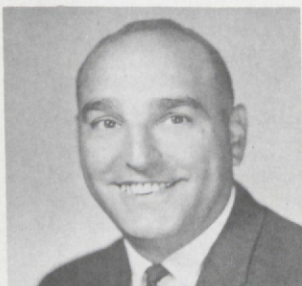

Know Your Coaches . . .

Gene Tanselli, baseball — Native of Portland, Ore., where he attended high school at Jefferson high, finishing in 1947. An All-American prep shortstop. Enrolled at OSU in fall of 1947 and starred on OSU varsity in 1949-50-51. Was team captain final year and won all-Western Regional NCAA honors. Following graduation in 1951, played pro baseball with Portland Beavers and San Diego Padres of Pacific Coast league, Tulsa of Texas league and Salem Senators of old Western International league. Later coached at Franklin high in Portland two years and at Clark JC in Vancouver, Wash., four years before returning to OSU as assistant coach and member of the P.E. department. Has been back at OSU since 1962, but became head baseball coach in time for 1967 season, when his Beavers compiled fine 25-13 mark. Last year OSU was 23-13-1. He succeeded Ralph Coleman who had coached at OSU for 36 seasons.

Edgar Larson, golf — Born in Tacoma, Wash., and graduated from Stadium high school in that city in 1953. Was member of the golf team at Stadium and also at Pacific Lutheran University where he graduated in 1957. Went to Luther Theological Seminary in St. Paul, Minn., and graduated in 1961. Was at Colorado State U. as Lutheran Campus Pastor, 1961-1963, and has been at OSU since 1963 as Lutheran Campus Pastor. Assigned post as head golf coach three years ago. Led team to northern division title in 1967, plus third place Pacific-8 finish.

Don Megale, tennis — Is on sabbatical leave this year, the team being coached by Alberto Olmedo, one of Megale's brightest stars. Megale hails from Coos Bay, Ore., where he played both basketball and tennis. Was No. 1 man at OSU for two years, graduating in 1952. Coached Klamath Falls to state championship in both basketball and tennis, prior to returning to OSU P.E. staff. Under his guidance, Beavers have swept two northern division crowns.

Karl Drlica, crew — Has been crew coach at Oregon State since 1950, although up until last year the program was not under Intercollegiate Athletics. It was under jurisdiction of the Recreation program. Drlica was born in Juneau, Alaska, but moved to Portland when a youth, and graduated from Benson high school. He is a 1940 graduate of OSU, and from 1946 to 1950 held a civilian position with the U.S. Military government in Japan. Drlica also holds a master's degree from OSU.

BARNES, Lute — Senior, top glove man with a great arm. Must double plays from all positions. Right-handed hitter, but hits to all fields with excellent speed. Led the 1968 team with a .340 batting average. Was named outstanding Amateur baseball player in U.S. last summer.

BEALL, Bob — Junior, regular third baseman last year. Left-handed power hitter with good speed. Also able to relieve on the mound.

BENSON, Cleve — Senior, powerful right arm, should be the work-horse of the 1969 mound staff. Excellent curve ball.

CROW, Steve — Senior, two-year letterman, second baseman makes the pivot well. After a great Sophomore year his batting average fell. Looking for an outstanding season. Above average speed and a fine arm.

GOODELL, Ryan — Junior, catcher with a good strong arm, hits the ball well to all fields. Could give Senior catcher, Tim Gleason, a fight for the catching position.

JOHNSON, Jerry — Junior, left-hander with great potential; strong throwing arm with a great curve. Needs confidence, a good pro prospect.

LEE, Terry — Senior, sinker ball pitcher with good control used mainly in relief.

RICH, Larry — Fleet center-fielder who can hit with excellent power and fine speed.

WILSON, Lloyd — Up from the freshman squad, left-handed pitcher with definite potential — best pitch is a curve ball.

LEBECK, Greg — Just out of the service after a freshman year at Oregon State, has a fine curve ball and excellent control. Could be a dark horse of the pitching staff.

SHOUP, Tom — Junior, utility man on 1968 ball club, could move into the 3rd base position. Switch hitter—great hustler.

PERRY, Tony — All-American junior college transfer from Treasure Valley Community College. Possesses fine tools — experience needed.

JOHNSON, Chris — Reserve out-fielder who should move up to regular left-field position. Has power to all fields and strong throwing arm.

WEIDE, Karl — Returning after two years in the service, 6-6 Senior first-baseman with power to all fields. Also doubles as a pitcher.
