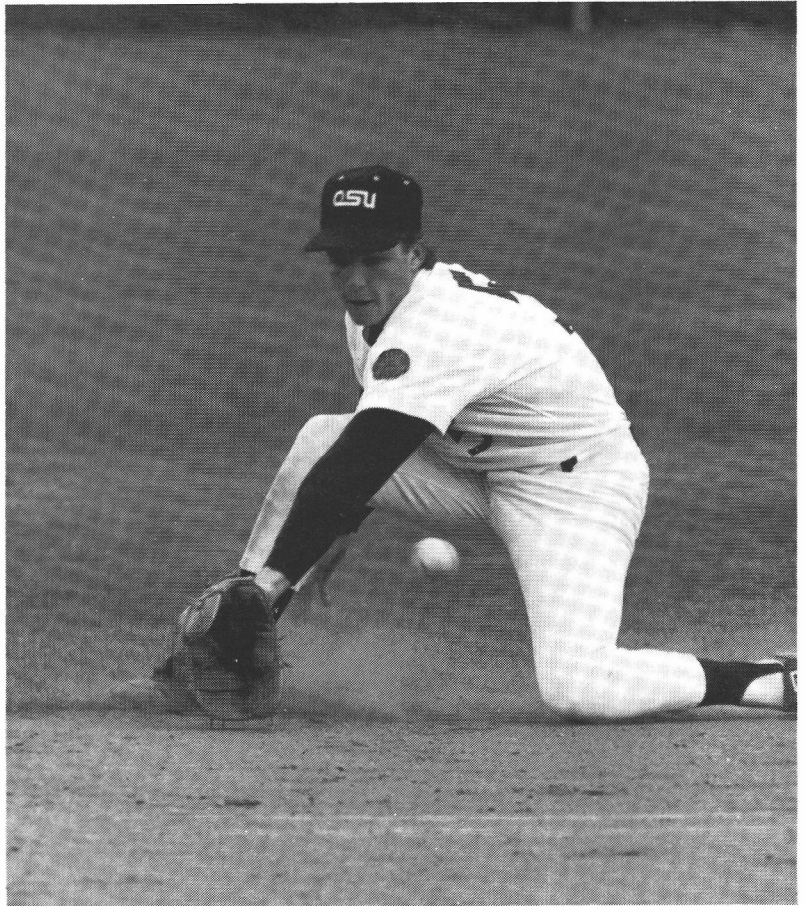

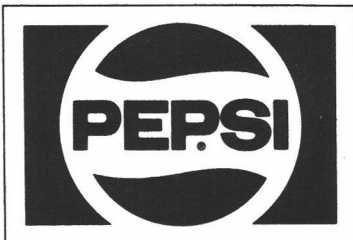
## OSU's History in NCAA Post-Season Play

- 1983:** Lost to Stanford, 14-0, then to UC-Santa Barbara, 7-3, in Western Regional at Stanford.
- 1985:** Lost to Stanford, 17-3, then to Pepperdine, 6-1, in Western Regional at Stanford.
- 1986:** Lost to Arkansas, 4-3, then beat Richmond, 7-1, beat Arkansas, 1-0, then lost to Stanford, 10-7, for third place finish at Midwest Regional in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

### LONGEST HITTING STREAK

Many recent OSU hitters have come close, but Pete Rowe's 22-game hitting streak from May 8, 1976 through March 31, 1977 remains as the longest in OSU Baseball history. Closest since are a pair of 20-game streaks by Mickey Riley in 1983 and Tim Lambert in 1986.
