



HEAD COACH JIM TURPIN

OSU RECORD: 84-25 YEAR AT OSU: Seventh

BIRTHDATE: February 13, 1949

BIRTHPLACE: San Mateo, California ALMA MATER: San Jose State, 1971

Jim Turpin begins his seventh season as head coach of the Oregon State gymnastics team. Turpin came to Corvallis with one goal in mind - winning a national championship. During his six seasons at OSU, Turpin's teams have made steady progress towards a championship title. Just last season, the Beavers claimed fourth place honors at the NCAA Championships, matching their best finish in school history.

Oregon State gymnastics fans have witnessed the building of a national power-house in Corvallis and in doing so, have had the opportunity to see some of the top competition in the country. Through Turpin's efforts, Oregon State has been selected to host several major gymnastics events, including the 1990 and 1993 NCAA Championships. In 1991, the Beavers hosted the NCAA Western Regionals for the seventh time in 19 years and the World University Game trials following the regular season.

Since Turpin took over the Oregon State program, the Beavers have made five appearances at the NCAA Championships. Oregon State finished fourth at the NCAA's last season and seventh the three previous years. Also last season, the Beavers claimed their first ever Pacific-10 Conference title and took first at the NCAA Regionals for the seventh time

Turpin was named Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 1991 for the second time in six years. His team also produced the third All-American since Turpin came to Corvallis freshman sensation Chari Knight. Knight earned three-time All-America status at Nationals while senior Joy Selig added two All-America accolades to her name to become a seventime recipient.

In just his third season at the helm, two of Turpin's gymnasts became All-Americans; Joy Selig and Jami Sherman. That same year, Turpin received Pac-10 Conference Coach of the Year honors. Selig, a sophomore, repeated the honor twice in 1989 including a share of the balance beam title as OSU matched its seventh place finish of the year prior. In 1990, Selig again took All-America honors, both at balance beam and floor exercise to lead the Beavers to a third straight seventh place showing.

Turpin's arrival in 1985 sparked the beginning of a new era in Oregon State gymnastics. He arrived in Corvallis from the Almaden Valley Gymnastics Club in San Jose, Calif., where he served as head coach and director.

His extensive experience on the national, international, club and collegiate levels gives Oregon State one of the most respected names in the sport. His long list of accomplishments includes coaching four USA teams to international competitions. He has also coached at the National Sports Festival and was formerly on the USA National Coaching Staff for Women. In July of 1991, Turpin traveled to Sheffield, England as head coach of the U.S. squad at the World University Games.

A former All-America gymnast at San Jose State, Turpin was the world champion on the double mini-trampoline in 1974. He graduated from SJSU with a B.S. degree in physical education and speech communication in 1971.

Among his many gymnastics achievements are several national and international meet directorships, including the Elite Nationals (1979 and 1982), the China/USA Exhibition in San Francisco (1981) and the Pacific Alliance International Competition (1984). He has served as Regional Elite Development Director for the United States Gymnastics Federation (U.S.G.F.) and also as a member of the Women's International Program Committee for the U.S.G.F. Just recently, Turpin was selected NCAA Western Regional Committee Chairman for the 1992, '93 and '94 meets. His coaching record at Almaden Valley included 43 individual and several team state champions in California and four Class I National Champions. Turpin coached Elite gymnasts to Championships of the USA every year from 1980 until his arrival at OSU in 1985. Twenty-one of his club performers advanced to earn scholarships and compete at the collegiate level.

Turpin and his wife, Jill, have two children, Lucas (14) and Kimberly (12).

ASSISTANT DICK FOXAL

YEAR AT OSU: Fifth

Dick Foxal joined the Oregon State coaching staff in 1988, two years following the hiring of head coach Jim Turpin. Foxal boasts over 20 years of gymnastics coaching experience on the club, high school, college and national levels.

Since his arrival in 1988, the Beavers have produced three All-Americans and have finished among the top seven at the NCAA Championships each year.

Up until 1980, Foxal worked primarily with men's gymnastics. In that time, he coached a pair of national champions and five All-Americans. He served as a coach for the men's junior national elite team for four years and an American squad that competed against the Japan National Team in 1980.

Foxal has spent several years as a head coach on the collegiate level, as well. From 1977 to 1980 he was head coach of the University of Washington men's gymnastics team and from 1984 to 1987 he headed the women's program at Montana State. The program was discontinued in 1987. Foxal was selected conference coach of the year at Montana State in 1985.

As a coach on the prep level, Foxal spent two years in Oregon as head coach at Churchill High School (1974-75). Foxal guided Churchill to a state championship with two All-Americans and received both state and national coach of the year honors.

A 1970 graduate of Central Washington, Foxal competed at the NAIA National championships in 1969 and 1970. He received his masters in physical education at CWU in 1972.

He and his wife, Suzanne, live in Corvallis.



ASSISTANT JILL HICKS

YEAR AT OSU: Eighth

Jill Hicks has been associated with the Oregon State gymnastics program the past eight years. She returned to OSU six years ago after competing and coaching with the Beavers from 1979 through 1981.

Then Jill Jory, Hicks served under former coach Ron Ludwig as an assistant and choreographer after enrolling at OSU for competition. She is a former elite gymnast with the Southern California Acro-Team in Los Angeles. Hicks competed for five years with SCATS under Scott Crouse. During that time, she finished at Class I Nationals and, at one time, was ranked 12th in the United States. Hicks competed in such meets as Championships of the USA and Elite National Championships.

Since earning an undergraduate degree in health education at OSU, Hicks has coached at Westside Christian School, Lake Oswego Gymnastics Club, Lake Oswego High School and Gymnastics Elite of Corvallis.

She is married to former OSU wrestler Dan Hicks and they have three children, Jenna, Jessica and Jordan.

Wendy Benage joined the Oregon State staff on July 1, 1991 and replaces Lori Carter as the full-time trainer for gymnastics. Wendy came to Corvallis from Linfield College in McMinnville, Oregon where she served as head trainer from 1989-91.

A native of Salem, Ore., Wendy graduated from Sprague High School in 1981. She attended University of Puget Sound (1981-82) and then moved to the University of Oregon where she earned her B.S. in Exercise Science in 1985. She also earned her Master's in Health Education with concentration in athletic training from Oregon, in 1987.

Wendy began her career as an athletic trainer at South Eugene High School in 1983-84. While at Oregon (1985-87), she was softball trainer and was employed at the Sports Trauma and Physical Therapy Clinic in '86. From 1987-89, Wendy was an assistant athletic trainer at American University, Washington, D.C. She has certifications from National Athletic Trainers' Association; Cardiopulminary Resuscitation and First Aid.

JUNIOR (1991): Donna competed primarily on bars and balance beam the '91 season...scored a season high 9.675 on bars at the NCAA Western Regionals, just shy of her career best 9.70...on beam, had a season high 9.40 at the Beavers' opening meet in Utah...at the NCAA Championships, Donna tallied a 9.350 on bars...listed as an all-arounder in '92, will continue to concentrate on her two strongest events, beam and bars...an excellent student, Donna was named Academic All-America (National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches) and Pac-10 All-Academic (Second Team) with a 3.52 GPA in science.

SOPHOMORE (1990): Donna's best performance of her sophomore season came at Minnesota where she placed third all-around with a 37.45, including 9.55s on bars and beam...competed in all-around competition in every event with the exception of Regionals and Nationals...tallied all-around scores of 37-plus five times including three of the last four meets...earned career highs as a sophomore in every event but vault and floor exercise...uneven bars proved to be her strongest event with a 9.70 scored at both Stanford and Washington.

FRESHMAN (1989): Concentrated on uneven bars throughout the year averaging 9.25 including a best of 9.70 at Pac-10 Championships in Corvallis...only two beam performances included a 9.30 at San Jose State...lone all-around score was in home victory over Utah State.

PRE-OREGON STATE: Linder was third all-around at the Utah state Class I championships...placed second on bars and 5th on floor at 1987 Class I regionals...an ankle injury prevented her from competing in the Class I national competition in 1988...her best event is the uneven bars where she scored a 9.65 at Class I regionals on her way to a 36.75 AA score...other bests were a 9.15 on vault, 9.4 on beam at the state meet and a 9.25 on floor at regionals.

PERSONAL: Born December 4, 1970 in Walnut Creek, Calif., Donna is the daughter of Ray and Anne Linder...has two brothers, James and Jason... was a member of the National Honor Society with 3.95 high school grade point average at Brighton HS...hobbies include waterskiing, camping, fishing and shopping.

JUNIOR (1991): As a junior, Jennifer competed on all four events at just one meet (NCAA Western Regionals) where she posted a score of 37.475...at eight meets, performed on bars, beam and floor, including the NCAA Championships in Alabama...boasted a season high 9.750 on floor at three competitions (Washington at Seattle and Corvallis, and Shanico Invitational)...as one of OSU's most consistent performers on floor, Jennifer scored a 9.55 or better in 12 of 14 meets.

SOPHOMORE (1990): A solid all-around competitor who finished the 1990 season with a score of 9.60 score on floor at the NCAA Championships...top performance of the season may have been her second place 38.25 all-around, a season best, at home against Seattle Pacific... took two seconds with a 9.50 vault and a career-high 9.80 floor exercise...career-best 9.80 won the beam competition.

FRESHMAN (1989): OSU's Freshman of the Year averaging 37.46 in all-around competition and a career best 38.35 at Pac-10s, the latter is OSU's fifth-best all-around ever (Joy Selig owns the first four scores)...solid throughout with bests between 9.55 and 9.65 in all four events...the majority of Jennifer's vault and floor scores exceeded 9.50.

PRE-OREGON STATE: Jennifer trained at the same club that produced OSU All-American Joy Selig....swept all five events at the Northern California championships and won the western regional title...also won the same local scholarship award (William Glover Memorial) received by Selig, the year prior...three years earlier, McMullin was the Junior Olympic national champion on floor exercise — 15 state, regional and national titles in all...pre-OSU bests included 9.55 on vault, 9.40 on bars, 9.35 on beam and a 9.60 floor exercise.

PERSONAL: Born Nov. 21, 1970 in San Francisco, Calif., Jennifer is the daughter of John and MaryAnn McMullin...has two sisters, Stephanie and Kelly....maintained a 3.10 grade point average at Bella Vista HS in Fair Oaks, California...hobbies include bike riding, aerobics and cooking.

SOPHOMORE (1991): Amy was elected "Most Improved" by OSU coaches and rightly so ... surpassed career best marks in every event, including all-around with a 39.100 at NCAA Western Regionals to place second.... also broke career bests on bars, beam and floor at Regionals...an all-around competitor in all 14 meets, Amy placed third all-around at the Pac-10 Championships to help OSU win their first ever league crown...at the University of Washington meet in Corvallis, Amy won all-around with a 38.550...named Pac-10 All-Conference, as well as Academic All-Conference (Second Team) with a 3.52 GPA in liberal arts...also chosen Academic All-America (National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches)...in both all-around and vault, Amy ranks among the top 10 all-time performers at OSU...ranks 10th all-around with her 39.100 and holds three of the spots on vault with scores of 9.80. 9.775 and 9.75...at the conclusion of the '91 season, placed sixth at the World University Games Trials in Corvallis to qualify for the Games in Sheffield, England...made the trip to England but suffered a hip injury and did not compete.

FRESHMAN (1990): Amy posted a season high 9.775 on vault at the NCAA Championships...also came up with a 9.625 showing on bars at the NCAA's, just shy of her 9.70 personal best...scored a career-high 38.10 all-around at the Shanico Invitational to tie for third place...shared second on bars with two others, and tied for fifth on floor, with a pair of 9.65s...at home against Seattle Pacific she tied Joy Selig for bars honors with a 9.70....took third all-around at Washington with a 37.75, including a 9.45 vault and a 9.70 on bars...posted a 9.75 vault at Regionals, which placed her in a three-way tie for fourth.

PRE-OREGON STATE: Earned a current best of 37.35 while competing for Rocky Mountain Gymnastics Club in Utah...scored her bests in each event in out-of-state meets (9.60 on vault and 9.35 on uneven bars in Arizona, 9.20 on balance beam in California and 9.20 on floor in Nevada).

SOPHOMORE (1991): Leslie competed almost exclusively on floor exercise, with the exception of two bar and two beam routines...scored a 9.50 or better on floor at eight of 13 meets. including a career high 9.70 at the NCAA Western Regionals...at the NCAA Championships, Leslie competed on floor and scored a 9.40...named Academic All-America by the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches...also selected Pac-10 Conference All-Academic (Second Team) with a 3.43 GPA in health and human performance.

FRESHMAN (1990): Entered the season as a top competitor on bars, beam and floor...scored career bests of 9.50 on beam and 9.55 on bars at the Shanico Invitational, only to up her career mark on floor to 9.70 and tie for third all-around with a career high 37.80 at OSU's final home meet against Seattle Pacific...chose Oregon State "because my old coach was selling his gym, so there wouldn't really be a coach to coach me at a high level. Oregon State is close to home and my mom approved."...worked on correspondence classes to earn HS diploma, but able to enroll early because she maintained a 3.50 High School GPA for three years (her actual prep GPA was 3.91).

PRE-OREGON STATE: Competed on national and international basis for Gymnastics West under Mike West's coaching the last eight years...her best all-around score at the club level was a 37.85 that included a 9.55 floor...individual event best was a 9.75 on uneven bars scored in a Seattle meet in which she also had a careerbest 9.65 vault...best beam routine scored in California at 9.50.



World University Games

Oregon State University was well represented at the 1991 World University Games in Sheffield, England this past July. OSU gymnastics coach Jim Turpin headed the United States six-member squad which included Beaver gymnasts Chari Knight, Amy Durham and Joy Selig. The United States team made history by winning a silver medal in team competition, just behind gold medal winner Peoples Republic of Korea. The U.S. squad finished ahead of the Soviet Union for the first time in any women's competition including the Olympics, World University Games, World Championships and junior 'B' team high school meets.

OSU's Chari Knight was one of two U.S. gymnasts to earn a medal in the individual event finals. Knight placed third on uneven bars to take the bronze medal while University of Utah's Kristen Kenoyer won third place honors on floor. Oregon State hosted the World University Games Trials last spring. The top six all-around finishers of the 14 collegiate and club participants qualified for the World University Games.

OSU All-Americans

HEIDI ANDERSON

Heidi Anderson earned All-America honors at both Penn State and Oregon State...claimed All-America honors at Penn State in all-around (1982) and floor exercise in 1981...after transferring to Oregon State, became a three-time All-American with a national title on beam...added a fourth All-America accolade on beam in 1985.

MARY AYOTTE-LAW

Mary Ayotte-Law earned All-America status on balance beam in 1981 and again on floor and all-around in 1982...became the second Beaver to win a National Championship with her floor exercise title in 1982 and was the third place finisher all-around...went on to compete at the 1981 World University Games in Romania.

TINA BARNES

Tina Barnes became Oregon State's fifth All-American in 1985 when she placed fourth on vault at the NCAA Championships...earned repeat All-America honor in 1988 with a seventhplace finish on vault at the NCAA's...was named NorPac Conference Newcomer of the Year as a freshman.

LAURIE CARTER

Laurie Carter distinguished herself as OSU's first national champion when she claimed the title on balance beam in 1981...went on to capture additional All-America honors on beam in 1983 and 1984...placed fifth at the NCAA Championships in '83 and eighth in '84.

CHARI KNIGHT

Chari Knight became a three-time All-American as a freshman in 1991...at the NCAA Championships in Alabama, placed fifth all-around, third on beam and tied for second on bars....her second place finish on bars is the highest ever by an OSU gymnast...competed at the 1991 World University Games in England where she earned a bronze medal on bars.

LINDA PARKER

Linda Parker, OSU's second All-American, was a two-time recipient in 1978 and 1980...claimed All-America status on floor exercise in '78 and balance beam in '80....came in fourth on floor and seventh on beam at the NCAA Championships...also a three-time All Western Regional selection.

JOY SELIG

Joy Selig has more All-America accolades to her name than any other OSU gymnast....became a seven-time All-American as a senior in 1991 with a seventh place all-around finish and third on floor at the NCAA Championships...repeated as the NCAA balance beam champion in 1990 and won her first national title on floor that same year....besides claiming the beam title in '89, placed fourth on floor at the NCAA's...earned her first All-America honor as a freshman as the runner-up at Nationals on floor exercise.

JAMI SHERMAN

Jami Sherman earned All-America honors as a freshman walk-on in 1988...after averaging 9.46 on vault through the 1988 season, she responded to the pressure of nationals with two solid vaults that earned her a fifth-place finish in the finals....became a scholarship athlete the following season and just completed her final season in 1991.

DONNA SOUTHWICK

Donna Southwick became Oregon State's first All-American in 1977.... gained All-America status on bars at the '77 AIAW National Championships...transferred to OSU from nearby Linn-Benton Community College where she was crowned junior college national allaround champion in 1975....the first Oregon State female athlete to obtain an athletic scholarship.



The Oregon State gymnastics team claimed the 1991 national academic championship title, according to the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches for

The Beavers ranked number-one academically with a combined grade point average of 3.611. The NACGC recognized 144 womenas All-America scholar athletes which reguires a GPA of 3.50 or better. A record nine of the 144 gymnasts were from Oregon State. The nine OSU gymnasts earning a 3.50 GPA or better were Kelly Baker, Traci Crover, Amy Durham, Leslie Hammond, Charl Knight, Donna Linder, Linda Pierce, Joy Selig and Wendy Smith.

Oregon State was one of only two schools to rank among the top 20 academically that participated in the 1991 NCAA Championships. Seventeenth-ranked Utah State also qualified for nationals in '91.

Gymnastics and strong academics have always gone hand-in-hand at Oregon State. The Beavers have produced 11 NACGC Academic All-Americans since 1984 and two CoSida/ GTE Academic All-Americans.

In 1991, Coach Jim Turpin's squad boasted a 3.73 GPA after two quarters, including gymnasts Charl Knight, Joy Sellg, Linda Pierce, Kelly Baker and Wendy Smith with perfect 4.00's. Knight maintained a 4.00 for the entire year.

Oregon State University

OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY

Oregon State University is Oregon's oldest state-assisted institution of higher education. Founded in 1868, OSU is internationally respected for teaching, research and public service and enjoys distinction as both a Land Grant and Sea Grant university.

Students come to OSU from every state in the nation an more than 100 countries to pursue undergraduate and graduate degrees

in 227 distinct academic programs.

With an enrollment of more than 15,000, OSU prepares students to be innovators and leaders in business and industry, high technology, arts and cultrual affairs, communications and science. Among University graduates is Dr. Linus Pauling, the only person to earn two unshared Nobel Prizes.

Teaching is OSU's top priority, with innovative programs in agricultrual sciences, business, education, engineering, forestry, health

and human performance, home economics, liberal arts, oceanography, pharmacy, science and veterinary medicine.


A distinguished faculty of more than 2,000 attracts nearly \$70 million each year in research grants and brings new knowledge to students through research in such fields as biotechnology, computer and marine science, advanced materials, family studies, at-risk youth and environmental health. The OSU Extension Service, OSU Agricultural Experiment Station and Forest Research Laboratory provide unique public service to citizens in all 36 Oregon counties.

OSU has agreements, contracts and exchange programs with more than 75 foreign countries.

Unique facilities add to OSU's reputation. On campus are specialized research centers in environmental health, marine freshwater biomedical science, gene research, humanities, productivity and technology.

OSU's Hatfield Marine Science Center is world renowned for its scientific work. The University also has a seafoods laboratory and a fisheries culture station, operates 10 branch agricultural research and development stations, and manages two research forests.

The 419-acre main campus of Oregon State University is located in Corvallis, recently named one of America's most livable small cities. With nearby parks, shopping and recreation, Corvallis is accessible by bus, Amtrak and limousine service from air transportation in Eugene (45 miles south) and Portland (90 miles north). Interstate 5 connects OSU to major west coast centers while state highways link OSU to Oregon's mountain and ocean recreation areas.

GILL COLISEUM . . . Home of OSU Gymnastics

Gill Coliseum has taken on a more versatile role as an athletic facility. Not only is it a basketball "showplace," but it is the home of OSU Gymnastics as well. The Beavers have hosted seven NCAA Western Regionals at Gill and in 1990 it was the site of the NCAA Gymnastics Championships. In 1991, OSU hosted the World University Game Trials and in 1989 Gill was the home to the Pacific-10 Conference Championships. In 1993, the Beavers will again host the NCAA Championships.

The first home gymnastics meet was held at Gill Coliseum in 1977 against Nevada-Reno before a crowd of 800. Since that time gymnastics enthusiasts in the Corvallis vicinity have grown with the nationally respected program to an average of 4,721 spectators in 1991. Last season, OSU gymnastics drew over 33,000 fans to Gill, including a season high crowd of 7,488 at the NCAA Western Regionals. In 1990, crowds of 8,245 and 8,501 fans were on hand for the two-day NCAA Championships.

Named after the late Slats Gill, who was OSU's head basketball coach for 36 years, the building is an excellent facility spanning one and one-third acres. The peak of the building is 83 feet above the floor, equivalent to a four-story building. Capacity has been expanded to 10.400 premium seats with unobstructed views, more than 9,000 of which are available for gymnastics competition.
