Some Facts About OSU

Oregon State University, established in 1868, is the oldest state supported institution of higher learning in Oregon. It is one of the nation's largest land-grant schools, started by the Morrill Act of 1862, and is one of the nation's first sea-grant institutions, established in 1971.

Over 100 major buildings are located on the 500 acre main campus. Some 4,000 acres adjoining the main campus are owned and used by the University for research and instruction, and 24,000 acres more are utilized by Branch Experiment Stations for research. The School of Forestry owns and administers 14,300 acres of forest land within seven miles of the campus. The value of the University is in excess of \$100 million.

Enrollment at Oregon State University has stabilized at about 15,000 after the rapid growth of the 1950's and '60's. A wide variety of courses are offered within the areas of Engineering, Business, Pharmacy, Forestry, Science, Agriculture, Home Economics, Oceanography, Humanities and Social Sciences, Education, and Physical Education. Oregon State's oceanography research program is one of the finest in the nation and the oceanography teaching program is among the highest in the nation. The 800-ton research vessel "Yaquina" operates out of OSU's Marine Science Center at Newport, Oregon. OSU offers more than 125 fields of study in 11 schools and divisions. Master's degrees are offered in some 100 fields and doctor's degrees in 75 fields.

Oregon State University's location in a smaller community (Corvallis' population is about 36,700) is truly a blessing. Student activities are plentiful and well organized. Metropolitan areas usually pull the students away from their campuses for entertainment, but at Oregon State, life is on the campus. Educators say that this is one reason for the student's enthusiasm and interest for their school.

Oregon State University students have a wide range of religious denominations to choose from for their spiritual training. The Fellowship for Christian Athletes and Youth for Christ are among the religious groups active on campus.

Oregon State offers a variety of living accomodations for its students. The selection usually is either a fraternity or residence hall, but cooperative, religious and apartment living are also available.

Oregon State University offers young men outstanding ROTC programs. Students can elect to participate in any one of the major branches of the service, either on the basic or advanced level.

Oregon State University is located in an ideal position — just 50 miles from the Pacific Ocean, and even closer to winter sports skiing areas. Although the climate in the Willamette Valley is mild and seldom experiences snowfall, you are close to snow areas if you decide to visit them.

OSU Cross Country History

Cross Country had its start as a sport at OSU back in the 1930's when Coach Grant Swan fielded teams against Oregon Colleges and Universities.

In 1948 the University of Portland started one of the few invitational Cross Country meets that existed on the West Coast. This meet was open to any and all colleges and universities in the State of Oregon. Coach Swan's teams led by Beaver stars George Fullerton (later head coach) and Joe Fisher captured the meet title in 1948-49-50.

OSU Cross Country next went through a transition stage with three coaches at the helm from 1951-57.

Next on the scene was Sam Bell who carried the Beavers into national competition. In 1961 OSU won the NCAA title with 68 points. OSU's Dale Story won individual honors in the 1961 meet and Richard Cuddihy placed 12th to make the All-American team. In the 1962 season the Beavers placed 8th in the NCAA Championships.

In 1965, Coach Berny Wagner took over and initiated intersectional meets. In 1966, with Tracy Smith placing second, the Beavers again were in the thick of the National championship picture with a seventh place finish.

During the past several years, OSU runners have competed at Houston, Texas, in Tempe, Arizona, at Salt Lake City, Utah, in British Columbia, Kansas, Wyoming, New York, and Virginia.

Know Your Coaches

BERNY WAGNER. Starting his eighth season as Head Track and Cross Country Coach, following a brilliant junior college coaching career at College of San Mateo. Coached 13 years in prepranks in California, following graduation from Stanford where he was an 880 man. Attended and ran for Cal Tech in Pasadena, Stanford, and the S.F.O.C. Obtained B.A. degree in 1948, M.A. degree in 1949 from Stanford. Coach Wagner is married and has three children.

BOB BUELL. In his first year at OSU, graduated from Ashland High where he competed in cross country and track. Received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Lewis and Clark College in 1966 and 1970. At Lewis and Clark he lettered four years in cross country and was a member of the 1964 team which defeated Oregon State 27-29. In track he was second in the Northwest Conference two-mile in 1964. He spent two years in the Army and won the 1968 U.S. Army European Cross Country title. On returning from the service, Bob has been cross country and assistant track coach at Central Catholic High School for two years. He is single and embarking on a doctoral program in education.

Individual Profiles of Leading Runners

JOSE AMAYA - Ranked among the best in national prep circles the past two years, Amaya is primarily a distance runner, although he holds the Los Angeles City mile record while winning last year. Best of 4:09.5 in mile, 8:54.0 in 2-mile and 13:56.4 in 3-mile, the latter while a junior. Won Chicago All-Star invitational mile in 1972. He ran extensively after the prep season in All-Star meets, Chicago, Scaramento, and his native Mexico, of which he is a citizen. His high school bests at two- and three-miles are better than OSU freshman marks. From Wilson High.

RANDY BROWN - A graduate of Sunset High in Beaverton, Brown won the Oregon Class AAA cross country title in 1971 and the two-mile title last spring. Has a best of 9:13.2 in the two-mile. He also won championships in the high school divisions at both the Oregon AAU cross country and Seaside Run gatherings.

CHRIS CAREY - Although primarily a miler, Chris also is a fine distance runner. Has a 1500 meter best equivalent to a 3:58.8 mile and has run two-miles in 9:09.4. Also has been under 9:10 for the steeplechase, although not a regular event for him. From Carlmont High in San Carlos, California, he gained All-American Cross Country recognition in 1967 and 1968. He will be a senior.

HAILU EBBA - Oregon State's exciting miler will take a rest during the cross country season after a fine spring last year and the Olympic competition for his native Ethiopia this fall. Won Pacific-8 mile championship as a sophomore.

LEONARD HILL - An outstanding young runner and one of the best steeplechasers in collegiate circles. He ran a lifetime best of 8:46 in qualifying for the NCAA finals last spring, although he did not place in the finals. Held OSU freshman cross country record until last year over OSU course AA. A 1970 graduate of Phoenix High (Oregon), Hill won the State AA two-mile race as a junior and senior and the cross country title his senior year. Also led the Beavers at two-miles (8:53.2) and three-miles (13:43.4) last spring. His best prep time at two-miles was 9:30.4, indicating tremendous improvement in just two seasons.

SCOTT JACKSON - A former two-time State AAA cross country champion from Grant High in Portland. Last year set OSU freshman record over two-miles at 9:01.2, an improvement of 20 seconds over his prep best. He was a three-time prep district champ in the mile, once over two-miles, and a three-time champion in cross country. Gained valuable experience last year on the OSU varsity team.

KELLY JENSEN - One of several outstanding newcomers to the OSU track program, Jensen attended St. Mary's High of Medford. He won State A title last year in two-mile, placed in the 880 and also won mile, but was disqualified for running out of his lane. In 1971 he was runnerup in the mile and won the cross country and two-mile titles. An outstanding student also, he will be working toward a degree in Engineering.

CLAY LOWREY - Primarily a middle distance runner with a sub 1:49 time in the 880, Lowrey is beginning his third season of cross country work. He was a transfer from American River College in Sacramento. Prepped at El Camino High in Sacramento. He also has run 49.1 in the 440.


