JIM ZALESKY

Head Coach • Seventh Season

One of the winningest programs in college wrestling history got one of the sport's winningest coaches when Oregon State hired Jim Zalesky on April 14, 2006.

Zalesky, who coached Iowa to three NCAA team championships, is the 17th head coach in Oregon State wrestling history. The 2012-13 campaign is his seventh at the helm of Oregon State wrestling.

In six seasons at OSU, the 2011-12 Pac-12 Conference Coach of the Year has had teams finish first or second in the Pac-10 five times after the Beavers won their third conference title under him in 2012. He's mentored six All-Americans and 11 conference champions. His 76 victories are third-most in school history.

Zalesky led the Beavers to a 10th-place finish at the 2012 NCAA Championships, the team's best mark in more than a decade. OSU wrestlers Clayton Jack, Mike Mangrum and Scott Sakaguchi all earned All-America honors and the trio, in addition to RJ Pena, claimed Pac-12 individual titles. Oregon State claimed its third league title under Zalesky, led by the four.

In the last two seasons alone, the Beavers have sent 16 wrestlers to the NCAA Championships, the best two-year span in program history.

Oregon State had one of its most successful seasons under Zalesky in 2010-11. The Beavers finished 21st at the NCAA Championships, sending eight wrestlers, the most in more than a decade. OSU finished second at the Pac-10 Championships with both Colby Covington (174) and Clayton Jack (heavyweight) winning their respective weight classes.

In 2009-10, the Beavers earned their second Pac-10 title under Zalesky in just four seasons. Covington earned the lone Pac-10 title at 174 pounds with five others joining him at the NCAA Championships. During the regular season, Zalesky led Oregon State to a career-best tying 18 dual meet wins, finishing with an 18-3 record and going on a 17-meet winning streak, the longest since 1984. A number of wrestlers broke into various single season and career lists for wins, pins and winning percentage, and Zalesky earned his first Pac-10 Coach of the Year accolade, while redshirt freshman Mike Mangrum was named Pac-10 Freshman of the Year.

In the 2008-09 season, the Beavers produced one All-American in 149-pounder Heinrich Barnes. Oregon State sent four to the NCAA Championships with two automatic bids and two at-large after a second place finish at the Pac-10 Championships.

The 2007-08 season proved to be a rebuilding year for the Beavers. But under Zalesky's leadership, the team still earned a third place finish at the Pac-10 Championships, sending three individuals to the NCAA Championships.

In just his first season at Oregon State during the 2006-07 season, Zalesky coached the Beavers to a first place finish in the Pac-10, the first time since 1994 and to a ranking as high as No. 16 in the nation. He led Ty Watterson to a fourth place All-American finish at the NCAA Championships and led the team to 900 all-time dual meet wins, the third in the nation to do so.

Zalesky compiled a 127-34 dual meet record at Iowa, serving as head coach from the 1997-98 season through the 2005-06 season. His teams won NCAA titles in 1998, 1999 and 2000, and the Hawkeyes finished second in 2001 and 2004. Zalesky's teams captured three Big Ten team titles and his wrestlers won 10 NCAA individual titles and 45 All-America honors.

While at Iowa, Zalesky was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2000 and 2004 and the National Wrestling Coaches Association Coach of the Year in 1998 and 1999.

Zalesky wrestled for Iowa in the early 1980s and was a four-time All-American and three-time NCAA champion at 158 pounds, ending his Hawkeye career with an 89-match winning streak. He was named Outstanding Wrestler at the 1984 NCAA Championships and Amateur Wrestling News named him the Wrestler of the Decade for the 1980s; he narrowly missed earning a place on the 1988 United States Olympic Team as he placed second in the U.S. Nationals at 163 pounds.

Zalesky was inducted into the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2004, the University of Iowa Letterman's Club Hall of Fame and the Iowa High School Athletic Association Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2002, and the Iowa Wrestling Hall of Fame in 1994.

Zalesky's coaching career also includes three years as an assistant coach at Minnesota and seven seasons as an assistant under legendary Iowa coach Dan Gable, with Zalesky serving as head recruiter. As an assistant at Iowa, Zalesky was named the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 1992 and 1997.

Zalesky is a 1984 graduate of Iowa. He and his wife, Teri, have four children - Nicolette, Jaclyn, Zackery and Lucas.

Associate Head Coach

Seventh Season

Iowa, '93

Troy Steiner continued his association with Oregon State head coach Jim Zalesky when he was hired on April 28, 2006. He is in his seventh season back at Oregon State.

Steiner had been on Zalesky's coaching staff for the last two seasons at Iowa, and he previously worked at Oregon State as an assistant coach to former head coach Joe Wells during the 1995-96 season.

In six years at Oregon State, Roberts has helped guide a program that has won three league titles in addition to finishing second twice.

The Beavers claimed the Pac-12 title in 2011-12 while sending eight wrestlers to the NCAA Championships, three of whom became All-Americans.

In 2010-11, the Beavers advanced six wrestlers to the Pac-10 finals and sent eight to the NCAA Championships, the most in more than a decade.

During his tenure, he has helped mentor six All-Americans, 11 league champions and 15 wrestlers who finished second at the Pac-10/Pac-12 Championships.

Prior to working with Zalesky at Iowa, Steiner owned and operated the ADVANCE School of Wrestling in Madison, Wis., for four years. He also served as an assistant coach at Wisconsin from 1997-2001 and Minnesota in 1996-97. During his career, Steiner has coached 22 All-Americans, 10 Big Ten champions, six NCAA champions and one junior FILA World Freestyle champion.

Steiner was a four-time all-American at Iowa from 1990-93 and a NCAA

champion in 1992. He won three Big Ten titles at Iowa, compiling a 148-13 career record at 134 and 142 pounds. He and his twin brother, Terry, were part of three national and four Big Ten championship teams.

Steiner shares Iowa's school record for best season winning percentage for the 42-0 record he compiled during his junior season. He also ranks third in career wins (148) and sixth in season wins (42) in the Hawkeyes' illustrious wrestling history.

In post-collegiate competition, Steiner was a nine-time U.S. National team member, winning the 1992 World Cup and the 1996 Pan-American Games titles. He placed third at the U.S. Olympic Trials in 1992 and 1996, and fifth in 2000. A native of Bismarck, N.D., Steiner was inducted into the North Dakota Hall of Fame in 1998.

Steiner received his bachelor's degree in Social Work from Iowa in 1993 and his master's degree in Kinesiology with a sports management emphasis from Minnesota in 1998. He and his wife Shawn have two children, Spencer and Abigail.

Kevin Roberts is in his seventh season as an assistant coach at Oregon State. The former Oregon wrestler had also been an assistant at North Idaho College and Wyoming and had been a strength and conditioning coach at Minnesota since 2004.

In six years at Oregon State, Roberts has helped guide a program that has won three league titles in addition to finishing second twice.

The Beavers claimed the Pac-12 title in 2011-12 while sending eight wrestlers to the NCAA Championships, three of whom became All-Americans.

In 2010-11, the Beavers advanced six wrestlers to the Pac-10 finals and sent eight to the NCAA Championships, the most in more than a decade.

During his tenure, he has helped mentor six All-Americans, 11 league champions and 15 wrestlers who finished second at the Pac-10/Pac-12 Championships.

Roberts has coached multiple Fila Jr. and University National freestyle champions and All-Americans. Most recently, Chad Hanke, who who sat out the 2011-12 season to train for the Olympic Trials, became a University Nationals Champion.

Additionally, Roberts helped coach and train former Director of Operations Nick Simmons, who is a 2011 World Freestyle team member World Championships fifth-place finisher in Turkey.

At Minnesota, Roberts was a member of the staff where the program won the Big Ten Conference, the National Duals and finished fifth and second, respectively, at the NCAA Championships

At North Idaho from 1998-2000 and also from 2001-04, Roberts helped lead NIC to the 2003 NJCAA National Championships. He was on the staff at Wyoming for the 2000-01 season.

As a wrestler at Oregon from 1994-96, Roberts was a two-time All-American at 118 pounds, placing fourth in 1994 and eighth in 1995, and he was a three-time Pacific-10 finalist.

As a senior, Roberts was team captain; he earned the school's Pacific-10 Medal for a male athlete for outstanding achievements in scholarship, athletics and citizenship; and he earned the Emerald Trophy as the school's outstanding senior athlete. Roberts was named the Ducks' Most Valuable Wrestler three times.

Roberts is originally from Spokane, Wash., where he was a state champion for University High. He received a M.S. in Kinesiology and Health from the University of Wyoming in 2007, and a B.S. in Sociology from the University of Oregon in 1996.

Roberts and his wife, Cami, have two sons, Drew (10) and Colton (2) and two daughters, Libby (5) and Kyla (4).
