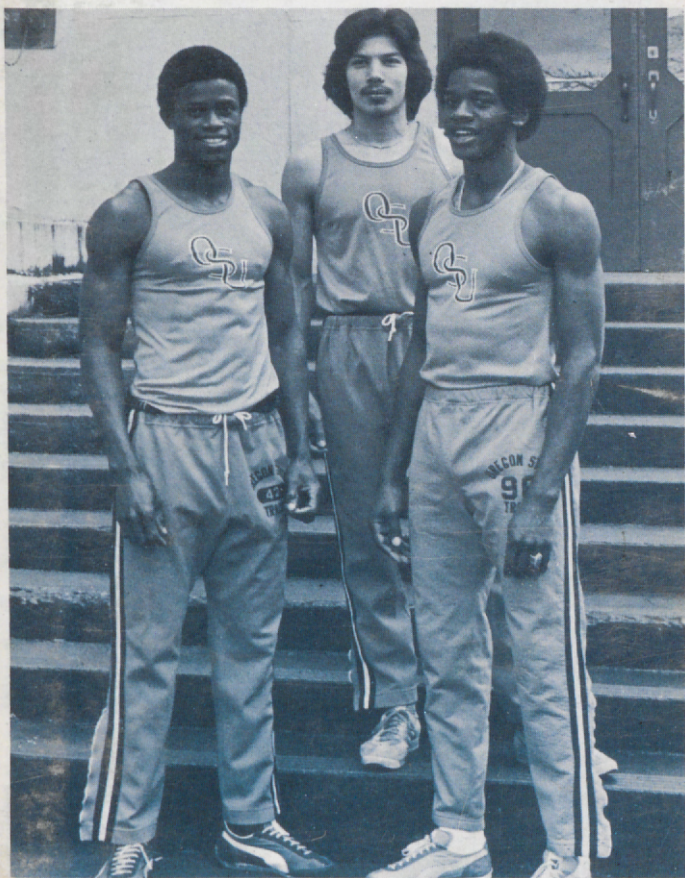

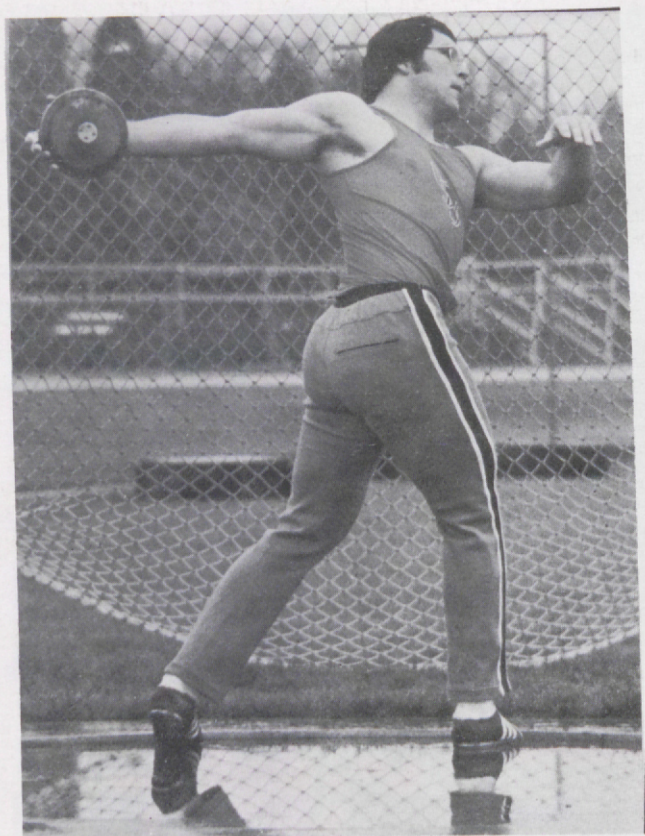

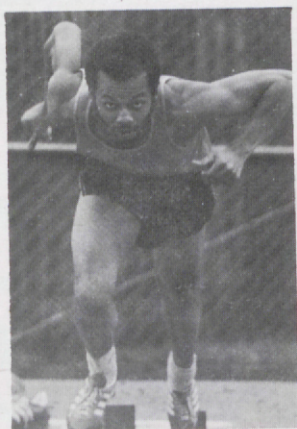

Oregon State University is Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher learning. It uses Oct. 27, 1868 as its Charter Day.

Like many of the leading public universities in the U.S., Oregon State was established as a Land Grant or "people's college" under the historic Morrill Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln. The act provided grants of lands to the various states to start public colleges that would extend educational opportunities to all who had the will and ability to learn.

In its early years, the school was located in "downtown Corvallis." A 35-acre farm was purchased in 1870 for a new college campus west of town. The first building, Benton Hall, was completed in 1888.

In the beginning, the curriculum was typical of the colleges of the period. There was a classical course leading to the Bachelor of Arts degree and a scientific course leading to the Bachelor of Science.

Agriculture was added in 1869 under the impetus of the Land Grant Act. Commerce, household economy and engineering courses came soon too and in 1908, four professional schools were established: Agriculture, Commerce, Engineering, and Home Economics.

With 15,500 students now, Oregon State offers a complete university curriculum. The College of Science and the College of Liberal Arts are the largest academic units. Schools include Agriculture, Business and Technology, Education, Engineering, Forestry, Home Economics, Oceanography, Pharmacy, and a Division of Health and Physical Education.

OSU's 400-acre, tree-lined campus now has about 100 buildings and research laboratories. Classroom buildings, the library, and student activity areas are located in the center. Residence halls and research areas are on the edges.

In September 1971, Oregon State was designated by the U.S. Commerce Department as one of the nation's first four Sea Grant colleges as well. As such, it is charged with leadership in the wise development of marine resources.

Oregon State's ocean research vessels (four) are docked at Newport on the Oregon Coast, just 55 miles from the campus. The university's Marine Science Center there has become one of the top tourist attractions in the Northwest

DEE ANDROS

Director of Athletics

"The Great Pumpkin" started a new "Era" at Oregon State University when he announced he was resigning as the Beavers' head football coach following the 1975 season. Shortly after his resignation as football coach, Dee was named as Director of Athletics, succeeding Jim Barratt to become the eighth Athletic Director in OSU history.

Dee's decision to give up the OSU football reigns ended a happy and successful 25 years as a grid coach, the final 14 as a head coach.

Dee's athletic career began back in Oklahoma City, Okla., where he was born October 17, 1924. Dee played four years of prep football at Central High School in Oklahoma City, plus he also earned an additional two letters in wrestling. After graduating from Oklahoma City High School in 1942, Dee entered the Marine Corps and served in the Marines from 1942-46 through the duration of World War II and was decorated with a Bronze Star in the battle of Iwo Jima for heroic achievement. Dee was a sergeant in the Marines at the time of his discharge.

Following his discharge in the Marines, Dee entered University of Oklahoma where he played football for four years, the first year under the late Jim Tatum and the Sooners went to the Gator Bowl that year. The next three years were under Bub Wilkinson and twice the Sooners reached the Sugar Bowl. Dee graduated from Oklahoma in 1950. It was at Oklahoma that he met and married his lovely wife Luella. Demosthenes Konstandies Andreopoulos (Dee's full name) was married to the former Luella Thomas on January, 1949.

Following his graduation from Oklahoma, Dee immediately launched his very successful coaching career. He started out as an assistant under Wilkinson on the Oklahoma staff for three years (1950-52). In 1953, Dee served as line coach at Kansas and then moved on to Texas Tech in 1954-55. He joined Pete Elliott as an assistant at Nebraska in 1956 and followed Elliott to California for three more years (1957-59). He also followed Elliott to Illinois for two more years (1960-61) before gaining his first head job, University of Idaho in 1962.

While Dee was serving as an assistant, Texas Tech went to the Sun Bowl and California to the Rose Bowl in 1959.

Dee spent three years at Idaho where he compiled a 11-16-1 record.

Dee was named head coach at OSU, following the departure of Tommy Prothro to UCLA, in 1965. Since Dee arrived at Oregon State, few coaches have ever enjoyed the national attention that has been bestowed on the "Great Pumpkin". Under Dee's leadership, the Beavers were runner-up in the tough Pacific-8 Conference four times.

Perhaps Dee's most famous season was in 1967, a team that was called the "Giant Killers". That year, OSU defeated then No. 2 ranked Purdue on the road and two weeks later tied No. 2 ranked UCLA in Los Angeles, which prompted Dee to say, "I'm tired of playing these No. 2 teams, bring on No. 1". His Beavers then proceeded to defeat the No. 1 ranked USC Trojans, led by O. J. Simpson, the next week in Corvallis, 3-0.

Dee's brilliant coaching career has brought him many honors and much acclaim. He has served as a coach in three different post-season all-star games, the Hula Bowl, the Coaches All-America Bowl and the East-West Shrine Game.

Some of Dee's teammates at Oklahoma included Jim Owens, ex-Washington coach; Darrell Royal, Texas; Bert Clark, ex-Washington State coach; and Jack Mitchell, ex-Kansas coach.

Dee got his famous "Great Pumpkin" nickname from a veteran Northwest sports writer, Harry Missildine, Sports Editor of the Spokesman-Review in Spokane, Wash. Harry noticed that Dee was always dressed in orange while near the gridiron, and for that matter most everywhere else he travels, thus the "Great Pumpkin" nickname.

Dee as a football coach, and even more now as an athletic director, is in constant demand as a speaker and tries to fill as many speaking engagements as possible.

Dee and Luella have one daughter, Jeanna, 19.



DR. ROBERT W. MACVICAR

President

Dr. Robert MacVicar, a national educational and scientific leader, has been president since July 1, 1970, of Oregon State University, Oregon's oldest public institution of higher learning.

He came to Oregon State from Southern Illinois University where he had served first as vice president for academic affairs and then as chancellor.

Earlier, MacVicar had been on the faculty of Oklahoma State University as professor of chemistry, dean of the graduate school, and vice president of academic affairs.

Born September 28, 1918, MacVicar received his bachelor's degree from the University of Wyoming; his master's degree in chemistry from Oklahoma State; and his doctor's degree in biochemistry from the University of Wisconsin.

When MacVicar was graduated with highest honors from the University of Wyoming in 1939, he was chosen to be a Rhodes Scholar. He was unable to go to England for the special advanced work, however, because of the start of World War II in Europe and his own military service as an officer in the Food and Nutrition Division, U.S. Army Sanitary Corps.

President MacVicar is currently serving as a member of the American Council on Education's new Commission on Leadership Development in Higher Education. He has been on the Council of the Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges; consultant to the U.S. Office of Education, 1956-70; consultant to the Atomic Energy Commission, 1958-69; and was a member of the Educational Advisory Committee of the National Science Foundation, 1957-69.

He also was a founding member of the board of the Central Educational Midwest Research Laboratory, St. Louis, Mo., and chairman of the Laboratory executive committee for three years.

In April 1972, he was one of seven representatives of government and higher education named to a policy-level steering committee to guide a nationwide program for higher education information exchange. The program is directed by the National Center for Higher Education Management Systems.

In 1971, MacVicar was named to the Oregon committee for selection of Rhodes Scholars. He is a member of the nation's two major academic honor societies — Phi Kappa Phi and Phi Beta Kappa — and the national research honorary, Sigma Xi. He is author of some 135 papers, reports and articles.

MacVicar's professional memberships include the American Society of Biological Chemists, American Chemical Society, American Institute of Nutrition, Nutrition Society of Great Britain, and the Society for Experimental Biology and Medicine.

McVicar Active President

Since he became Oregon State University's 14th president in 1970, Dr. Robert MacVicar has become noted in the Northwest for his tremendous energy, long work days, and his ability to communicate with people — students, parents, legislators, business men, senior citizens.

Breakfasts for him are times for meetings. Evenings are for speaking engagements, meetings and conferences, teaching a class at the university on trends in higher education, and for inviting students into his home for informal talks and for listening to their points of view.

In 1972, the university president moved into a resident hall for part of a week to better appreciate student needs and wishes concerning their college programs. On a continuing basis, he and the student body president hold regular question-and-answer sessions on campus for anyone who has something to say or ask.

During the first year in Oregon, MacVicar traveled more than 30,000 miles to become acquainted with the people, resources and needs of the state. His pace hasn't slackened since then. He has visited every part of the state and spoken in almost every community.

His voice has become one of the best known and most heeded in the Northwest on educational, scientific, and research programs and problems.

Mrs. MacVicar is an educator too as well as a homemaker. She holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Oklahoma State University and met her husband while both were professors there. They were married in 1948. Mrs. MacVicar also taught for two years in Boston at a day care center and did a year's advanced work at Child Education Foundation in New York City.

The MacVicars have two children.



PAUL VALENTI

Associate Director of Athletics

Paul Valenti graduated from Tamalpais High School in Mill Valley, Calif., in 1938 and that fall enrolled at Oregon State University. Except for time out for World War II and service in the Navy (1942-45), Paul has been a member of the OSU family ever since, first as a player, then as a coach and administrator.

Paul played four years of basketball at OSU, earning three letters under legendary Slats Gill and playing on two Northern Division championship teams, 1940 and 1942. Following his stint in the Navy for World War II, Paul returned to Corvallis and joined his old coach, Slats, as an assistant, a capacity he served until 1958 when Slats retired as an active coach to become athletic director.

Paul was the logical man to take over the OSU basketball post when Slats retired and he did an outstanding job for six seasons as the Beavers' head coach. His six-year record found Valenti's teams winning 85 and losing 74 and his 1966 team captured the Pacific-8 championship, the last team to wrestle the title away from UCLA.

Jim Jarvis, Loy Petersen, Charlie White, Freddie Boyd and Ed Fredenburg were some of the outstanding players to perform under Valenti during his tenure as Beaver basketball coach.

After relinquishing his head basketball position, Paul was named Assistant Athletic Director and tennis coach. He was OSU's tennis coach for six years before the sport was discontinued at OSU following the 1975 season.

When Dee Andros was appointed Director of Athletics, Paul was immediately promoted to Associate Director of Athletics by Andros and given much more responsibility. Among many duties, Paul is responsible for the grounds and maintenance of OSU athletic facilities.

Paul was an outstanding athlete as a prep, earning four letters in basketball and tennis and earning all-league honors three times in each sport. After earning his B.A. Degree in 1942, Paul also added his Master's from OSU in 1949.

Born 9/10/20 in San Francisco, Ca., Paul and his wife Francine have two daughters, Jo Ann, 27; and Victoria, 25.



BILL ROBERTSON, Trainer — Bill has been OSU's trainer since 1946. The very popular Robertson goes by the nickname "Ropes". Bill was born March 6, 1915 in Vancouver, B.C., Canada and moved to the United States at an early age and became a U.S. citizen. He graduated from Portland's Benson Tech in 1934. After working at the Multnomah Athletic Club for three years, he enrolled at OSU in 1937 and joined the Army in 1941. After being discharged as an infantry staff sergeant in 1945, Bill returned to OSU and was named the Beavers' trainer July 1, 1946. Bill later got his B.S. Degree in Science in 1948. His illustrious career has found him being inducted into the Helms Hall of Fame for athletic trainers, serving as Olympic trainer for the 1964 Olympic Games in Tokyo. Bill also went to the Far East in 1967 (summer) to put on clinics for trainers for the Department of Defense. Bill is very much in demand at banquets as a speaker and is very famous for his vocal rendition of "Casey at the Bat" and dozens of other recitations. Bill and his wife Mary have three children, Billy, 29; Nancy, 28; and Penny, 27.



LOREN SOLUM, Assistant Trainer — Joined the OSU staff in 1969 and has served as an assistant trainer to Bill Robertson ever since. Loren also runs the OSU weight training program. Loren is a 1959 graduate of Wallace High School in Wallace, Idaho, and a 1965 graduate of the University of Idaho. He attended Columbia Basin Junior College for one year prior to enrolling at Idaho where he received his B.S. in Education. Loren also holds a M.S. in Education from OSU (1969). Loren participated in football, basketball, baseball and track in high school and football, baseball and basketball at Columbia Basin and football at Idaho. He spent three years as a teacher at Kellogg, Idaho, High School before joining the OSU staff. Born 12/7/41, Loren and his wife Tricia have two children, David, 4; and Tracy, 2.



JIM RUDD, Assistant Athletic Director In Charge of Beaver Club — Jim joined the Oregon State staff in 1974 as Director of Sales & Promotion. In January, 1976, Jim switched positions in the department to become the first ever Executive Director of the Beaver Club, OSU's athletic fund raising organization. Jim is a 1970 graduate of University of Northern Iowa where he received his B.A. in Education. Jim received his M.A. in Education from the same school in 1972. Jim enjoyed an outstanding athletic career at Northern Iowa, winning three letters in football, and earning all-conference honors as a lineman. As a prep at Salt Community High School in Salt City, Iowa, Jim earned four football letters, three basketball and four in track. He was the Class AA shot put champion and 1966 state record holder at 58-0, plus he earned all-state honors in football. Born 3/1/48 in Salt City, Iowa. Jim is single.



HAL COWAN, Director of Public Relations & Promotions — Joined the OSU staff in January, 1976, as Director of Sales & Promotions and was promoted in April to Director of Public Relations & Promotions. Cowan is in charge of the Sports Information Department, ticket sales and promotions. Prior to joining the OSU staff, Cowan served as Director of Public Relations with the Portland Storm of the World Football League; Sports Information Director at the University of Oregon (1967-74); Assistant Sports Information Director at the University of California in Berkeley (1966-67); Sports Information Director at Central Michigan University (1965-66). Cowan is a 1964 graduate of Linfield College with a B.A. in Journalism. Cowan also was a sports writer for the Oregonian and Oregon Statesman and served in the U.S. Army as a 1st Lieutenant in the Medical Service Corps before taking the SID position at Central Michigan. Cowan is a 1958 graduate of North Salem High School. He participated in football, basketball, cross country and baseball at North Salem and baseball at Linfield. Several of Cowan's press books, football, basketball, and track/baseball, have won national awards and he also served on the NCAA Public Relations Committee. Born 3/26/40 in McCook, Neb. Hal has two boys, Chris, 9; and Greg, 4.



JOHN EGGERS, Sports Information Director — John is starting his 27th year on the OSU staff: John joined the OSU staff on July 1, 1950, as an assistant to director Irwin Harris, and was moved up to the SID position on July 1, 1952. Eggert was born and raised in Pendleton, the "Round-Up City" of eastern Oregon. He was an all-state basketball player at Pendleton High, a prep teammate of Lew Beck who later went on to win All-America fame at OSU and play in the Olympic Games. Eggert played one varsity basketball season at Willamette while only a freshman before enlisting in the Navy for World War II. After discharge, he attended OSU from the fall of 1946 through 1949. Before returning to the OSU staff, he worked for one year as a sports writer on the Oregonian in Portland. John and his wife Jean have three sons, Kerry 23, Brent 20, and Tom 15.



SCOTT JOHNSON, Assistant Sports Information Director — The newest member of the Oregon State University staff, Johnson assumed his duties on August 9th. For the past four years, he was the Sports Information Director at Clackamas Community College. He also was the publicity director for the Oregon Community College Athletic Association the past three years. Johnson's 1975 football program was a national winner in the NJCAA for excellence. He is a 1972 graduate of the University of Oregon with a B.S. in Journalism. Johnson is a graduate of Rex Putnam high school in Milwaukie in 1968 where he participated in football, basketball and baseball. Born 7/2/50 in Weiser, Idaho. He is single.



DON SHELLEY, Equipment Manager — Don has been the OSU Equipment Manager since 1961. Don attended Oregon State in 1932 and 1933 after graduating from North Bend High School in 1932. He attended Behnke-Walker Business College from 1934-36, where he received his Business degree. He worked for Evans Products in Coos Bay from 1936-42 and then spent four years in the Navy. From 1946-54 he was part owner of a sawmill and from 1955-59 he worked for Holmes Eureka Lumber Company before taking his OSU position. Born 4/14/14, Don and his wife Elva have two children, Kristin, 25) and Jon, 27.



JACK RAINEY, Administrative Assistant — Jack is currently in his seventh year at OSU and serves as an Administrative Assistant to Dee Andros, in addition to his academic counselor duties. Jack graduated from high school in Jerome, Idaho, and served one year in the U.S. Marine Corps prior to enrolling at the University of Idaho, where he earned his B.S. and M.S. degrees in Education. He was a teacher and coach at Filler High, Idaho (1949)50), Weiser High, Idaho (1950-55), LaGrande High, Oregon (1955-63) and Albany High, Oregon (1963-69) before coming to OSU in 1969 as a graduate assistant in the School of Physical Education. He was later named assistant baseball and basketball coach and eventually became academic coordinator. ELAINE VAN VLEET, Acting Ticket Manager — Elaine has worked in the ticket office six and one half years, under Comm Henness and Beth Monroe. She was married on June 10, 1956, to Carlos Van Vleet, and they have five children — Marla, 20; Bill, 18; Chuck, 16; John, 14; and Bob, 12. Elaine became acting ticket manager on January 1, 1977.



DR. STEVEN ROY, Team Physician — A native of Cape Town, South Africa, Dr. Steven Roy is in his second year as OSU's team doctor. OSU GENERAL OUTLOOK 1977

Even though the Oregon State track and field squad lost 20 lettermen through graduation, the Beavers could provide many pleasant surprises this spring.

The team will have its strength in the middle distances, the jumps and the sprints. Those capable of winning points in the jumps include Scott Fisher, pole vault (17-½), Cliff Barry (16-0), Dave Gable (15-6), John Okoro, long jump (26-¼), Bruce Smith (25-9¼), Steve Rim, triple jump (51-1½), John Edwards, high jump (6-10) and Glen Stone (6-10¼).

Among the sprint stars are Jerry Jordan (9.4, 10.3 and 20.7), Dwayne Hall (9.7 and 21.8), Joe Axtell (9.8 and 21.8), Curtis Byrd (45.6 and 21.2), Gary Barnes (47.9 and 21.7), El Kashief Koukou (45.9), Andrew Fields (48.2 and 22.1) and Rick Kumm (4:06., 1:51.2).

Head Coach Steve Simmons, now in his second season with OSU, is optimistic about chances for the coming campaign.

"I feel that we can, through the type of competition we face and the caliber of athletes on our team, reshape the OSU record book as well as setting many new Wayne Valley Field marks in the process. The team has had a good fall and winter. If we stay healthy and make the transition into our early meets, we could have an enjoyable season. We're thin, but we have some fine individuals".

In addition to the many new men, veterans like Jim Miller, discus; Jack Groth, 880; Bill Evans, high hurdles; and Tim Fox, discus, are sure to help. Okoro and Fisher are defending Pacific-8 conference individual champions.

"In building our team concept", Simmons says, "we will be going after a number of relay records. Among those are the mile relay (3:07.6), 2-mile relay (7:18.9), 4-mile relay (16.48), distance medley (9:40.5) and the sprint medley (3:17.5).

Competition: The Pacific-8 conference is the strongest track conference in the nation. Competing in the conference raises expectations and performances. Over 70 athletes work out year round from our two varsity track locker rooms.

Improvement: No team in the country can match the improvements made by OSU track men. This is due to their hard work, and all possible training aids, including replay TV for workouts. There is a track weight room with Olympic weight sets, an all-year indoor vaulting pit and one of the finest tracks in the world.

Facilities: Oregon State has constructed one of the nation's most modern track and field facilities in Wayne Valley Field. It was the USA's first international track (400 meters) of the most resilient surfacing. All electronic connections are installed; world record distances are possible in all field events; wind and sun conditions have been considered for best performances and everything possible has been included to air in workouts and competition. There has been just one case of shin splits in three years.

Coaching Situation: The OSU coaching staff combines the talents of six coaches, all of whom have experience and background. The enthusiasm shown is remarkable. Each of these coaches was an all-American, each has enjoyed personal success in track and field. And, the average age of the coaching staff is 30 years old. We have 39 years of total coaching experience at OSU.

HEAD TRACK COACH STEVE SIMMONS

A man with a highly-successful background in track — both as a participant and as a coach — is now in his second season as head man for the Beavers.

He's Steve Simmons, regarded as highly-personable by the press and well-liked by the young men he coaches.

Simmons came to Oregon State from Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo, where he compiled an excellent record for five years. But he didn't begin his athletic career in California. He attended high school at Roosevelt High School in Dayton, Ohio, and later moved west to Los Angeles City College where he graduated in June of 1963. He was at Chapman College in Orange from 1963-65 and gained another degree in 1965. He was an all-conference basketball player at L. A. City College and a 1965 NCAA Division II All-American high hurdler at Chapman.

Simmons has served as a triple jump coach at three U. S. Olympic specialized training camps in 1971, 1975 and 1976. Well known on an international basis, as well, he has served as a visiting coach and conducted clinics in Brazil, Kenya, the Ivory Coast, Denmark and Nigeria.

Simmons' record at Cal Poly from 1970 through 1975 was superb. He coached 40 NCAA All-Americans and five national champions. He coached athletes who set or tied 52 indoor and outdoor records. Track fans will recognize some of the "name" performers he has coached, among them Reynaldo Brown, Curtis Boyd; Clancy Edwards, Ken Haagen, Dave Hamer and Mohinder Gill.

Simmons was sorry that the Beavers didn't do better in his first year at the helm, and is pointing to the immediate future in his rebuilding process. His recruiting, which was very good this year, is likely to get more productive all the time.

As one of America's top jump coaches, in his six years as a head coach, his athletes have scored 97½ points in jumping events in NCAA competition. A man of many dimensions, he has coached NCAA Division I and II All-American athletes in 11 different events.

DEAN CLARK

Assistant Coach

In his second year of coaching at OSU, Dean Clark is a graduate of Tigard High School, class of 1970, when he placed second in the two-mile in the state championships. He clocked the fastest time in the state that year, also placed third in the state cross-country championships. Moving on to Washington State University, he compiled an excellent record there. He was a four-year letterman in track and cross-country, obtaining his B.A. degree in 1975. In 1973, he earned All-America honors in the steeplechase in the NCAA meet. His best marks were 4:06 (mile), 8:43.0 (steeplechase) and 13:30 (three mile).

STEVE DEAUTREMONT

Assistant Coach

A 1970 graduate of Oregon State, two-time NCAA hammer throw champion, is assistant coach Steve DeAutremont. A 1974 national AAU champion, Steve earned his Master of Business Administration degree and moved to Los Angeles. Later he returned to Corvallis for the atmosphere of working with weight men. Steve works with the OSU weight men and jumpers in their training. He holds the all-time OSU hammer throw record of 207-2.

JOHN RADETICH

Assistant Coach

Only two men have ever jumped over 7-6, and OSU assistant John Radetich is one of them (Dwight Stones was the other). Radetich was an All-American at OSU, and his best mark in college was 7-1. John was on the pro track trail four years and was one of the top stars in that circuit. An excellent teacher of the "Fosbury Flop" technique, Radetich has been a part of the OSU track for eight years, as an athlete and coach.

ROBIN ROEDER

Assistant Coach

Robin Roeder works with the hammer throw members of the Oregon State squad. While a competitor at OSU, he was number 2 on the all-time list of hammer experts. His best mark then was 163-8. Roeder won the Canadian National title in 1971 and 191-8 was the mark. More recently, he was over the 218 foot level.

MIKE LYGSTAD

Assistant Coach

A 1971 graduate of the University of Montana, Mike Lyngstad coaches the Beaver javelin throwers. The Montana and Big Sky conference record holder with a mark of 253-8, Mike was the international military champion in 1970-71. He also was a place winner at the AAU meet in 1970, 1971 and 1972. He has coached both football and track in Montana and Oregon high schools.

Track Profiles

JOE AXTELL, sprinter: 5-8, 145, freshman from Eugene, Ore. Attended Sheldon High, competing in gymnastics, track, football and ski racing. In track, compiled best marks of 9.8, 21.9 and 50.8. Earned grade point average of 3.86 in high school. Says biggest thrill came when winning the 1975 Rose Festival Invitational 220. Was handicapped by injury as senior but still managed to finish second in 220 at state meet. Could run 9.6 and 21.5 this year, coach says.

GARY BARNES, 440: 5-11, 155, Jr. from Eagle Point, Oregon. Transferred to OSU from Lane Community College. Recorded fastest time (47.8) in the Oregon junior college circuit for 1976. Will run both the 200 and 400 meters in 1977. Has run a 21.7 in the 220 and has been on 440 and mile relay teams. Major is Political Science.

CLIFF BARRY, pole vault: 5-11, 180, senior letterman from Medford, Oreg., where he attended high school. Was tight end on football team two years, earned three letters in track and was on ski team. Is Oregon State's second vaulter with a best of 16 feet. He and Scott Fisher provide solid one-two punch in event. Came to OSU because he wanted to compete at the Pac-8 level, in school of business and wants to be an accountant.

MARK BAILEY, distances: 6-3, 170, soph. letterman from Roseburg, Ore. Best mark of 1:51.4, made as a freshman. Also plays key role in relay events, where Beavers will go after a number of records this spring. Sought are new school marks in two-mile, distance medley and four mile relays. Ran three years of both cross-country and track while in high school.

CURTIS BYRD, 440: 6-0, 160, jr. from Santa Rosa, California. Attended Cardinal Newman High School, where he was varsity letterman as wide receiver in football. Transferred to OSU from Cal Poly. Says his biggest thrill in sports was when he ran a 45.6 at El Paso Texas in March of 1975. American junior champ and record holder of 46.1. Was twice NCAA Division II All-American. Had to sit out last season before becoming eligible at OSU. Squad leader and one of co-captains. Best known of all of OSU's new people. Is a Journalism and Speech major.

BILL DELATORRE, middle distances: 5-11, 152, soph. letterman from Los Angeles. Attended Phineas Banning High in Wilmington, Cal. Was three-year letterman in both cross country and track. Participated in 440, 880, 1000 and mile. Best mile mark was 4:12. As freshman at OSU last year, compiled times of 3:46.7 and 1:51.9. Emerged as OSU's No. 1 cross country runner last fall, and that background should also help him through a strong track season. One of squad co-captains.

JOHN EDWARDS, high jump: 6-5, 190, junior letterman from Eugene, Ore. From South Eugene High School. A 6-10 jumper last year, Edwards had a good fall practice and should top the 7 foot mark. Through hard work, John has improved from a 6-7 high school jumper.

BILL EVANS, hurdles: 6-1, 170, soph. from Salt Lake City. Was the state of Utah high hurdle champion in 1975. Returns to the team after a year's absence. Had a 14.3 mark as a freshman, but is likely to better that this spring. Will threaten the school record of 13.9. Has run 19.4 in the low hurdles.

ANDREW FIELDS, 440: 5-9, 160, freshman from Sacramento. Was 4th in the California state meet in the 440 at 48.2. Also ran a swift 36.4 for a 330 low hurdles. Coach Simmons says that Fields should be a top-notch candidate for the 400 meters and the 440 Intermediate hurdles.

SCOTT FISHER, pole vault: 5-10, 155, jr. letterman from Medford, Oregon. Set eight meet records at Medford High and was on The Journal all-state track team. Had prep best of 15-3½. Improved mark

to 16-6 freshman year at OSU, then last year cleared 17-¼ for all-time best. Surprised everyone by winning the Pacific-8 championship — the first sophomore in a long time to turn the trick. The former prep state champ could be in the 18 foot vicinity this spring.

JEREL GRANT, javelin: 5-11, 181, soph. from Mill City, Oregon. Was 1974 state prep champion. Returns to OSU after being out with a knee injury. His brother Tony won the NAIA javelin title, forming one of the best brother javelin combinations. In high school, also played three years each of football, baseball and track.

JAKE GROTH, middle distances: 6-1, 165, Jr. letterman from Wapato, Wash. Was Class AA state 880 champion in Washington with 1:53.4 mark. Won most inspirational award in football, basketball and track. At OSU, has best mark of 1:49.2. Has run a 9.9 hundred, a 22.0 in the 220 and 50.3 in the 440. Will be used in middle distances and on numerous relay teams. Coach Simmons expects him to be under 1:48.0 this season.

DWAYNE HALL, sprints: 6-1, 190, soph. from Los Angeles. From Dorsey High School in Los Angeles, originally, and transferred to OSU from Hartnell JC. Was No. 1 split end in football much of time last fall. Best marks to date are 9.6 and 21.8, but Coach Simmons feels he can get down to 9.4 and 21.0 this spring. Could become one of best two-sport athletes at Oregon State.

JERRY JORDAN, sprints: 6-0, 160, junior from Oakland, Cal. A junior college transfer from Alameda JC. At present OSU's top sprint prospect. Runner-up in California junior college state 200 meters at 20.7, also was fourth in the 100 meters. His best 100-yard time was 9.4. at Oakland High, was also a football halfback and blocking back. Coach Simmons feels Jordan is the best Oregon State sprints prospect since Willie Turner, the 1968 NCAA champion.

RICK KUMM, middle distances: 6-2, 160, freshman from Salem, Ore. From Sprague High, where he won countless honors in both cross-country and track. Was all-state in both and on All-America high school track team of 1976. State of Oregon AAA titlist in both 880 and mile. Best marks of 1:51.2 and 4:06.4. Mile time broke Steve Prefontaine's record of 4:08.3. Regarded as one of finest local products in years, and compared to Jim Grelle, former Oregon star.

BENGT LARSSON, decathlon: 6-2, 190, jr. letterman from Olsater, Sweden. Was the "clutch guy" of the OSU contingent last year. Surprised all with a third place finish at the Pacific-8 championships, then ended up in 4th place at the NCAA championship meet. His best mark is 7,178 points in the decathlon could well go by the board this spring, according to Coach Simmons. The hard-working Larsson is ready for an all-out effort.

ZACH MARSH, sprints: 5-6, 130, soph. from Oxnard, Cal. From Hueneme High School. Has best marks of 22-0 in long jump, 15-1 in high hurdles and 9.6 in 100 while he was in the Army. He was hampered by injuries his first year at OSU, but still ran several fine legs on relay teams. With good health and a bit of luck, he could better his 9.6.

JIM MILLER, discus: 6-3, 220, senior letterman from Troutdale, Oregon. From Reynolds High School, returning to Oregon State after a year's absence. Best mark is 181-9, which ranks him third on the all-time OSU list, behind Tim Vollmer and Roger Smith. Provides leadership and consistency to the weights events. If he regains his former form, could better fine previous marks. He appears ready for final season.

JOHN OKORO, jumps: 6-1½, 175, jr. letterman from Benin City, Nigeria. Was Pacific-8 conference long jump champion in 1976. Has lifetime bests of 26-1 and 51-7. His goal is to become Oregon State's greatest horizontal jumper. Coach Simmons predicts he'll be a strong candidate to repeat at the Pac-8 meet, and also is a contender for national honors. He is one of OSU's co-captains. Wants to coach track and field after graduation.

MATT REA, distances: 5-11, 152, jr. letterman from Albany. From South Albany High. Has best marks of 3:54.5 in 1500 meters and 9:19.0 in steeplechase. Ranks as the Beavers' top three-miler for 1977. A solid runner with good potential in both the 5000 and 3000 meter steeplechase. In 1972 and 1973 was Valley league high school cross-country champion. In 1973, Valley league mile champion, and also winner of the statesmile at Willamette Relays.

STEVE RIM, jumps: 6-1, 172, senior letterman from Clovis, Cal. Was top triple jumper in nation in 1972, with best of 50-10. Went 24-7 in long jump. Played two years of football and basketball, as well. Was plagued by injuries much of college career. All-time best mark is 51-7 in triple jump. If healthy, could accomplish some good marks.

BOW SELTZER, intermediate hurdles: 6-0, 163, senior letterman from Clinton, Md. From Surratsville High School. Best mark of 53.2. Will run the 400 meters and 400 hurdles this season. College major is Landscape Architecture. Has worked hard to improve his running this winter and should run under 52.0 this spring.

BRUCE SMITH, jumps: 6-4, 195, jr. from Ventura, California. Transferred to OSU from Ventura JC, and was on basketball squad this winter, scoring 60 points in one game for the junior varsity. Strong in three events — with best marks of 25-9¼, 49-0 and 6-9. California state long jump champion in 1975, and second in 1976. Coach Simmons feels that Smith has the potential to be a 27 foot long jumper if he can gain consistency in his approach and takeoff.

GLEN STONE, high jump: 6-2½, 160, senior letterman from Corvallis. From Corvallis High. Best mark of 6-10¼. Has grade point average of 3.02 in Engineering. An Air Force veteran, Stone is 26 years old. Coach Simmons predicts he will be another in the long list of 7 foot jumpers from Oregon State.

KEN SPEARING, hurdles: 6-2, 180, soph. letterman from Portland, Ore. From Madison High, where he was state of Oregon AAA high hurdles champion with season's best of 14.0. Scored 6530 points in the decathlon. Last year as a freshman at OSU recorded a 14.4 mark. Strong athlete who has improved his speed. Has the size and athletic ability to be a sub 14.0 hurdler this spring.
