STATEMENT:

I started my KIRI-E, paper cutting, when I was in a middle school. I was attracted to a newspaper Kiri-e illustration and tried it myself copying the newspaper clipping. Since then, I was a captive of this art media and have developed my own unique technique after repeated trials and errors and self teaching. I tried various papers but I finally settled in using rice papers. Rice papers' quiet elegance (Shibumi) and texture create unsurpassed beauty and receive high praises from the art lovers.

This art is everything for me and I do not feel comfortable unless I hold my cutter and work at least once a day and spend all my available time at my work desk. As far as the Kiri-e is concerned, I am a teacher as well as a student. I am learning new things by teaching myself, and when I am cutting my work amongst the scattered bits of papers, I feel most content and happy. The way is forever.
