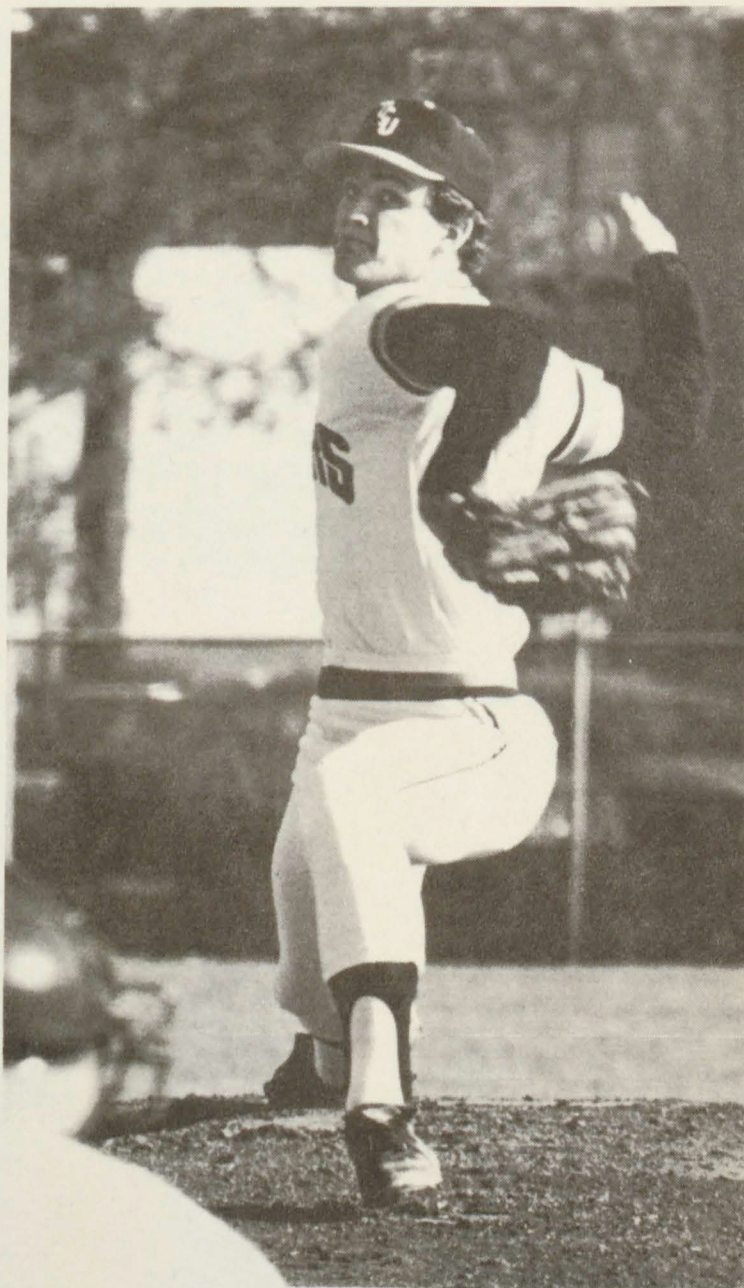

THE 1982 OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY BASEBALL PRESS GUIDE IS DEDICATED TO THE MEMORY OF FRESHMAN OUTFIELDER SCOTT HALBROOK. HALBROOK DIED FROM INJURIES SUFFERED IN A HEAD-ON COLLISION DURING PRACTICE. THE TRAGEDY OCCURRED JUST THREE DAYS PRIOR TO HIS FIRST GAME FOR OSU. THOUGH HE NEVER HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO WEAR IT, HIS NUMBER 13 JERSEY HAS BEEN RETIRED. THIS PRESS GUIDE WAS COMPILED BEFORE THE ACCIDENT AND INCLUDES SCOTT AS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE BEAVER HOPES THIS YEAR...BUT MORE THAN THAT, HE WAS AN OUTSTANDING YOUNG MAN.

Oregon State University, now in its 113th year, ranks as one of the leading educational and research centers in the United States.

OSU is also the oldest state-supported institution of higher learning in the state of Oregon with a charter day of October 27, 1868.

Oregon State is one of just a handful of universities in the United States which is both a Land Grant and Sea Grant institution. OSU, and the other handful of unique schools, have the responsibility of wisely developing our resources on both land and sea.

The students of Oregon State come from nearly every community in the state of Oregon as well as every state in the nation, and from approximately 75 other countries.

The first class at Oregon State, in 1870, consisted of a grand total of three persons, two men and one woman. Since that time, the school has grown to where it now confers some 3,300 degrees each June and the enrollment has topped 17,000. Still, the emphasis remains on the individual.

Oregon State's growth throughout the years has been organized and carefully charted. A campus of more than 400 acres has helped make that possible, but the core of campus consists of classroom buildings, the library and the Memorial Union, or student center. The outer circle of the campus consists mainly of residence halls and research buildings.

Many new buildings dot the OSU campus this year. The recently completed veterinary medicine building is one of the finest of its kind in the country and work has just recently been completed on a Cultural and Conference Center.

Another major construction project has been the addition of easy access ramps, doors and elevators for the handicapped. Much of the campus is now

completely accessible and construction is continuing.

Approximately one out of every six students at Oregon State is in graduate school working on master's or doctorate degrees. Bachelor degrees are offered in about 150 fields; master's in 100 more and Oregon State's doctorate programs include approximately 50 fields.

Oregon State provides the research base for Oregon's two largest industries-- forestry and agriculture. The school's accomplishments in energy, food and environmental science have drawn national attention.

Located in the heart of the Willamette Valley, Oregon State is still growing and modernizing-- both in curriculum and size. But the individual student has not been lost in the shuffle.

ALL HOMES GAMES PLAYED AT OREGON STATE'S
COLEMAN FIELD

All of the Beaver's home games are played at Coleman Field, located on Washington Way next to the Dixon Recreation Center on the OSU campus. Coleman Field has a seating capacity of 3,000 permanent bleachers. The playing field has long been recognized as one of the best in collegiate baseball. It is surrounded by a six foot fence. The distances are 355 to left field, 400 to center and 330 down the right field line. It is 385 to left center and 365 to right center. Coleman Field is not lighted. Two years ago, the facility was renovated through donations by baseball alumni and with the help of the Beaver Club. Orange plastic bleacher covers were added, bleacher sections were rearranged, new fencing and a centerfield hitter's backdrop were added along with the bleacher area being paved. This past year, the field was rededicated in honor of Ralph Coleman, Beaver alum and former baseball coach at Oregon State University.

BEAVER HEAD COACH-- JACK RILEY

PERSONAL: Riley is a 1960 graduate of Linfield College and holds a Master's degree from Oregon State University received in 1971. Jack and his wife, Jean, have two sons, Mike, 22, and his current secondbaseman Mickey, 20. They also have one daughter, Pam, 18.

PLAYING CAREER: Riley attended Grant High School in Portland and gained all-state honors in basketball. He was the second leading scorer in the state his senior year. As a cager at Linfield College in McMinnville, Oregon, he became the first player in the school's history to be named to the Northwest Conference All-Star team four straight years. He was also selected to four All-Americans teams, while at Linfield. The all-time scoring record at Linfield of 2,166 points is still in Jack's possession. His collegiate days also included three all-conference awards in baseball and as a senior he led the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics) in stolen bases. Following his graduation from Linfield, he was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers and played for their Salem farm club from 1961 through 1963.

COACHING CAREER: Jack Riley has been the Beavers' head coach the past nine years and has produced consistent winning ballclubs on the Corvallis campus. He has posted a 228-154 record in those nine years, a 60% winning pct.

Riley has a wide coaching background which began at Portland's Jefferson High School. He was assistant baseball and assistant basketball coach from 1960-1962. He was then named head basketball coach and took his teams to third and fourth place finishes at the state AAA tournament.

From Jefferson, it was on to Lower Columbia College as head baseball and basketball coach in Longview, Washington. He also served as Athletic Director. During his tenure at Lower Columbia, his baseball teams won four straight Coastal Division championships while sweeping the state title in 1970. He also had finishes of second, third and fourth in the state. Overall, his baseball record was 97-31 at Lower Columbia.

Upon arriving at Oregon State, Riley inherited a young and splintered program and in just two years turned it around to one of the most successful and dedicated in the country. Past seasons of 28-10, 31-15, 31-17, 33-16 and last year's 29-14 are proof of it. The program entails practice around the calendar either outside on Coleman Field, Parker Stadium or inside in McAlexander Fieldhouse.

In his years at OSU, the Beavers have won one Pacific-8 conference Northern Division co-championship 7 years ago and four runner-up spots. Oregon State has been even tougher at home with a record under Riley of 105-38 at Coleman Field, a winning percentage of 73%. In the last two years, the Beavers have won 29 of 35 home games.

OREGON STATE ASSISTANT COACHES

#24 DEL KERBER

PERSONAL: Originally from Salem, he is a graduate of Oregon State. In 1964, he received his B.S. degree in Physical Education. He followed that with a Masters degree at OSU in 1967. Single.

PLAYING CAREER: Kerber was a four-sport letterman in three years of competition at Serra High School in Salem from 1955 through 1959.

COACHING CAREER: Before joining the OSU staff, Kerber was one of Oregon's most successful high school coaches. He coached at Dallas (OR.) High School from 1965 through 1970. His teams claimed one league championship along with two second place finishes and three third place finishes. From Dallas, Kerber came to OSU and coached the junior varsity program from 1970 to 1971. He also coached at Grants Pass High School. Five summers ago, he took the Oregon State-stocked City Beaver Portland summer league team to the city championship and produced an excellent 25-13 overall record. They finished fifth in the state playoffs. Four years ago, they won the crown again and posted a 22-8 mark. Kerber's main responsibility with the Beavers is the pitching staff. He also serves as security coordinator for specific events related to Oregon State athletics.

#4 SCOTT TUBBS

PERSONAL: Born 7/8/56, he attended Stevens High School in Rapids City, South Dakota. He graduated from Stevens in 1974 and enrolled at Oregon State later that year. In 1979, he received his B.S. in religious studies from OSU and followed up with his Masters degree in interdisciplinary studies in 1980. He and his wife Jackie live in Corvallis.

PLAYING CAREER: A two-year letterman as a flanker on the football team at Stevens High, he also played four years on the state champion American Legion team. That team has a lock on South Dakota having won that state title the last 12 years.

COACHING CAREER: After graduation from OSU, Tubbs returned to the Midwest. He coached and taught in Cedar Rapids, Iowa at Kennedy High School. He served as an assistant football coach there. He came back to Oregon State in 1978 and handled the final junior varsity squad at OSU leading the baseball squad to a 13-4 record. This will be his first year working directly with Riley and Kerber and the varsity.

1982 OREGON STATE BASEBALL OUTLOOK

"Ifs" are abundant in Beaver head coach Jack Riley's evaluation of Oregon State's prospects in 1982.

The ritual of crossing the fingers must be performed when discussing the Beaver outlook for pitching consistency, overall hitting, a potentially sound defense and, the highest of Riley's priorities, leadership.

"I'm convinced we've just short of the top because of it," lamented Riley, referring to OSU's lack of leadership in the past. "That part of the game is so vital, because it is the basis for your team's confidence, stability and overall attitude."

If those qualities were lacking last year, the talent wasn't. Riley has enjoyed two fine campaigns back-to-back. The Beavers were 33-16 in 1980 and 29-14 last year. Both records are indicative of how close Oregon State came to qualifying for post-season play of late.

But much of those teams are gone and with them went a lot of offensive noise. OSU toyed with the school's season home run record that was only one year old. They fell three short of the 40 clubbed in 1980, but only 12 of those round trippers return on the 1982 roster.

The Beavers may rely on some stingy moundwork to keep the bats in the ballgame. They have that kind of staff and Riley lauds what depth he has defensively back of the hill.

Workhorse Mike Gorman returns for his senior season. He entered 18 of the Beavs' 43 starts and exited with an 8-3 record and a save to his credit. Gorman fanned 52 last year in posting a 4.88 E.R.A. That strikeout total was second on the team to the smoke provided by sophomore Jeff Reece. He started his Beaver career with 58 KOs in 57.2 innings. Reece's 5-2 won-loss mark included a pair of complete games and a whitewash of Pacific University. Riley is encouraged by Reece's improvement in the off-season especially on his accuracy. Another soph, Jeff Myers, will break into the starting rotation. This will be the righthander's first year with the Beavers. Last year, he drew All-America honorable mention plaudits in contributing to Linn-Benton Community College's appearance at the national tournament.

Rounding out the rotation will either be Scott Anderson or Mark Allen. Anderson has been plagued by some arm trouble in the past, but hurled his legion team into the World Series last summer and was the recipient of the Bob Feller (MVP) Award at the national event. Allen, a freshman, was a solid pitcher in high school, but Riley feels he is far from peaking.

Another with unlimited potential will be a graduate of the basketball team, Rob Holbrook. The 6-8 Portland native will be on the mound the next two years. He brings with him a ton of raw physical ability and a 90mph fastball. The Beaver baseball coach is counting on the member of Ralph Miller's Orange Express carrying over some of that winning tradition and leadership.

Completing the staff are Todd Wheeler and Shane Gallagher, both counted on for spot relief work. Wheeler may draw some pinchhitting duties as well after making good contact in fall practice.

There are several sound gloves backing the pitchers. Thirdbaseman Dain Syverson may well be the surest defensive product Riley has ever had at third base. Mickey Riley is a solid second baseman and Steve Smith moves from the keystone spot to shortstop providing Coach Riley with strength up the middle.

"All my infielders can play two positions which has got to help," assessed Riley.

The outfield is not deep, but quick and glue fingered in the first unit-- from left to right, Jim Grove, Todd Thomas and freshman Scott Halbrook.

Behind the plate are two dependable backstops in Bob Bishop and Lindsey Johnson. Johnson has gained a lot of confidence and improved a live arm. He could press Bishop if he comes along at the plate.

Perhaps the biggest question mark is in the batter's box. The Beavers are unloading a heavy burden on the 2-3-4 spots in the lineup. They must supply what power OSU can muster in 1982. Jim Wilson is shouldering most of that

responsibility. He hit almost half (5) of the 12 home runs returning. Wilson will alternate with Pat Shaw, also counted on for some long distance clouts, at first base. The other is to serve as the designated hitter.

The third man in that trio would be Riley's top recruit, Scott Halbrook, out of Eugene. Halbrook had an all-state senior season at Marist High School and it is hoped he will be a four-year force offensively for OSU.

After those three, the Beavers will dig and scratch for their runs. They have the wheels to accomplish it. Riley likes the prospects of Smith and Thomas as leadoff hitters getting on base in front of the power trio and creating havoc on the paths. Both can steal a base easily.

Further down the lineup are some equally quick and clever baserunners. Riley led the team in doubles with a dozen last year, Syverson's bat is expected to pick up with playing time and Bishop's should also improve.

Rounding out the projected opening day lineup is the man with the "red S" on his chest- Jim "Superman" Grove. Grove will be found most of the time combing the outfield, but he can also come into the mound to save a ballgame and nickel and dime an opponent to death at the plate. Riley may count on him for all this and some leadership to boot.

The Oregon State schedule takes on a new look this year creating more competition in the Pac-10's Northern Division than ever before. The loss of baseball at Oregon has opened up the league to several other NW schools. Gonzaga, Eastern Washington, Portland and Portland State have joined Washington, Washington State and the Beavers in the new seven-school division. The winner of the 24-game league slate will face the runner-up of the Pac-10's Southern Division for a chance to defeat the Southern Division champion for the Pac-10 crown.
