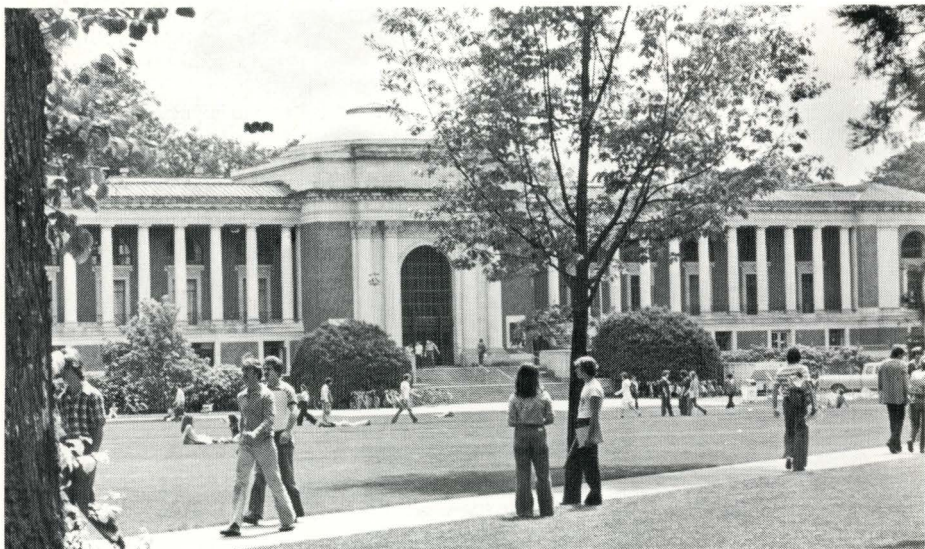

A new president will lead Oregon State University into its 117th year as one of the leading educational and research centers in the United States.

John V. Byrne assumed office in November, 1984, becoming OSU's 14th president.

Byrne, 57, is a former vice president at Oregon State and most recently Administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. He returns to OSU, the oldest state supported institution of higher learning in Oregon, with a charter day of Oct. 27, 1868.

Oregon State is one of just a handful of universities in the United States which is both a Land Grant and Sea Grant institution. OSU, in addition to its main campus, has research bases at the OSU-Hatfield Marine Science Center in Newport and at a dozen Agricultural Experiment Stations around the state.

National leadership is also provided by the university in fields other than oceanography and agriculture, including

forestry, veterinary medicine, food science, education, high technology, pharmacy, gene research, business administration and home economics.

The first graduating class at OSU, in 1870, consisted of a grand total of three persons, two men and one woman. Since that time, the school has grown to where it now confers some 3,000 degrees each June and enrollment is more than 15,000. But the emphasis remains on the individual.

The program offerings are plentiful and of high quality at Oregon State in both undergraduate and graduate fields. About one out of every six students at OSU is in the Graduate School. Bachelor's degrees are offered in some 150 fields; master's in 100 fields; and doctorates in 50 fields.

Oregon State's campus is one of the most picturesque in the West, based at the foothills of the Coast Range in the fertile Willamette Valley. Many of the buildings at OSU are made of red brick, while some of the newer structures have modern architectural design.

## GILL COLISEUM—Home of OSU Basketball

Gill Coliseum, home of the Oregon State women's basketball team, has a new look following the 1984-85 season.

Seating capacity for the multi-purpose arena has been raised to 10,500, but there are more aesthetic changes as well. The outer lobbies have been given a more modern look with carpeted walls and tiled floors. Several classrooms and meeting rooms have been added and the lower part of Gill will consist entirely of theater seats for more comfortable viewing.

Gill Coliseum has been considered the perfect arena for spectators since it was opened in December of 1949. Despite its size, covering 1.3 acres, there are no posts to obstruct the view within the main arena. And 80 percent of the seats are located to the side of the court for better viewing.

The coliseum was named after Slats Gill,

Oregon State men's basketball coach for 36 years and later athletic director.

During the 1976-77 season, the OSU women's team first began playing its games in Gill on a regular basis. During the first couple of years, many of those games were played as doubleheaders with the men's team and the Beavers will have a pair of twinbills this season.

Since 1976, the OSU women have hosted national teams from the Soviet Union, the Republic of China and the Republic of Korea, as well as club teams from Japan and Australia. The Beavers have also drawn national champion USC and several other powerhouse teams from around the country to Gill, where OSU coach Aki Hill has compiled a home record of 60-10 during the last six years, including an incredible 45-5 mark over the last five seasons.

In just seven seasons at Oregon State University, women's basketball coach Aki Hill has transformed the Beaver program into one of the finest in the country.

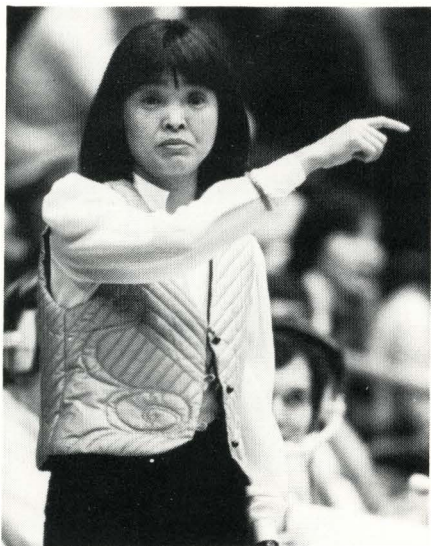
Hill has guided the Beavers into post-season play in six of her seven seasons, including two consecutive NCAA appearances, 1983 and 1984. She has led Oregon State to 20 or more wins in five of the last six seasons and has a career winning percentage of .731. She has coached an All-American center, an All-American forward and an All-American guard at OSU. And she was named Coach of the Year by her peers in the Northern Pacific Athletic Conference (NorPac) in both of the league's first two years.

The 44-year-old Hill is regarded as one of the best women's basketball coaches in the country and has a style unique among collegiate women's teams. Her halfcourt press defense is an Oregon State tradition as is the Beavers' 40 minutes of constant pressure.

Hatsue Aki Hill is a native of Japan. She trained under some of basketball's most noteworthy authorities, including the legendary UCLA coach John Wooden. Other mentors of Hill include Tatsuo Hata, a leading Japanese authority on basketball; Hall of Famer Pete Newell; and Stu Inman, director of player personnel for the Portland Trailblazers.

Hill has spent the past 25 years playing, studying and coaching basketball. Her U.S. coaching career began in 1976, when she was an assistant at Foothill Community College and Santa Clara University in California.

In 1970, Hill became the first and only woman coach in Japan's 75-team AAU organization. She coached the Tokyo Marine Insurance teams, guiding one to a second place national finish during her final year.



In 1972, Hill took a leave of absence from coaching to study in a special program under Wooden at UCLA. She is one of the few women, or Japanese, coaches to have such an extensive background of training in the United States.

As a player, Hill competed for three years in high school basketball, then seven years on an AAU first division team in Japan. She was a starting guard for the Tokyo Marine Company, the same team she later coached. Her team won the national championship in 1965.

Hill has been nominated for national Coach of the Year honors four times in her seven years at Oregon State. She has to her credit a pair of National Women's Invitational Tournament titles, two Northwest Women's Basketball League crowns and a NorPac championship.

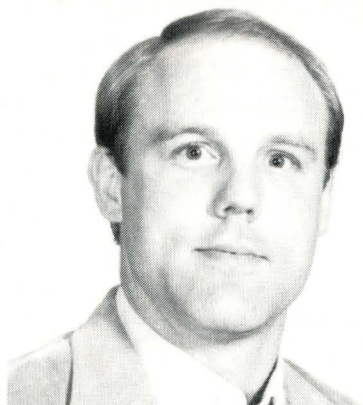

Alan Lambert joins the Beaver basketball program after a year at Penn State University where he served as graduate assistant coach for the Nittany Lions, who ranked ninth nationally in 1985 and won the NCAA Eastern Regional Championship.

Lambert, 30, is a 1978 graduate of Western State College in Gunnison, Colorado. He earned two letters in basketball at Western State earning All Rocky Mountain Conference Honorable Mention. He captained his team in 1978 and led the team in assists while shooting 53% from the field. Lambert also attended Cuesta Community College in San Luis Obispo, California for two years again lettering twice in basketball.

For four seasons he worked as an assistant men's coach at Cuesta after graduation, helping his team to the California State Junior College Playoffs three of those seasons. The 1975-76 Cuesta team finished as league champions and reached the Final



Four of the California JC championships.

Lambert received a masters degree from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo in 1981 in Physical Education and will finish Ph.D. work from Penn State University some time in 1986. While pursuing his Ph.D. at Penn State he assisted the Lady Lions basketball team to their best ever finish and a 28-5 record.

A graduate of San Luis Obispo High School, Lambert was second team All-Northern League.

He is married to the former Geri Owen and he has one brother, Russell, 31, and one sister, Pamela, 24.

One of Oregon State's all-time top players will return to the Beaver program this season as an assistant. Robyn Clark, 24, who ranks among the Beaver career leaders in several major categories, is back with the Beavers after playing a year of professional basketball in Belgium.

A 1984 graduate of Oregon State with a B.S. degree in business administration, Clark is the fourth leading scorer in OSU women's basketball history with 1009 points to her credit. She also ranks in the top 10 for the Beavers in rebounding (2nd with 612), assists (4th with 258) and steals (4th with 238). She averaged 8.7 points a game during her four seasons with the Beavers and earned Honorable Mention to the NorPac Conference All-Star team her senior season (1984). She was also Beaver co-captain as a senior and played on two NWIT champions and the 1984 NorPac champions.



She played professionally for the Monceau Sur Sambre Belgium team that won the national championship of Belgium in 1985.

Originally from Waco, Texas, Clark attended Clover Park High School in Tacoma, Washington before attending Oregon State. At Clover Park she competed in volleyball, basketball and track. She was twice an All-Conference player in basketball and finished third in the state high jump in 1979.

# ADMINISTRATION

## President of Oregon State

JOHN V. BYRNE

The 14th president of Oregon State University is John V. Byrne, who succeeded Robert W. MacVicar following his retirement in November of 1984.

Byrne, 57, is a former vice president for research and graduate studies at Oregon State. He spent 21 years at OSU before he was nominated by President Reagan in 1981 to head the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. The U.S. Senate confirmed his appointment and Byrne served as NOAA Administrator for three years.

The new OSU president has also been U.S. Commissioner to the International Whaling Commission and was a member of advisory panels for the National Science Foundation, and the Departments of Agriculture, Interior, State, Commerce and Defense.

Born May 9, 1928, in Hempstead, N.Y., Byrne is a graduate of Hamilton College in New York. He received his bachelor's degree in marine geology from Hamilton in 1951, earned a master's in geology from



Columbia University in 1953, and was awarded his doctorate in marine geology from the University of Southern California in 1957.

Byrne joined the Oregon State faculty in 1960 as an associate professor in what was then the department of oceanography. He was promoted to department chairman of the growing program in 1963, earned full professor status in 1965 and was appointed dean of the OSU School of Oceanography in 1972 (the program is now the College of Oceanography).

## Athletic Director

DR. LYNN J. SNYDER

Lynn J. Snyder, 43, became Oregon State's ninth Director of Intercollegiate Athletics in June, 1985. He replaced Dee Andros in the Beavers' top athletic administrative position.

Snyder came to OSU after six very successful years as Director of Athletics at Marshall University in Huntington, West Virginia. Under his direction, Marshall's athletic program made tremendous strides. Among his accomplishments were doubling the athletic budget in six years, while state support was cut in half. Major improvements in academics were also made during his tenure at Marshall.

The Marshall athletic program blossomed at the same time. Berths in the NCAA basketball championships his last years, the first winning football season in 19 years and school record attendance figures in basketball and football are among his major achievements.

Marshall also received several facility improvements with Snyder at the helm, including a new basketball arena, a new baseball facility and a new training table facility.



Snyder has also served as an assistant Athletic Director and Associate Athletic Director at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, his alma mater. He received his B.S. degree in Personal Management in 1964 and his M.Ed. in Educational Psychology in 1969. He earned his Ph.D. in Educational Psychology in 1978. Snyder is a graduate of Mount Vernon Township High School in Mt. Vernon, Illinois.

## **Deputy Athletic Director** **DR. SYLVIA MOORE**

Dr. Sylvia Moore was named OSU's first deputy athletic director following the merger of the Oregon State men's and women's athletic programs in July, 1982.

The number two administrator in the department, Moore has been at OSU since 1966. An associate professor, Moore has had a busy and varied career at Oregon State. She first taught a number of professional preparation courses for physical education majors, and was acting head advisor in coordinating the undergraduate program in 1975-76. She was named acting director of women's athletics in 1977-78 when the program was a part of the physical education department. She was OSU's interim Athletic Director last year.

Moore coached the Oregon State women's basketball team for the 1966-67 season, and was the women's gymnastics coach from 1966 to 1974. She was named director of women's athletics in July, 1980, after working as an administrative intern in the President's Office the previous year.



A 1963 graduate in physical education from the University of Washington, Moore earned her master's degree in motor learning from the University of Oregon in 1966. She received a doctorate in social-psychology of sport in 1980, also from the University of Oregon.

## **Event Manager** **DEL KERBER**

After eight seasons as assistant baseball coach and three years as Paul Valenti's assistant for game management, Del was named to the full-time staff as event manager replacing Paul Valenti in 1983. Del also has continued in his role as assistant baseball coach.

Kerber graduated from Oregon State in 1964 and continued his education with his Masters from OSU in 1967. He enjoyed some fine seasons as a prep baseball coach at Dallas and Grants Pass High Schools before returning to Oregon State in 1976.

Del played baseball at both Serra High School in Salem and Oregon State. He is married. His wife, Vicky, was a former administrative assistant in the Beaver Club and they have two daughters, Amanda, 7



and Melody, 2. He was born January 30, 1941 in Salem, Oregon.

## Academic Counselor

DR. MIKE BEACHLEY

Mike was appointed Oregon State's academic counselor for the athletic department July 1, 1985. Mike joined the athletic department after spending nine years as an assistant professor in Oregon State's Department of Speech Communication. Prior to joining the OSU staff as an assistant professor, Mike spent 1973-76 as an instructor in Speech Communication and Department of Continuing Education at the University of Denver (Colorado). From 1971-73 he was an instructor in Administrative Communication in the Department of Extension Services at San Francisco State University.

From 1966-71 he held various jobs as a musician, and as a flight controller and passenger service agent. He graduated from San Diego Mesa College in 1966 with his A.A. in English and Political Science. He earned his B.A. from San Francisco State in 1970 in Philosophy and Speech. He earned his M.A. from San Francisco State in 1971 in Speech and Psychology. He has a Ph.D.



from University of Denver in Speech Communication in 1976.

He is married to former Sandra Benner. Mike and Sandra have two children, Rebekah, 9, and Michael, 14.

## Director Promotion & Sales

PATTI DRAPELA

Patti moved into the Beaver Club office as an assistant in July, 1982, when the Men's and Women's athletic programs at OSU were merged. She was named Promotions Director for the entire department in 1984. Patti was hired at OSU in August of 1981 as Promotions Director for Women's athletics, the first such position at OSU. Prior to joining the OSU staff, Drapela worked for two years promoting events for the prestigious National Academy of Artistic Gymnastics in Eugene. She was publicity director for the Lane County Auditorium Association in Eugene, working on fund raising projects for the new performing arts center.

Drapela was a concert promoter for five years and a professional musician (drummer) for eight years. As promotions director for Women's athletics at OSU, Patti was in charge of special fund raising events and promoting Oregon State women's athletic events.



Drapela is a 1957 graduate of North Salem High School and a 1961 graduate from University of Oregon with a B.S. in Education. She has also been an elementary school teacher in Arizona, Washington and Oregon. She has four children, Val, 23; Nick, 20; Amy, 16; and Jennifer, 11. Born November 3, 1939 in Salem.

## Beavers starting from scratch

Aki Hill has averaged better than 20 wins a season in her seven years at the helm of the Oregon State women's basketball team, but she says the 1985-86 version of the Beavers makes her feel like a rookie coach.

Her task is not dissimilar to putting together a jigsaw puzzle with a couple of pieces missing.

"This feels like the first year of the program," Hill laughed. "What we have is unknown, completely. This is a whole new team and we are going to have to create new strategy. But that makes it very, very exciting."

Hill knew she would have a problem of sorts after the graduation of Juli Coleman and Tanya Mothershed. Coleman, an All-American guard, averaged 23.9 points a game; Mothershed, a 6-3 center, added 10.9 points and 7.3 rebounds. Not only did they anchor the team, they were the only upperclassmen.

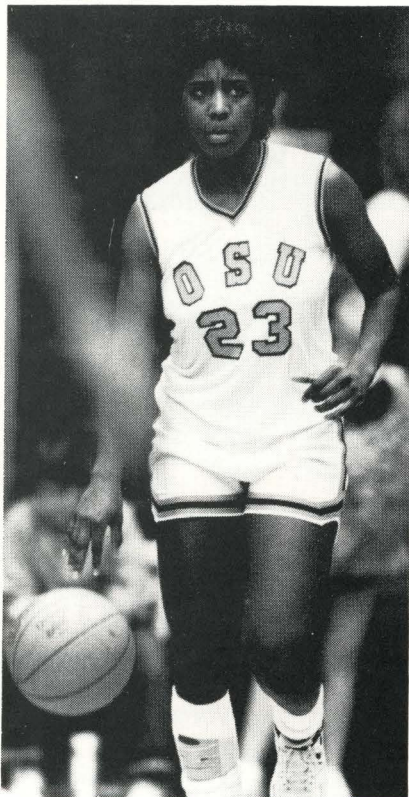
That problem was compounded when Brenda Arbuckle, the leading returning scorer and rebounder for the Beavers, went down in practice with a knee injury requiring surgery. The loss of her 14.1 points and 7.6 rebounds a game will leave Hill another major gap to fill. In addition OSU will have to look elsewhere for a leader on the floor.

That means that this year's elder statesmen are juniors Lisa Channel, Jennifer Young and Cindy Ahr. One, or more, will have to become a team leader.

The loss of Arbuckle further accentuates the problem underneath. With 6-5 freshman Lisa Ellis in hand, Hill concentrated her recruiting efforts on the backcourt last spring. But when Ellis announced her intention to transfer to Long Beach over the summer and Arbuckle was lost to injury, Hill was left with Ahr and a supporting cast of munchkins.

At 6-5, Ahr has the height to play low post. But at 149 pounds, the thin junior has neither the strength or the stamina to battle the rugged frontcourts of the NorPac Conference.

"Our game plan will have to change without a center," Hill emphasized, "and we are not going to be able to come in successfully in one year. We are going to have to push the ball forward, even though our quickness is mediocre. Defensively, we are going to have to extend our 2-1-2 zone past half court, to three quarters or even full



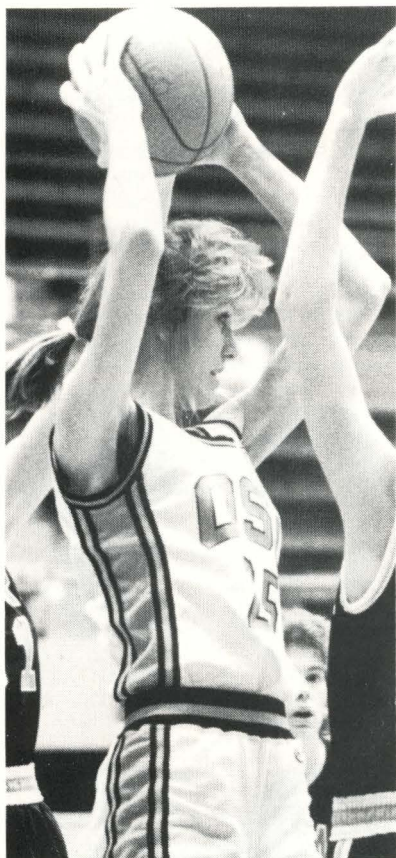

court. And everyone has to run.

"Offensively, my philosophy is the same," Hill added. "Whether you have big people or little people, you need to dump the ball inside. But we may have to make one more pass and we may have to become a little more sophisticated."

The Beavers aren't without weapons. Should Ahr be unable to answer the starting gun, 6-1 sophomore Debbie Dalluge will get the nod underneath, at low or high post. She was, perhaps, the most consistent of the Beavers last year, averaging 6.9 points and 6.0 rebounds a game.

Hill has high hopes for Channel, coming off a redshirt year. But her injured knee has been slow in healing and the oft-injured Channel "cannot be counted on for 40 minutes a game," Hill acknowledged. "I sympathize with Lisa on her injuries; now I

hope she has the mental toughness to overcome them."

If Channel can play, she will likely assume the No. 3 spot in Hill's offense, which loosely translates to small forward. But Channel can play the point or off guard as well and the 5-11 junior has the potential to be among the best players in the conference.

Should Dalluge and Channel remain healthy, Hill has two spots in her starting lineup set. Just where they might end up playing depends on several factors.

Freshmen Chelle Flamoe and Cynthia Jackson should make a run at a starting point guard position, if Channel plays elsewhere. Channel could replace Coleman as the team's off guard, or play the No. 3 role. If she does move out to a wing position, competition at off guard could come from sophomore Monica Raspberry, 5.6 points a game last year, or Jennifer Young, a walk-on who started most of the time a

year ago. Fonda DeCree, a 6-1 sophomore, should see playing time at forward.

Sound confusing? Hill thinks so, too.

"It is going to take some time because we don't know what will happen," Hill said. "This is the first time we haven't had a center. If this turns out to be the hardest working group in history, if they overcome their ups and downs, if they show character to come together, I will be very, very happy at the end of the season.

"As far as wins and losses, they are not my biggest concern right now," Hill added. "If they want to fire me, fine. But we have a lot of work to do before we can set many goals for ourselves."

With an overall record of 144-53, it is unlikely that Hill will be fired in the near future. But her coaching prowess could be put to its most severe test, as the Beavers draw ever closer to what may be a new beginning for them.

**High School:** Cindy Ahr helped her Kennedy High team to the Los Angeles City championship, averaging 19 points and 15 rebounds a game as a senior. She was voted All-City in Los Angeles and was all-conference for three years. Under coach Craig Raub, Ahr was voted Most Improved Kennedy player three years in a row.

She finished with 36 rebounds on the season and had highs of eight points and six rebounds.

**High School:** The first blue chip athlete recruited by coach Aki Hill, Lisa Channel came to OSU from Jackson High School, where she earned Parade third team All-America honors. She was generally regarded as the best prep guard in the Northwest her senior year and was named to the all-state team and several all-tournament squads.

**At OSU:** Lisa missed almost all of the 1984-85 season because of a leg injury. She played only for six minutes of the opening game of the season. She is expected to regain her sophomore form, however, after a red shirt year, and step right into the Beaver starting lineup. Channel had an up and down season as a freshman, playing in every game and averaging 6.4 points and 2.5 rebounds. Her quick hands and anticipation helped her pick off 2.3 steals a game, but invariably got her into foul trouble.

As a sophomore, however, Channel showed a lot more maturity. She improved her average to 9.5 points and 4.5 rebounds a game while still maintaining her 2.3 steals pace. Channel's biggest turnaround came in ball handling and passing. As a freshman she had 84 turnovers to 41 assists, but that ratio improved to 120 assists to 115 turnovers as a sophomore. That average of 4.1 assists should come in handy as a junior because Channel will be required to play point guard.

Channel is a better shooter than her .418 field goal percentage of 1984 might indicate. She has battled injuries since coming to OSU and had surgery twice to hopefully correct a circulation problem in her lower leg. Channel had no problems at the free throw line and her .744 mark was second best on the team in 1985.

Channel was also named the Most Valuable Player of the Big O Classic. She was an honorable mention, All-NorPac selection as a sophomore.

**Personal:** Channel is majoring in pre-law at OSU...she is the daughter of Theodis and Florzella Channel of Portland...she is interested in music and poetry...she was born January 30, 1964, in Portland, Oregon.

## BASKETBALL HISTORY AT OSU

Women's basketball at Oregon State actually got its start before organized men's competition began. The first women's game was played in 1898; the first men's contest in 1901.

That game bore little resemblance to modern day basketball, however. The court was divided into three zones, each containing two players from the two teams. The divisions included areas for guards, centers and forwards. A center jump was held after every basket and no one was allowed to leave their zone.

Scores were low in that era—in 1914, for example, Oregon State beat Oregon by a 10-8 score.

By the 1930's, there was a change in philosophy in women's sports. Competition, per se, was discouraged. On the other hand, mass participation via class instruction and intramurals was encouraged. That philosophy pre-

vailed until the early 1970's although women's basketball was organized as an extramural and club sport in the late 1950's.

No school in the Northwest was quite as successful as Oregon State University. Competing against clubs from other schools, Oregon State teams went undefeated from 1959 to 1966.

Basketball became an intercollegiate sport for women in 1972, when the newly organized women's athletic department started competition as a charter member of the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW). Teams competed in the Northwest College Women's Sports Association (NCWSA), Region 9 of the nine-division AIAW.

Accurate records, however, were not kept in women's basketball until the 1976-77 season, when Mary Covington coached the Beavers.
