Oregon State University is Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher learning, dating back to October 27, 1868. It was established as one of the nation's land grant colleges, receiving federal land grants to help launch its public education-service program.

On September 7, 1971, OSU was designated as one of the nation's first four Sea Grant Colleges, charged to help advance man's wise and orderly use of ocean resources and to provide teaching and research programs related to marine sciences. The Oregon State University Marine Science Center at Newport has become OSU's important "Campus on the Coast." The 177-foot, all weather Wecoma and smaller research vessels operate from there in studying the ocean, estuaries and rivers.

From an initial graduating class of three in 1870, OSU has grown to the point that it now confers about 3,500 degrees each June. Student enrollment during the regular school year is about 16,500; summer term enrollment now tops 5,000.

The main campus covers nearly 500 acres on which there are 100 major buildings. Experimental farms, an arboretum and teaching-research forests, all located within just a few minutes drive of the campus, make up an additional 18,000 acres.

Oregon State provides the research base for Oregon's two largest industries, forestry and agriculture. In addition to university research facilities and forests, a federal Forest Science Laboratory is located on campus. The Agricultural Experiment Station operates a number of branch stations throughout Oregon for work on specialized, regional problems. Coastal research units, in addition to the Marine Science Center, are the Seafoods Laboratory at Astoria and a fisheries culture station at Netarts Bay.

Water, key to the future, is getting special attention, including work in water resource management, water quality and reuse, pollution control, oceanography, fisheries and irrigation. One of the three major National Environmental Research Centers operated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is located on campus, and considerable cooperative research is underway.

Important additions to the research and training facilities of the Northwest are the OSU Radiation Center, Computer Center, Environmental Health Sciences Center, Air Resources Center and the International Plant Center. Other research units include the Engineering Experiment Station, and the Genetics, Nutrition, Science, Water Resources and Nuclear Science and Engineering Research Institutions. The State Fish and Wildlife Commission's Research Division is headquartered at OSU.

Oregon State University is "extended" into every one of Oregon's 36 counties through the Extension Service. Extension agents in each county help interpret, adapt and disseminate research findings for practical use and assist in such programs as human and natural resources development. The 4-H Club program, which enrolls approximately 50,000 young Oregonians annually, is a part of the OSU Extension Service. The 4-H program is open to all Oregon youth, ages 9-19.

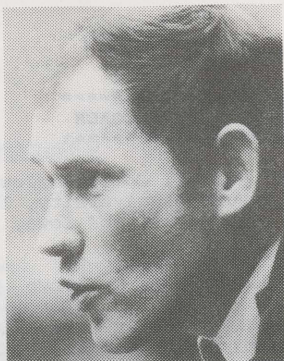
The Oregon State wrestling program, under the leadership of America's all-time winningest coach, Dr. Dale Thomas, has been one of the most consistent in the nation. Thomas has an overall dual meet record of 582-130-9 in 32 years of coaching and has been nominated NCAA Coach of the Year twice and his teams have won 22 conference titles, as well as finishing in the top ten at the Nationals 13 times. Thomas has also coached 60 All-Americans and ten NCAA Champions.

### Highlights of Thomas' Career have included:

- \*\*Instrumental in bringing USA-USSR World Cup Meet to Corvallis in 1986
- \*\*Accepted a four year term on the selections committee of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame, 1985
- \*\*Elected National Wrestling Hall of Fame, 1980
- \*\*Iowa Hall of Fame, 1982
- \*\*Became the first coach in collegiate history to amass 500 career victories, 1983
- \*\*College Coach of the Year, 1961 and 1970
- \*\*Captain of Cornell of Iowa's 1947 NCAA and national AAU Championship teams
- \*\*Named to Cornell of Iowa's Sports Hall of Fame in 1970
- \*\*Winner of nine national championships in collegiate, freestyle and Greco-Roman competition and membership on the 1952 and 1956 U.S. Olympic Teams
- \*\*Officiated in the 1960 and 1964 Olympic Games and several World Championships and is ranked in the highest officiating category
- \*\*Coached the U.S. Greco-Roman teams in international competition in 1961 and 1966

Born 2-23-50 in Greeley, Colorado, Crumley graduated from Lebanon (Oregon) Union High School in 1968. He was the state high school wrestling champion his senior year, and was on a cultural exchange team, which competed in Japan his junior season. He was the state freestyle wrestling champion in 1967.

After high school, Crumley enjoyed a successful collegiate career at Oregon State. He was a three time All-American under Thomas, twice placing fifth and earning second place once at the NCAA National Championships, all in the 177-pound weight class. He won three Pac-8 titles as a Beaver, and was a member of the East-West All Star team. He was third alternate to the 1972 Olympic Greco-Roman teams and a member of the U.S. team at the South African Games in 1973, where he won the Gold Medal.

Jim was featured in the March 12, 1973 issue of Sports Illustrated. Crumley was named OSU assistant coach July 26, 1983 by then Athletic Director Dee Andros. Prior to that, he served as an Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation in Kodiak, Alaska in 1977, and was a commercial fisherman in Kodiak from 1978 through 1982.

Crumley earned his B.S. degree from Oregon State in 1976. He and his wife, Marjorie, have two children, Jacob 11, and Stacy, 9.

#### 1987-88 WRESTLING OUTLOOK

When the 1987-88 season rolls around, the Oregon State wrestling team will be looking to improve on last year's third place finish at Pacific-10 Conference Championships.

The Beavers compiled a dual meet record of 12-11 last year and have the potential to better that mark this season. Some of OSU's goals this year will be to beat Arizona State, win as many dual meets as possible, perform well in the Pac-10 championships and to be ranked in the top-20 or even the top-10 nationally. In addition, the Beavers would like to qualify as many wrestlers as possible into the NCAA championships. Coach Dale Thomas feels the accomplishment of these goals will be determined largely by how well the team performs with the talent they have.

Thomas, the winningest wrestling coach in America, believes Arizona State will be the team to beat this year in what he calls the toughest wrestling conference in the West. Other strong teams include Fresno State,

Cal-State Bakersfield and Cal Poly. But all the rest of the teams in the conference, including OSU, should be respectable. The conference now has 11 teams with the recent additions of Cal-State Bakersfield and Boise State.

According to Thomas, the Beavers are prepared to have one of their best starts, due to spirited fall practices. "This year's team has the character to work up to its potential," he said, prior to opening the season. He believes the team will be well prepared, which Thomas says is the key to success.

Four veterans will lead the way for the Beavers this season. Top returners include Jeff Cardwell, David Boyle, Dave Orndorff, and Tim Glennie. Cardwell, at the 158-pound weight class, went 35-6-1 last season along with being named Pac-10 Tournament Outstanding Wrestler and placing seventh at the NCAA championships. Boyle went 30-11-2 last season and was the Pac-10 champion at 142. Orndorff, a heavyweight, compiled a 32-4 record last season and placed third at Pac-10 tournament. Glennie had a record of 18-16-4 last year and also placed third at the Pac-10 tournament. Boyle, Orndorff and Glennie also went to NCAA's. Boyle went 4-2 before being eliminated, while Orndorff went 1-1 and Glennie 0-1.

Along with experience comes a fine recruiting class. OSU assistant coach, Jim Crumley says, "This is one of the best recruiting classes we've had in a long time."

Thomas has three promising freshmen in Neil Russo, Mike Murphy and Mike Simons. Other strong newcomers include Randy Price and Tony Oliff.

Russo wrestled at Newberg High School where he was state AAA champion at the 136-pound weight class. Simons, from South Albany High School, was also a two-time state AAA champion. Murphy was a two-time AA state champion from Sweet Home High School. Price was Western Regional champion two years ago and a 1985 state AAA champion. Oliff was the 1987 State AA champion, while wrestling at Dallas High School.

Crumley also thinks there are sophomores and juniors who can help the Beavers; Chris McGowen, Bennie Bitz, Steve Thorpe, Carlton Hester, Joe Murphy, Steve Lander, Eric Miller and Fred King. Thomas believes any one of those kids, along with Glennie, can become national ranking wrestlers.

"They have the potential and attitude to perform at a national level," Thomas said.

HOW THE HUSTLE AWARD IS SCORED

The "Hustle" score is found by multiplying the individual's average dual meet score by the wrestler's accumulative grade point average.

The grade point average is based on this point distribution:

A - 4.0 B - 3.0 C - 2.0 D - 1.0 F - 0

To be eligible for the "Hustle Award" the wrestler must wrestle 60% of the dual meets.

The wrestler's dual meet score is figured as follows:

Win by fall, forfeit or default	5 points
Win by decision	3 points
Draw	2 points
Loss by decision	1 point
Loss by fall, forfeit or default	0 points
