## Oregon State University

Oregon State University, the largest institution of higher learning in the state of Oregon, was established as a land-grant school on October 27, 1868, under the provisions of the Morrill Land Grant Act. It was the state's first venture in the field of higher learning, and was originally named Corvallis College.

The state wanted to establish a college as early as 1851, and had selected Corvallis, then known as Marysville, as the site. The legislature then reversed itself and decided to construct the college in Jacksonville in southern Oregon.

However, the people of Corvallis went ahead and erected an academy in 1858, operated by the Methodist church. With the adoption of the Morrill act the state took over partial control, and assumed full control in 1885. In 1868 the name was changed to the State Agricultural College of Oregon, later to Oregon Agricultural College, and in 1953 was changed to Oregon State College, although popular acclaim had brought about that name as early as 1927. Just recently it was changed by the state legislature to Oregon State University.

The university campus proper, as well as adjoining agricultural lands, consists of about 4,000 acres, with increases being made yearly as the institution grows in population and need. In addition to the campus area, the Agricultural Experiment station at the university administers and utilizes approximately 24,000 acres, mostly county and federally owned.

The school of forestry owns and administers another 13,300 acres in the Peavy arboretum and the McDonald and other forested areas near Corvallis. These lands are used to teach forestry students actual forest practices through on-the-job training, as well as the research projects for the state and national forest services and the many timber companies located throughout the Northwest.

In addition to the schools of agriculture and forestry, degrees also are given in Humanities and Social Science, Business and Technology, Education, Engineering, Industrial Arts, Home Economics, Pharmacy, Agriculture, Science and the Graduate school. A student indeed has a wide choice of curriculum at OSU, with allied subjects in all fields.

Oregon State University is located in the picturesque city of Corvallis, named for its location in the heart of the Willamette valley of western Oregon. Most recent population (1960) of Corvallis was 21,353, making it Oregon's 5th largest city. Metropolitan Portland is only 80 miles to the north and the Pacific ocean 60 miles west. Corvallis lies in between the Cascade and Coast ranges; with agriculture and lumber forming the chief industries.

Approximately 8500 students are enrolled for the 1961-62 school year, with an enrollment of 10,000 predicted within several years. The university is in the midst of a vast building program, with many new dormitories and other structures spread throughout the beautiful campus.

Some of the better-known buildings include the Memorial Union (student union), Benton Hall, the Coliseum, and Agriculture hall, although newer structures such as Cordley Hall are just as eye-catching. Parker stadium, built in 1953 for football, seats 28,000 fans. Dr. James H. Jensen is the new president of OSU, while R. S. Keene has ben the athletic director since 1947.

### ATHLETIC STAFF

ROY S. "SPEC" KEENE, Oregon State's foremost exponent of good-will and understanding in athletics, long has been recognized as one of the top men in his field. As athletic director at OSU since 1947, he has spearheaded an expansion program that has resulted in this school having an overall athletic program rivaled by few nationally.

Probably nobody ever connected with athletics here has had more friends and fewer enemies than Spec Keene. He combines his vast experience and background with a warm, personal touch, and through the year's he's won a lot of friends for Oregon State.

Keene serves on the executive committee of the NCAA, once was president of the Pacific Coast conference athletic directors association and is chairman of the regional NCAA selection committee in basketball. All one has to do is take a glance at OSU athletic schedules, and they'll find Keene is well-known and well-liked nationally.

Under his direction and planning, OSU built 28,000 seating Parker stadium for football and 11,000 seating Coliseum for basketball. The Beavers have a separate field for every sport, and through Keene's efforts, major awards are now given in football, basketball, baseball, track, wrestling, swimming, golf and tennis.

It's just natural that Keene would be serving his alma mater so well, for he's an Oregon Stater from way back. He was student body president here in 1921, as well as an outstanding baseball player, and at one time even served as an assistant coach for the Beavers.

His first job out of college was that of head coach at Corvallis high, before joining the OSU staff. Next step was OSU where he remained until 1926. Then came assignment as head football coach and athletic director at Willamette university in Salem, where he remained 15 years. At Willamette, his grid machines were the scourge of the Northwest conference and many of his players won little All-America honors.

Spec returned to OSU in 1947 as athletic director and has been on the job ever since. He's a past member of the state of Oregon parole board and served his country well in both World War I and World War II. In the first conflict, he was an army lieutenant, and in the last war was a lieutenant-commander in the navy.

JIM BARRATT, athletic business manager and Keene's top aide, year in and year out tackles one of the toughest assignments of all—making people happy. He's overseer of all ticket sales and various other promotions connected with the athletic program. His unbounding enthusiasm and attention to details helps establish Jim as one of the top men in his field. He wears a broad smile at all times and is a firm believer in strong public relations, Barratt originally is from Heppner where he was a high school star in football, basketball, tennis and track, winning 10 varsity awards. Jim served in the navy in World War II, and graduated from OSU in 1950. He was editor of the Daily Barometer, offical school publication at OSU, his senior year and a member of virtually every honor organization on campus. Jim first became assistant alumni director in 1950, moving to the athletic department at the close of the 1951 football season. He still keeps a hand in the coaching line, however, as golf coach.

BILL ROBERTSON, trainer, has been chief of the OSU tape brigade for 15 years, and long has been one of the most popular citizens in the Corvallis community. Famous for his always well-received vocal rendition of "Casey At The Bat" and dozens of other recitations, Bill is much in demand at banquets and social gatherings. The athletes call him "Rope-sole," and his reputation as an athletic trainer ranks right near the top of that field. Robertson originally is from Vancouver, B.C., but became an American citizen many years ago and has lived in the Pacific Northwest ever since. He served in the army in World War II, and saw duty in both Italy and the Aleutians. Bill is a graduate of OSU.

JOHN EGGERS, sports publicity director, recently observed his 11th anniversary on the athletic staff at OSU. He joined the staff on July 1, 1950, as an assistant to director Irwin Harris, and was moved up to the top spot on July 1, 1952. Eggers was born and raised in Pendleton, the "Round-Up City" of eastern Oregon. He was an all-state basketball player at Pendleton high, a prep teammate of Lew Beck who later went on to win all-America fame at OSU and play in the Olympic Games. Eggers played one varsity basketball season at Willamette while only a freshman before enlisting in the Navy for World War II. After discharge, he attended OSU from the fall of 1946 through 1949. Before returning to the OSU staff, he worked for one year as a sports writer on The Oregonian in Portland.

**COMM HENNESS**, athletic ticket manager, is one of the newest members of the OSU athletic department. He joined the staff on February 1, 1961, after serving nine years with the physical plant at Oregon State. The last three years were spent as an accountant for that department. Henness was born in Fontana, Kansas, but came west to Oregon in 1946. He has lived in Corvallis most of the time since. Comm is an extremely diligent worker and a top specialist in accounting or bookkeeping duties of any nature. As Jim Barratt's right-hand man, he also handles all ticket sales to free Barratt for more promotional administrative work.

### OSU's NEW PREXY

Dr. James H. Jensen, vice-president of Iowa State University for the past eight years, is the newly-appointed president of Oregon State University and will be guiding this institution for the first time in the 1961-62 school year.

He replaced Dr. A. L. Strand, who retired on September 1 after 19 years at Oregon State. Dr. Jensen was selected by the State Board of Higher Education, after an intricate screening process.

Dr. Jensen was born at Madison, Neb., June 16, 1906. He received his bachelor's degree in plant sciences from the University of Nebraska in 1928, and his master's degree from Nebraska in 1930 with a major in plant pathology. He earned his Ph.D. degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1934.

As provost, or executive vice president of Iowa State, Dr. Jensen served as dean of the faculty and also was executive officer of the university in the absence of the president.

In addition to his normal administrative and research duties, he has been a member of the board of directors since 1954 of the Associated Mid-west Universities. He was president of this corporation of 31 mid-western universities in 1959.

He was one of three members of the Interinstitutional Committee on Education Coordination of the Iowa State Board of Regents and has also served as a member of the commission of the North Central Commission of Secondary Schools and Colleges.

An internationally known botanist and plant pathologist, Dr. Jensen brings to OSU a broad background of experience in University teaching, research, federal government work and foreign assignments.

During the last several years, Dr. Jensen watched with interest the rise of Iowa State University in the football world, under Coach Clay Stapleton, formerly the No. 1 aide to Tommy Prothro.

It is the hope of OSU grid followers that the Beavers have one of their better seasons in Dr. Jensen's first year as top executive for this institution.

- 1. Ken Carpenter. He fired  $10~\mathrm{TD}$  tosses for Beavers in 1948, his junior year.
- 2. Ralph Davis. The present head track coach at Portland State College played for the Oregon Frosh prior to military service in World War II, then transfered to OSU in 1946-47.
- 3. Skip Russell. Recommended highly by Clay Stapleton, he originally decided to concentrate on studies. Made excellent grades and finally decided to turn out for varsity his third year in school.
- 4. Nope, it wasn't Don Durdan, as you might think. It was Carlos 'Cub" Houck, who in 1951 won varsity basketball and baseball letters, in addition to his football achievements. Houck is now a road-building contractor in Salem. Durdan's achievements came in the 1940-43 era.
- 5. George Peters, and a good one he was—as Prothro will attest.
- 6. The year was 1907, when Oregon State under F. S. Norcross had a 6-0-0 season and scored 137 points to none for the opposition.
- 7. Clyde Devine, in 1932-33-34, and Neil Plumley of the present squad tie for the honor. Each measured at 6-6. Devine was a member of "Iron-Man" eleven of 1933 that tied national champion USC, 0-0, without use of any substitutes.
- 8. Bob Watson. Playing for Medford, he was all-state 1st team in 1946, after winning 2nd team berth the year previous.
- 9. At least five to choose from are the late Tommy Swanson, the late Bob Dethman, Hal Puddy, Don Samuel and Bud Gibbs.
- 10. The late Art Taafe, who served from 1926-1937. Others since have been Bud Forrester, Irwin Harris and presently John Eggers.

# THE COACHES

# TOMMY PROTHRO Head Coach

When Tommy Prothro arrived to take over the head coaching reins in 1955, even the most loyal Beaver fans worried about how long Oregon State would be able to keep such an up-and-coming grid tutor.

They were even more skeptical as the southern gentleman from Tennessee led OSU to a pair of Pacific Coast Conference championships and a trip to Pasadena in the Rose Bowl game.

"A great coach," said the opponents, "but he won't be at

Oregon State much longer."

And so it has gone, through Prothro's highly-successful stay in Corvallis, where in six seasons he has compiled a 36-21-2 won, lost and tied record against just about the foremost foes to be found anywhere. None on the coast can match it; few in America can.

Thus now Tommy Prothro starts his 7th season as the architect of winning football at Oregon State University. What he

has accomplished here is near-legend already.

When he came to OSU, the Beavers had just experienced their worst season in half a century of football. They had won the 1954 opener against Idaho, then lost the remaining eight games of the season by scores of anywhere from 20 to 70 points.

Then, in 1955, Prothro surprised everyone with a second in the PCC race with a respectable 6-3 record. In 1956, it was a championship, and bid to the Rose Bowl. A year later, Oregon tied OSU for the PCC crown and went to Pasadena simply because the Beavers were ineligible, having been there the year previous. OSU beat Oregon, 10-7, in the year they tied for the title.

Actually, Oregon State has experienced only one losing season under Prothro. That came in 1959, when the Beavers suffered a rash of injuries and dropped some heartbreakers. The injury jinx prevailed again in 1960, too, but it didn't stop Tommy's forces from recording a 6-3-1 record, with close losses to a pair of national leaders, Washington and Iowa.

The cagey mentor, son of J. Thompson "Doc" Prothro who at one time managed the Philadelphia Phils in baseball and for years was well-known in that sport, competed in football, basketball and track for Central high in his native Memphis, Tenn. That was 1934 through 1936. He also participated in those sports at Riverside Military Academy in 1936-37-38.

Tommy was a star blocking back under Coach Wallace Wade at Duke, playing against OSU in the "transplanted" Rose Bowl game of January 1, 1942, at Durham. He won the Jacobs award as the best blocker in the south and the Mills award as the best blocker in the east. He also competed in baseball and lacrosse at Duke from 1938 through 1942, when he graduated.

Prothro was a naval officer in World War II, and already had served a stint as line coach at Western Kentucky. After discharge in 1946, he coached the Vanderbilt university "B" squad and in 1947 became backfield coach under Sanders at Vanderbilt. Prothro went to UCLA with Sanders in 1949, as backfield coach, and remained there until he took the OSU position.

Tommy, still well-known and well-liked in the LA area, developed some top backs as UCLA ruled the western roost and won the national title in 1954. Among those were Paul Cameron,

Primo Villaneuva and Bob Davenport, although Oregon Staters would tell you their own Joe Francis was better than all three. Tommy took Francis when he was a sophomore, and made him into one of the top single-wing tailbacks of all-time. Beaver fans still like to remember Francis' great effort of 203 yards against Iowa in the 1957 Rose Bowl game.

Tommy's father, now semi-retired and living in Memphis, occasionally gets to watch Beaver teams perform, as does Tommy's mother. Tommy's wife is the former Shirley Seagle of Memphis. He has a daughter, Ann, who lives in Franklin, Kentucky.

# ASSISTANT COACHES

# BOB WATSON

# Senior Assistant

One of Tommy Prothro's greatest attributes has been the ability to surround himself with hustling young assistants-men who eat, sleep and talk football. One falling in that category is Bob Watson, who in 1958 became senior assistant on Prothro's successful coaching corps.

Watson needs no introduction to state of Oregon sports fans. for he was one of the all-time greats in this state in both football and basketball. While a prep star at Medford high school, he won all-state honors in both sports and was widely sought by numerous colleges.

Watson enrolled at UCLA and played three seasons of varsity football there-both as end and back. He graduated from UCLA in 1951 and assisted with spring practice sessions there when free from his job with a metropolitan firm in that area.

When Prothro won the OSU coaching assignment in 1955, one of the first he contacted about becoming an assistant was Watson. The latter, of course, was on Tommy's first staff here in 1955 and has been a solid fixture since.

He is married and has two children.

# BOB ZELINKA Line Coach

Small in size, but a true "fireball" when it comes to coaching zip and determination—that's a brief description of Bob "Tiger" Zelinka, Prothro's young capable line coach who came here with Tommy in 1955.

Zelinka, though highly firm with the men he coaches, nevertheless has been extremely popular with all. One of his greatest boosters is John Witte, all-American tackle in 1956, who was a

Zelinka protege.

The "Tiger" was a prep star in Los Angeles and later became a prize guard at Santa Ana junior college before transferring to UCLA. He played for the Bruins in 1950 and 1951, graduating in 1952. Zelinka assisted with spring practice at UCLA and coached the line for San Diego Navy in 1952-1954. He then returned to UCLA as freshman line coach.

Zelinka, like all the other coaches, is a man devoted to football who can show the players first-hand what he expects them to do. Just as important, he provides much of the spirit so necessary in daily workouts. He is married, and the father of two

daughters.

# RON SIEGRIST Assistant Coach

First player coached by Tommy Prothro at Oregon State to become a member of the Beaver staff—that's the story of young Ron Siegrist, who returned to his alma mater three years ago.

Ron was blocking back, co-captain and signal-caller on Prothro's first OSU team in 1955 that surprised all by finishing second in the PCC race. Prior to that, Siegrist had played t-formation football under Kip Taylor here in 1952 and 1953 but did not participate in 1954.

The new addition to the staff was a highly-successful prep mentor at Notre Del Rio high in Sacramento from 1956 through 1958. His last club there was ranked No. 1 Class A in all northern California, as he used the identical system to that he played

at OSU.

As a player, Siegrist went all-out on every occasion, and was regarded as one of the sharpest signal-callers in the trade. He is married, and the father of three children.

# BOB GAMBOLD Assistant Coach

Joining Oregon State's grid staff last winter was the former No. 1 aide at Washington State under Jim Sutherland, tall and talented Bob Gambold. Originally from Longview, Wash., Gambold starred at Quarterback for the Cougars in the 1948-50 era and also was a member of WSU's northern division championship basketball team of 1950.

After graduation, Bob coached the Cougar Frosh several years and then played pro football with the Chicago Cardinals and Philadelphia Eagles. In 1954, he became head basketball and baseball coach at Everett (Wash.) JC, a post he held until joining the Cougar grid staff in 1956.

Gambold proved highly valuable in OSU spring drills and is a welcome addition to the Beaver staff. He and Mrs. Gambold

are the parents of three daughters and a son.

# JERRY LONG Assistant Coach

A former Oregon State football guard, personable Jerry Long, has joined the Beaver staff for the first time, after five seasons

as line coach at Willamette university in nearby Salem.

Long came to OSU fresh out of Franklin high school in Portland and lettered for the Beavers in 1946 and 1947. He graduated in 1950 and picked up prep coaching experience at Brownsville, Astoria, Rainier and Tigard, before joining Ted Ogdahl as his top aide at Willamette.

A prime student of football, Jerry is also adept stimulating squad spirit and makes a fine running mate in that category for "Tiger" Zelinka. Long also is likely to prove his worth in the recruiting department. He is married and the father of

three children.

# BOB McKITTRICK Assistant Coach

A true Tommy Prothro product is hustling Bob McKittrick, who played under his present boss at Oregon State in 1955-57-58, and just joined the Beaver staff following discharge from the

Marine Corps.

McKittrick hails from Baker, and worked his way up the ladder in OSU football. He saw only 30 minutes service in 1955, but lettered on the Rose Bowl team of 1956 and was a solid regular in 1957, when the Beavers repeated as champions of the PCC. Bob was a guard, and a good one.

Noted for his determined type of play, McKittrick demonstrated he'll be the same type of coach in spring drills. An excellent student scholastically while an undergraduate, he was a well-rounded man on campus.

McKittrick is married and the father of two children.

Fine speed, with 21.1 to his credit in track in the 220 last spring. Missed contact working spring drills with pulled muscle. Prep teammate of Kasso at Berkeley. BILL MONK, 5-11, 183, sr. letterman from Ventura, Cal. Looked good as junior, prior to injury that sidelined him much of season.

# RIGHT HALF

HANK RIVERA, 5-11, 180, sr. letterman from Los Angeles. Probably can do more things well than any squad member. Has performed at end and fullback in past, but will operate at wingback spot now. Road games against Wisconsin, Arizona State, Washington, Oregon and Houston may be too much of an obstacle to overcome.

Yet the Beavers will be playing more games at home than in many years, and that is sure to help. They like to hear those encouraging shouts from Corvallis backers as they trot out onto the magic turf of Parker stadium. After meeting Syracuse at Portland, OSU will face Stanford, Idaho, Washington State and

Brigham Young in their favorite place of business. Yes, the schedule is tough, but Oregon State will be tough, too. And the mere fact that dyed-in-the-wool-single-winger Mr. Prothro has added the t-formation to his vast grid repertoire means that Corvallis followers will have some exciting moments

this fall.

Call him a quarterback, or a tailback. It's all the same. Terry Baker is a terrific athlete, a young man around whom many hopes are constructed for 1961. He'll direct the team, call the plays, handle much of the passing, running and kicking. This 6-3, 195 junior made football history at OSU as a sophomore, with 1473 yards gained rushing and passing. Now he should be even better.

Rivera to Help

Tall and talented Terry won't be alone out there each Saturday. He'll have fancy-footed Don Kasso at left half, hustling Hank Rivera at wingback and fast-moving Tom Gates at fullback. They can all scoot, and all except Gates are experienced hands. Kasso and Rivera both are senior veterans, while Gates is a junior college transfer who showed all kinds of promise last spring.

It's a fine starting backfield, but one lacking in depth behind it. Last season injuries almost ruined Oregon State; if the same thing happened again, the Beavers would be in real trouble. Most replacements in the backfield are new and un-

seasoned, though still with good potential.

The line has more depth than the backfield, and that of course is encouraging. It isn't true in all positions, but is in some. The ends who start likely will be Roger Johnson and Skip Russell, two senior veterans. Both looked good last spring, and should be ready for their best year ahead.

Tackles Big, Smart

OSU will have at tackles two of the biggest, best and yes, smartest, football players in America. Mike Kline is 6-0, and 235, while Neil Plumley is 6-6 and 240. Football-wise, both are plenty good. Kline was all-coast second team last year. But they shine in the books, too, where both are honor students in the school of Business & Technology. Their slogan might well be: "If we can't overpower 'em let's out-smart 'em.'

Mike Dolby and Norby Keolanui, two more vet holdovers, probably will start at guards, although George Gnoss and Ross Cariaga aren't far off the pace. At center, the Beavers come up with Marne Palmateer, Dick DeBisschop and John Farrell, although linebacking duties on defense are closely intermingled.
