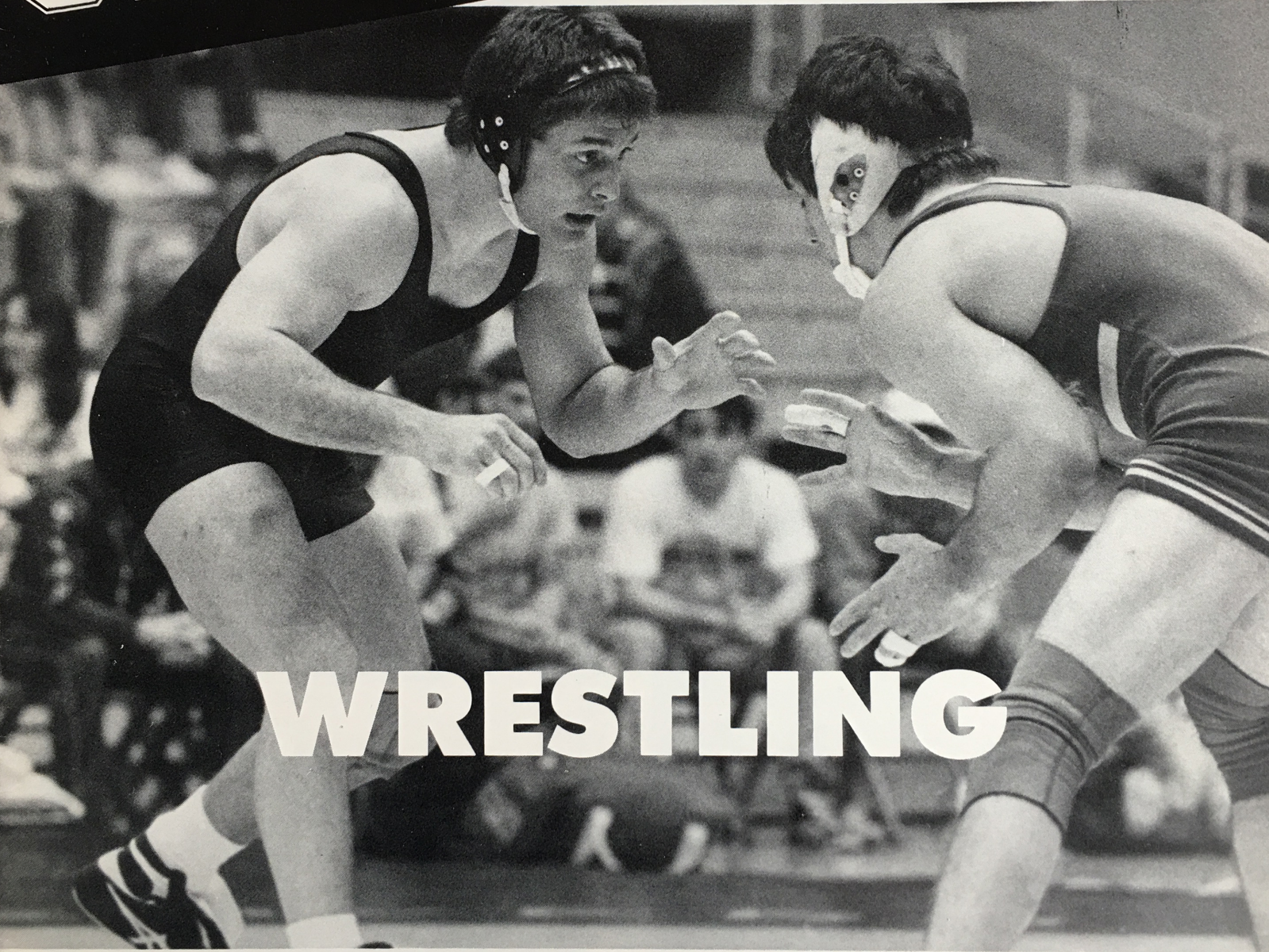

HOME OF THE BEAVERS GILL COLISEUM

Oregon State uses Gill Coliseum for all of its home wrestling meets. Gill Coliseum is located at 26th Street and Washington Way on the southwest end of campus.

Gill Coliseum first opened its doors in the winter of 1949. Recently completed construction in the building has added an extra 400 seats, making the capacity 10,400. Along with the many athletic events that take place in the building during the year, it also is host to a number of concerts and other activities, like student registration.

Named after the late Slat Gill, who was head basketball coach at OSU for 36 years and later the school's athletic director, the building is perfect for wrestling. It is not a fieldhouse. There are no posts.

Gill Coliseum was the site of the 1961 and 1980 NCAA Wrestling Championships and the 1987 Pacific-10 Conference Wrestling Championships. It also served as the site of the 1977 and 1979 East-West All-Star Classic.

Gill Coliseum covers one and one-third acre of ground. Peak of the building is 83 feet above the floor, equivalent to a four-story building. Framework of the structure consists of 12 fabricated steel arches. In all, there are 1,000 tons of structural steel in the building, and 85 percent of the seats are on the sides.

Some 14,000 cubic yards of concrete, which amounts to 70,000 sacks of cement went into the structure. In addition, more than 100,000 pumice blocks have been used inside for partitions and finishing work.

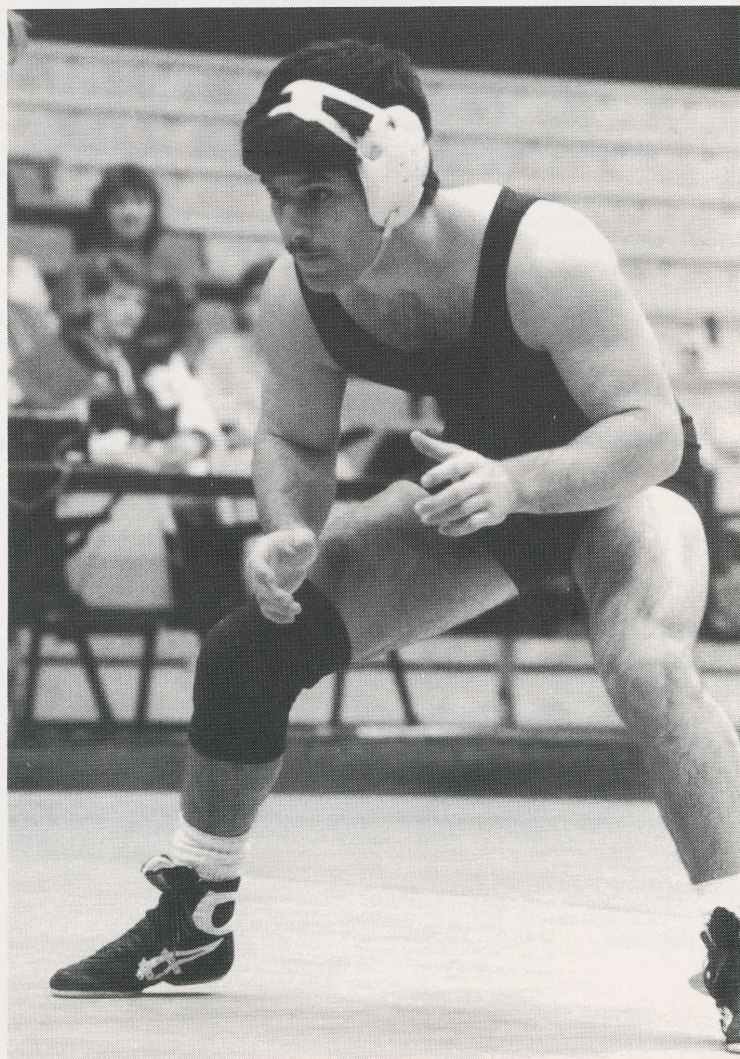

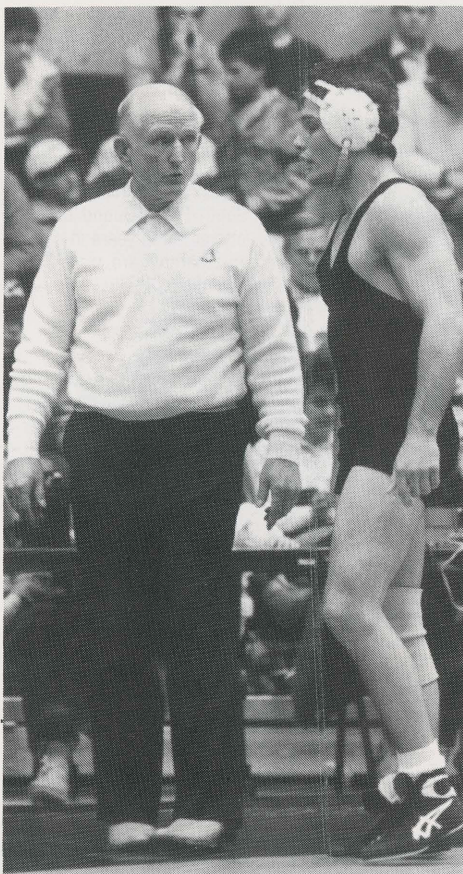

THE COACHING STAFF



HEAD COACH — DALE THOMAS

COLLEGE: Cornell College (Iowa), 1947 (B.A.)

Visiting Dale Thomas' office in Langton Hall on the Oregon State University campus is like going through a wrestling museum with his championship plaques, trophies and photos that span his competitive days through to his distinguished coaching career. The Beaver wrestling program, under the leadership of America's all-time winningest coach, has been one of the most consistent in the nation. Thomas has an overall dual meet record of 601-157-11 in 34 years of coaching and has been nominated NCAA Coach of the Year twice. His teams have won 22 conference titles, as well as finishing in the top 10 at the national championships 13 times. Thomas has also coached 60 All-Americans and 10 NCAA Champions.

Highlights of Thomas' Career have included:

- **Instrumental in bringing USA-USSR World Cup Meet to Corvallis in 1986.
- **Accepted a four year term on the selections committee of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame, 1985.
- **Elected National Wrestling Hall of Fame, 1980.
- **Iowa Hall of Fame, 1982.
- **Became the first coach in collegiate history to amass 500 career victories, 1983.
- **College Coach of the Year, 1961 and 1970.
- **Captain of Cornell of Iowa's 1947 NCAA and national AAU Championship teams.
- **Named to Cornell of Iowa's Sports Hall of Fame in 1970.
- **Winner of nine national championships in collegiate, freestyle and Greco-Roman competition and membership on the 1952 and 1956 U.S. Olympic Teams.
- **Officiated in the 1960 and 1964 Olympic Games and several World Championships and is ranked in the highest officiating category.
- **Coached the U.S. Greco-Roman teams in international competition in 1961 and 1966.
- **Taught and studied wrestling in Yugoslavia and Poland in 1963, in Mexico in 1965, in South Africa in 1968 and New Zealand in 1973.
- **Served on NCAA Clinic Staff in 1958 in Laramie, Wyoming; 1962 at Stillwater, Oklahoma; and 1965 at Laramie, Wyoming.
- **Taught wrestling and toured New Zealand and Southeast Asia while on sabbatical during the fall of 1973.
- **Organized and directs the Oregon high school Wrestling Cultural Exchange which started in 1962. The program has included exchanges with Japan, Europe, Mexico, New Zealand and South Africa.
- **Initiated Oregon high school freestyle tournament in 1962. Since then the state has added a Greco-Roman tournament and numerous Freestyle and Greco-Roman tournaments are held by the preps throughout the state.
- **Conducts and participates in numerous clinics in collegiate, freestyle and Greco-Roman, including high school and college camps and Olympic development programs.
- **Developed and directs one of the largest wrestling tournaments in the world in the annual Oregon high school championships with over 400 contestants using eight mats at a 52 matches per hour clip.
- **Started and developed the Kid's Wrestling Program in Oregon and now nationally.
- **Brought the NCAA Championships to the West Coast for the first time in 1961 with Oregon State serving as the host school.
- **Has coached ten NCAA champions, 13 runner-ups, four thirds, nine fourths, 13 fifths, eight sixths and two eighths while at Oregon State.
- **Received Masters Degree from Purdue University in 1948 and Doctorate from the University of Iowa in 1956 and is the only wrestler to ever represent the U.S. in an international event while holding a Ph.D.
- **Brought the East-West Classic to the West Coast for the first time and OSU also was host school for the East-West Classic in 1979.
- **Has won 14 of the last 23 Pac-10 Wrestling Championship titles.
- **Has had 60 All-Americans at OSU along with 113 conference champions and 60 NCAA placemen.

ASSISTANT COACH — SCOTT BLISS

COLLEGE: University of Oregon (1980)

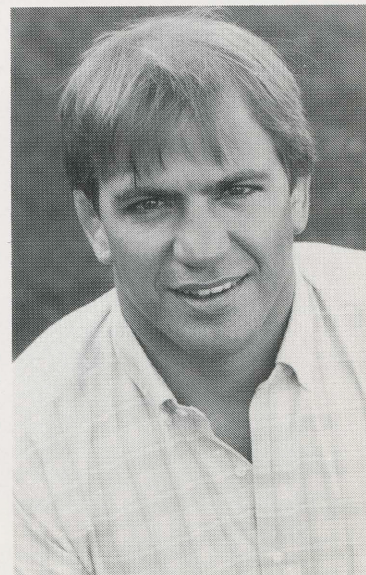
YEAR AT OSU: 1st

Scott Bliss brings high coaching credentials in his first year with the Beavers.

Born in Othello, Washington, Bliss graduated from Othello High School where he was the national freestyle and greco-roman champion. After high school, Bliss enjoyed a successful college career at University of Oregon. He was an All-American for the Ducks and was awarded the Pacific-10 Conference medal in 1980.

Bliss continued with a wrestling career, where he has held collegiate coaching positions at University of Montana (1981-87) and most recently the University of Wyoming (1987-89). In 1987 he was Big Sky Coach of the Year and won the same honors in the Western Athletic Conference in 1988. In 1988, Bliss led the Cowboys to the WAC title and their highest finish at the NCAA Tournament since 1960 in 21st place.

Bliss earned his B.S. degree from University of Oregon in 1980. He and his wife, Cindy, have a one-year-old son, Jake.

1988-89 WRESTLING OUTLOOK

The 1989-90 Oregon State wrestling team is headed by more upper-classmen and fewer freshmen to yield for a more experienced and a predictably improved season over last year.

The Beavers compiled a dual meet record of 10-13-1 and placed eighth in the Pacific-10 Conference last season.

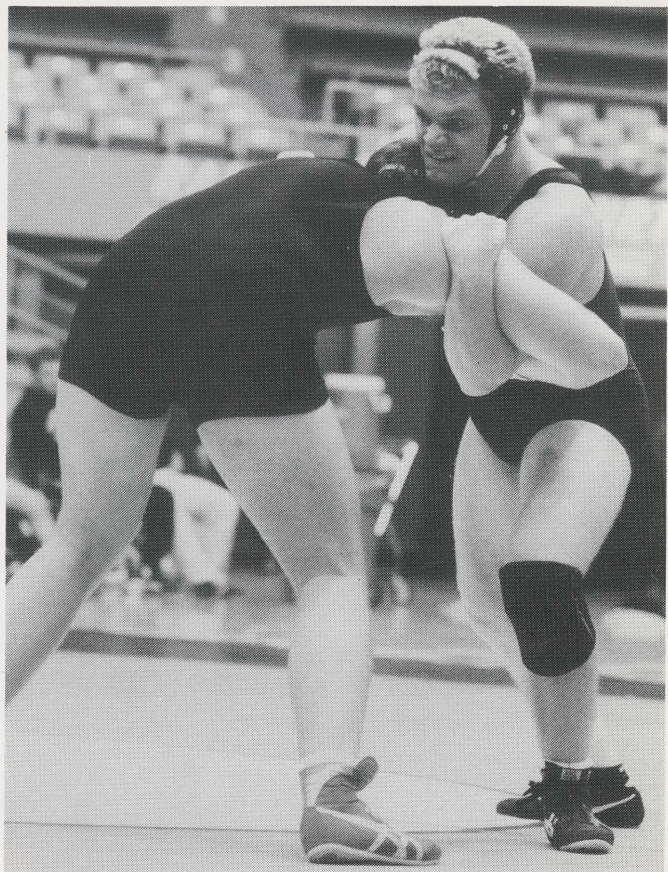
"Everyone but one wrestler is back this year, so that gives us a lot more experience than we had last year," said Dr. Dale Thomas, the nation's winningest coach with over 600 career dual wrestling wins. "We have a better team this year because we are more experienced."

The Beavers return six wrestlers who saw considerable action last season. Two sophomores who had great freshman seasons are Trent Flack (158) and Matt Willhite (230). Flack is one of the best hitters, and Willhite saw a lot of action last season. Juniors Neil Russo (142) and Michael Simons (177) are back and ready to roll, as Russo has been a steady performer for the Beavers, and Simons had the best dual meet record for the team last year.

Heading the list for the seniors are Steve Lander (167) and Fred King (190). Lander should be the leading senior, as he compiled a 22-14-2 record last season. King, who placed second at the Pac-10 last year, is the only Beaver that placed in the league.

Bill Johnston, wrestling at 134 and 142 pounds this season, is from Puyallup, Washington and is a three-time South Puget Sound champion. Brian Nissen, a 118-pounder from Redmond, Oregon, was the captain of his high school team, and 126-pound David Graham from Elma, Washington is a three-time state champion.

With a new practice facility, coach Thomas is aiming for nothing short of a great season. "We are really excited about our new facility," said Thomas. "Our goals are to have a better league record, and to do as well as we did last year in the conference and the nationals."

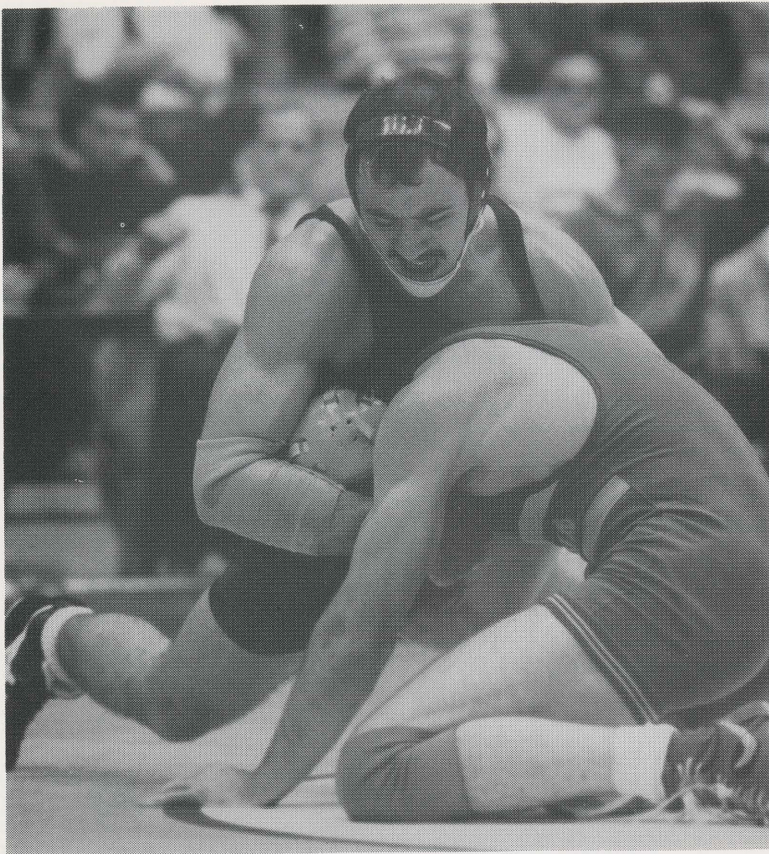

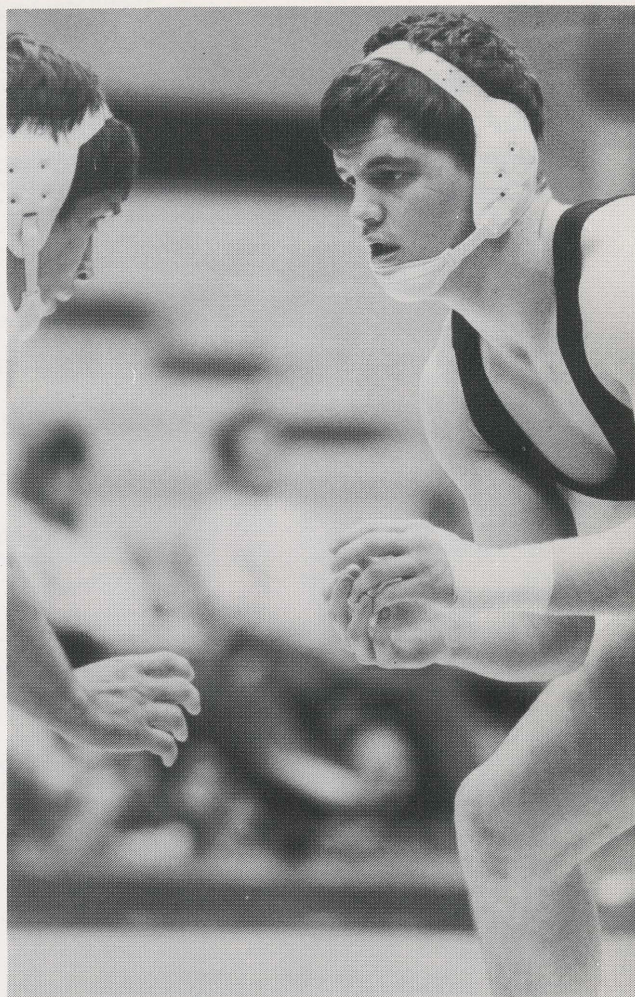
