



Oregon State University is Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher learning. It uses Oct. 27, 1868 as its Charter Day.

Like many of the leading public universities in the U.S., Oregon State was established as a Land Grant or "people's college" under the historic Morrill Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln. The act provided grants of lands to the various states to start public colleges that would extend educational opportunities to all who had the will and ability to learn.

In its early years, the school was located in "downtown Corvallis." A 35-acre farm was purchased in 1870 for a new college campus west of town. The first building, Benton Hall, was completed in 1888.

In the beginning, the curriculum was typical of the colleges of the period. There was a classical course leading to the Bachelor of Arts degree and a scientific course leading to the Bachelor of Science.

Agriculture was added in 1869 under the impetus of the Land Grant Act. Commerce, household economy and engineering courses came soon too and in 1908, four professional schools were established: Agriculture, Commerce, Engineering, and Home Economics.

With 16,500 students now, Oregon State offers a complete university curriculum. The College of Science and the College of Liberal Arts are the largest academic units. Schools include Agriculture, Business and Technology, Education, Engineering, Forestry, Home Economics, Oceanography, Pharmacy, and a Division of Health and Physical Education.

OSU's 400-acre, tree-lined campus now has about 100 buildings and research laboratories. Classroom buildings, the library, and student activity areas are located in the center. Residence halls and research areas are on the edges.

In September 1971, Oregon State was designated by the U.S. Commerce Department as one of the nation's first four Sea Grant colleges as well. As such, it is charged with leadership in the wise development of marine resources.

Oregon State's ocean research vessels (four) are docked at Newport on the Oregon Coast, just 55 miles from the campus. The university's Marine Science Center there has become one of the top tourist attractions in the Northwest.

DEE ANDROS

Director of Athletics

"The Great Pumpkin" started a new "Era" at Oregon State University when he announced he was resigning as the Beavers' head football coach following the 1975 season. Shortly after his resignation as football coach, Dee was named as Director of Athletics, succeeding Jim Barratt to become the eighth Athletic Director in OSU history.

Dee's decision to give up the OSU football reigns ended a happy and successful 25 years as a grid coach, the final 14 as a head coach.

Dee's athletic career began back in Oklahoma City, Okla., where he was born October 17, 1924. Dee played four years of prep football at Central High School in Oklahoma City, plus he also earned an additional two letters in wrestling. After graduating from Oklahoma City High School in 1942, Dee entered the Marine Corps and served in the Marines from 1942-46 through the duration of World War II and was decorated with a Bronze Star in the battle of Iwo Jima for heroic achievement. Dee was a sergeant in the Marines at the time of his discharge.

Following his discharge in the Marines, Dee entered University of Oklahoma where he played football for four years, the first year under the late Jim Tatum and the Sooners went to the Gator Bowl that year. The next three years were under Bub Wilkinson and twice the Sooners reached the Sugar Bowl. Dee graduated from Oklahoma in 1950. It was at Oklahoma that he met and married his lovely wife Luella. Demosthenes Konstandies Andrecopoulos (Dee's full name) was married to the former Luella Thomas on January, 1949.

Following his graduation from Oklahoma, Dee immediately launched his very successful coaching career. He started out as an assistant under Wilkinson on the Oklahoma staff for three years (1050-52). In 1953, Dee served as line coach at Kansas and then moved on to Texas Tech in 1954-55. He joined Pete Elliott as an assistant at Nebraska in 1956 and followed Elliott to California for three more years (1957-59). He also followed Elliott to Illinois for two more years (1960-61) before gaining his first head job, University of Idaho in 1962.

While Dee was serving as an assistant, Texas Tech went to the Sun Bowl and California to the Rose Bowl in 1959.

Dee spent three years at Idaho where he compiled a 11-16-1 record.

Dee was named head coach at OSU, following the departure of Tommy Prothro to UCLA, in 1965. Since Dee arrived at Oregon State, few coaches have ever enjoyed the national attention that has been bestowed on the "Great Pumpkin". Under Dee's leadership, the Beavers were runner-up in the tough Pacific-8 Conference four times.

Perhaps Dee's most famous season was in 1967, a team that was called the "Giant Killers". That year, OSU defeated then No. 2 ranked Purdue on the road and two weeks later tied No. 2 ranked UCLA in Los Angeles, which prompted Dee to say, "I'm tired of playing these No. 2 teams, bring on No. 1". His Beavers than proceeded to defeat the No. 1 ranked USC Trojans, led by O. J. Simpson, the next week in Corvallis, 3-0.

Dee's brilliant coaching career has brought him many honors and much acclaim. He has served as a coach in three different post-season all-star games, the Hula Bowl, the Coaches All-America Bowl and the East-West Shrine Game.

Some of Dee's teammates at Oklahoma included Jim Owens, ex-Washington coach; Darrell Royal, Texas; Bert Clark, ex-Washington State coach; and Jack Mitchell, ex-Kansas coach.

Dee got his famous "Great Pumpkin" nickname from a veteran Northwest sports writer, Harry Missildine, Sports Editor of the Spokesman-Review in Spokane, Wash. Harry noticed that Dee was always dressed in orange while near the gridiron, and for that matter most everywhere else he travels, thus the "Great Pumpkin" nickname.

Dee as a football coach, and even more now as an athletic director, is in constant demand as a speaker and tries to fill as many speaking engagements as possible.

Dee and Luella have one daughter, Jeanna, 20.



DR. ROBERT W. MACVICAR

President

Dr. Robert MacVicar, a national educational and scientific leader, has been president since July 1, 1970, of Oregon State University, Oregon's oldest public institution of higher learning.

He came to Oregon State from Southern Illinois University where he had served first as vice president for academic affairs and then as chancellor.

Earlier, MacVicar had been on the faculty of Oklahoma State University as professor of chemistry, dean of the graduate school, and vice president of academic affairs.

Born September 28, 1918, MacVicar received his bachelor's degree from the University of Wyoming; his master's degree in chemistry from Oklahoma State; and his doctor's degree in biochemistry from the University of Wisconsin.

When MacVicar was graduated with highest honors from the University of Wyoming in 1939, he was chosen to be a Rhodes Scholar. He was unable to go to England for the special advanced work, however, because of the start of World War II in Europe and his own military service as an officer in the Food and Nutrition Division, U.S. Army Sanitary Corps.

President MacVicar is currently serving as a member of the American Council on Education's new Commission on Leadership Development in Higher Education. He has been on the Council of the Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges; consultant to the U.S. Office of Education, 1956-70; consultant to the Atomic Energy Commission, 1958-69; and was a member of the Educational Advisory Committee of the National Science Foundation, 1957-69.

He also was a founding member of the board of the Central Educational Midwest Research Laboratory, St. Louis; Mo., and chairman of the Laboratory executive committee for three years.

In April 1972, he was one of seven representatives of government and higher education named to a policy-level steering committee to guide a nationwide program for higher education information exchange. The program is directed by the National Center for Higher Education Management Systems.

In 1971, MacVicar was named to the Oregon committee for selection of Rhodes Scholars. He is a member of the nation's two major academic honor societies — Phi Kappa Phi and Phi Beta Kappa — and the national research honorary, Sigma Xi. He is author of some 135 papers, reports and articles.

MacVicar's professional memberships include the American Society of Biological Chemists, American Chemical Society, American Institute of Nutrition, Nutrition Society of Great Britain, and the Society for Experimental Biology and Medicine.

McVicar Active President

Since he became Oregon State University's 14th president in 1970, Dr. Robert MacVicar has become noted in the Northwest for his tremendous energy, long work days, and his ability to communicate with people — students, parents, legislators, business men, senior citizens.

Breakfasts for him are times for meetings. Evenings are for speaking engagements, meetings and conferences, teaching a class at the university on trends in higher education, and for inviting students into his home for informal talks and for listening to their points of view.

In 1972, the university president moved into a resident hall for part of a week to better appreciate student needs and wishes concerning their college programs. On a continuing basis, he and the student body president hold regular question-and-answer sessions on campus for anyone who has something to say or ask.


During the first year in Oregon, MacVicar traveled more than 30,000 miles to become acquainted with the people, resources and needs of the state. His pace hasn't slackened since then. He has visited every part of the state and spoken in almost every community.

His voice has become one of the best known and most heeded in the Northwest on educational, scientific, and research programs and problems.

Mrs. MacVicar is an educator too as well as a homemaker. She holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Oklahoma State University and met her husband while both were professors there. They were married in 1948. Mrs. MacVicar also taught for two years in Boston at a day care center and did a year's advanced work at Child Education Foundation in New York City.

The MacVicars have two children.

PAUL VALENTI



Paul Valenti graduated from Tamalpias High School in Mill Valley, Calif., in 1938 and that fall enrolled at Oregon State University. Except for time out for World War II and service in the Navy (1942-45), Paul has been a member of the OSU family ever since, first as a player, then as a coach and administrator.

Paul played four years of basketball at OSU, earning three letters under legendary Slats Gill and playing on two Northern Division championship teams, 1940 and 1942. Following his stint in the Navy for World War II, Paul returned to Corvallis and joined his old coach, Slats, as an assistant, a capacity he served until 1965 when Slats retired as an active coach to become athletic director.

Paul was the logical man to take over the OSU basketball post when Slats retired and he did an outstanding job for six seasons as the Beavers' head coach. His six-year record found Valenti's teams winning 85 and losing 74 and his 1966 team captured the Pacific-8 championship, the last team to wrestle the title away from UCLA.

Jim Jarvis, Loy Petersen, Charlie White, Freddie Boyd and Ed Fredenburg were some of the outstanding players to perform under Valenti during his tenure as Beaver basketball coach.

After relinquishing his head basketball position, Paul was named Assistant Athletic Director and tennis coach. He was OSU's tennis coach for six years before the sport was discontinued at OSU following the 1975 season.



Born 9/10/20 in San Francisco, Ca., Paul and his wife Francine have two daughters, Jo Ann, 28; and Victoria, 26.








JERRY WARD, Business Manager — Jerry, 43, joined the OSU staff on October 1, 1976, as interim athletic business manager, replacing Comm Henness, and was appointed the department business manager January 1, 1977. Jerry is a retired Lieutenant Colonel in the United States Army, having spent 20 years of service, including overseas duty in Panama, Viet Nam and Thialand. He was decorated with the Bronze Star and the Legion of Merit during his Viet Nam tour of duty. He is a 1952 graduate of Corvallis High School where he lettered in basketball and baseball. After attending Oregon State for two years, Jerry graduated from the University of Texas in 1956 and has a Master's degree in Business Administration from OSU. Prior to joining the athletic department staff, Jerry had spent five years as director of instruction in the OSU ROTC program. JACK RAINEY, Administrative Assistant Jack is currently in his eighth year at OSU and serves as an Administrative Assistant to Dee Andros, in addition to his academic counselor duties. Jack graduated from high school in Jerome, Idaho, and served one year in the U.S. Marine Corps prior to enrolling at the University of Idaho, where he earned his B.S. and M.S. degrees in Education. He was a teacher and coach at Filler High, Idaho (1949-50), Weiser High, Idaho (1950-55), LaGrande High, Oregon 1955-63) and Albany High, Oregon (1963-69) pefore coming to OSU in 1969 as a graduate assistant in the School of Physical Education. He was later named assistant baseball and basketball coach and eventually became academic coordinator. Born 5/3/27 in Venture, Ca., Jack and his wife Clarice have three children, Christy, 25; Kyle, 23; and Reed, 15.





JOHN EGGERS, Sports Information Director -John is in his 28th year on the OSU staff: John joined the OSU staff on July 1, 1950, as an assistant to director Irwin Harris, and was moved up to the SID position on July 1, 1952. Eggers was born and raised in Pendleton, the "Round-Up City" of eastern Oregon. He was an all-state basketball player at Pendleton High, a prep teammate of Lew Beck who later went on to win All-America fame at OSU and play in the Olympic Games. Eggers played one varsity basketball season at Willamette while only a freshman before enlisting in the Navy for World War II. After discharge, he attended OSU from the fall of 1946 through 1949. Before returning to the OSU staff, he worked for one year as a sports writer on the Oregonian in Portland. John and his wife Jean have three sons, Kerry, 24; Brent, 21; and Tom, 16.



SCOTT JOHNSON, Assistant Sports Information Director - The newest member of the Oregon State University staff, Johnson assumed his duties on August 9, 1976. OSU General Outlook, 1978

Oregon State's 1978 track and field team conceivably could be the strongest in the last four or five years according to Steve Simmons.

The Beavers figure to be strong in the sprints, in the jump events and in the intermediate hurdles, along with the decathlon. Most glaring weaknesses appear to be in the middle distances, the longer distances and the weights events. There's just not enough depth in the latter spots.

Simmons lost some top-flight individuals, among them 400-meter ace Curtis Byrd. On the returning letterman list are Bruce Alexander, pole vault; Gary Barnes, 400 and relays; Bill Delatorre, middle distances; John Edwards, high jump; Andrew Fields, 400; Scott Fisher, pole vault; Tim Fox, discus; Jerry Grant, javelin; Jack Groth, 800; Jerry Jordan, sprints; Dwayne Hall, sprints; Rick Kumm, middle distances; Bengt Larsson, decathlon; Zach Marsh, sprints; John Okoro, jumps; Bruce Smith, jumps; Ken Spearing, hurdles; and Gary Susac, hurdles.

Probably the brightest star on the roster in Jordan, who placed second in the 200 meters at the Pacific-8 conference championships and fourth in the NCAA meet. Jordan has best marks of 20.59 in the 200 and 10.4 in the 100.

The Beavers have a pair of athletes who won Pac-8 crowns two years ago, but cut down by injuries last year. Fisher cleared 17-¼ two years ago, and Okoro has a best of 26-1 in the long jump. In the long jump, there is also versatile Bruce Smith with a best of 25-7.

John Edwards tied for second in the high jump at the Pac-8 with a leap of 6-10 and is capable of reaching the 7-foot barrier, Simmons feels. Jordan is best of the sprinters, of course, but he has additional help from Hall, Barnes, Marsh and Fields.

Larsson, the decathlon ace, was fourth at the NCAA in 1977 with 7,165 points. Susac has a best of 51.26 in the 400 intermediate hurdles and placed 6th at the Pac-8 meet a year ago.

HEAD TRACK COACH STEVE SIMMONS

A man with a highly-successful background in track - both as a participant and as a coach - is now in his third season as head man for the Beavers.

He's Steve Simmons, regarded as highly-personable by all and well-liked by the young men he coaches.

Simmons came to Oregon State from Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo, where he compiled an excellent record for five years. But he didn't begin his athletic career in California. He attended high school are Roosevelt High School in Dayton, Ohio, and later moved west to Los Angeles City College where he graduated in June of 1963. He was at Chapman College in Orange from 1963-65 and gained another degree in 1965. He was an all-conference basketball player at L. A. City College and a 1965 NCAA Division II All-American high hurdler at Chapman.

Simmons has served as a triple jump coach at three U. S. Olympic specialized training camps in 1971, 1975 and 1976. Well known on an international basis, as well, he has served as a visiting coach and conducted clinics in Brazil, Kenya, the Ivory Coast, Denmark, Nigeria, and many other far-away places.

Simmons has been extremely active in International track. He was an assistant on the U.S. first World Cup team. He was selected to the Amateur Athletic Union's International Committee. Steve also coached the U.S. 400 meter relay team that set new world records at the World Cup meet.

Simmons' record at Cal Poly from 1970 through 1975 was superb. He coached 40 NCAA All-Americans and five national champions. He coached athletes who set or tied 52 indoor and outdoor records. Track fans will recognize some of the "name" performers he has coached, among they Reynaldo Brown, Curtis Boyd, Clancy Edwards, Ken Haagen, Dave Hamer and Mohinder Gill.

Unfortunately, the 1977 OSU squad experienced many, many injuries and it hurt the won and lost department.

As one of America's top jump coaches, in his seven years as a head coach, his athletes have scored $97\,\%$ points in jumping events in NCAA competition. A man of many dimensions, he has coached NCAA Division I and II All-American athletes in 11 different events.

DEAN CLARK

Assistant Coach

In his third year of coaching at OSU, Dean Clark is a graduate of Tigard High School, class of 1970, when he placed second in the two-mile in the state championships. He clocked the fastest time in the state that year, also placed third in the state cross-country championships. Moving on to Washington State University, he compiled an excellent record there. He was a four-year letterman in track and cross-country, obtaining his B.A. degree in 1975. In 1973, he earned All-America horrors in the steeplechase in the NCAA meet. His best marks were 4:06 (mile), 8:43.0 (steeplechase), and 13:30 (three mile). Clark has handled the cross-country team at OSU the past two years.

Track Profiles

JERRY JORDAN, sprinter: 6-0, 175, senior from Oakland, CA. Top scorer on the 1977 OSU team in his first year with the Beavers (78½ points). Placed second in the 200 meters at the Pacific-8 conference meet, and was fourth at the NCAA. His best mark was 20.59. Jordan trasferred to OSU from Alameda JC last year. His best 100 yard time was 9.4. Coach Steve Simmons rates Jerry as the best OSU sprint prospect since Willie Turner, the 1968 NCAA champion.

SCOTT FISHER, pole vault: 5-9, 165, junior from Medford, OR. Was Pacific-8 conference champion two years ago at 17-¼, but laid out last year because of injuries. Set eight meet records at Medford High School and was on the Journal all-state team. Had prep best of 15-3½, and 16-6 as a freshman at OSU. If he can stay healthy, could be one of the best.

BRUCE SMITH, jumps: 6-4½, 190, senior from Ventura, CA. Could be the surprise of the year, if he fulfills prediction of coaches, who predict he will break the 26 foot level this spring. Has best mark of 25-7 in long jump and 6-9 in high jump. Also played some basketball, scored 60 points in JV game.

BENGT LARSSON, decathlon: 6-2, 180, junior from Olsater, Sweden. Returns in 1978 after having been injured in the 1977 season. In 1976 was third at the Pac-8 meet and took a fourth place at the NCAA championships. A hard worker, he hopes to better his top mark of 7165 points.

KASHEEF HASSAN, 400: 5-9, 150, freshman from Khartoum, Sudan. Generally considered to be the finest quarter mile prospect ever to enroll at OSU. Kasheef has "bests" of 21.7 and 46.4. Was member of Sudan's Olympic squad in 1976. He is an engineering major at Oregon State. Will run both 400 and 800.

RICK KUMM, distances: 6-2, 155, sophomore from Salem. Has bests of 4:06.4 and 1:50.5, and he hopes to better those this spring. Last year he was hampered by a knee injury. At Sprague High in Salem, was 880 and mile champion. Coach Simmons predicts a bright future for him, good start this spring.

<code>JOHN OKORO, jumps:</code> 6-1½, 180, senior from Benin City, Nigeria. Was Pacific-8 long jump champion two years ago at 25-2¼, but was hobbled by injuries through the entire 1977 campaign. Was member of Nigerian Olympic team. Has bests of 26-¼ and 51-7. A good student and popular on campus.

GARY SUSAC, hurdles: 6-1, 175, senior from Bend. He was a walk-on transfer from University of Portland last year and did fine job, placing 6th at the Pac-8 meet and setting a new school record of 51.26 for the 400, meter intermediate hurdles. Coaches feel he can be one of the best in the Pac-8.

GARY BARNES, 400 and relays: 5-11, 165, senior from Eagle Point, OR. Will be one of the busiest Beavers this spring. In 1977, he ran on both the relay teams and in the 400 and 200. Should improve his best marks of 47.8 and 21.7. Was 440 state AAA titlist as prepper and an Oregon JC champ at Lane CC.

DAN FULTON, distances: 5-9, 150, junior from Benson Tech of Portland. Returns to OSU after a year at Spokane Community College. In 1976, as an OSU freshman, Dan ran a 4:05.8 and 13:47 for three miles. Coach Simmons refers to him as a "top competitor". Was a state prep champion prior to college.

JOHN EDWARDS, high jump: 6-5, 190, senior from Eugene. Tied for second at the Pac-8 meet in 1977 and had a season's best of $6\text{-}10\,\%$. A tireless worker who has improved his jumping from 6-6 prep mark. Has picked up valuable points when Beavers needed them. Will be shooting at the 7-foot level.

HAROLD TURNER, hurdles: 6-2½, 180, junior college transfer from Sierra College in California. He has not had a full season of hurdling since his senior year at Kennedy High because of injuries. He is expected to get under 14.0 this season and in time might even reach the area for a school record.

ZACH MARSH, sprints, relays: 5-8, 150, junior from Oxnard, CA. One of the most steady performers on the OSU team. Runs both sprints and leads off the 400 relay contingent. First came to OSU with a 9.6 best. Leg ailment hampered him last year, although he did compete. Is married, his wife is OSU student.

KAWIKA DOWSETT, pole vault: 5-10, 170, sophomore from Honolulu, Hawaii. Returning to OSU after a year's absence. Looks now as though he could give OSU some important depth in pole vault, along with Scott Fisher. He should be consistently over 16 foot this spring. Was state prep champ in Hawaii.

JOEL JOHNSON, decathlon: 6-1, 175, junior transfer from Lane Community College in Eugene. Was national JC decathlon champion in 1977, scoring 6825 points. Is rated good prospect for coming Pac-8 season. Also will run the hurdles for the Beavers. His wife is student at OSU.

TOM SCHILLINGER, weights: 6-1, 260, sophomore from Burns, OR. Fine all-around athlete. As prepper, was state heavyweight wrestling champion and last fall was a superb football linebacker for the Beavers. Has best marks of 55-7 in shotput and 177-9 in the discus.

MARK RADFORD, jumps: 6-3½, 185, freshman from Parkrose High School of Portland. A fine athlete who was a starter on the 1978 Oregon State basketball team. Has cleared 6-8 in the high jump, and has a best of 45-0 in the triple jump. Coach Simmons believes he someday will best 7-0 and is capable of 50-0.

KEVIN MESSENGER, shot put: 6-2, 250, freshman from Highlands, CA. Was runner-up in the California state high school championships, with a season's best mark of 64-2 and 167 in the discus. He was a lineman on the OSU football team. One of the few two-sport athletes for the Beavers.

KIT REDMAN, decathlon: 6-0, 180, freshman from Eugene (South Eugene High). He also will compete in the hurdles for OSU. Has strong prep marks, and according to Coach Simmons, has the size and strength to insure success. Needs more work in the jumping events.
