WATCH THESE BEAVERS

Ken is the Beavers top returning pitcher this year . . . last year he finished with a 9-6 record and a fine 2.83 ERA . . . he currently ranks second on the OSU all-time win-loss record with 24 wins to his credit . . . he trails only Cecil Ira's (1961-63) 27 win total . . . Ken has exceptional control of his pitches as evidenced by only 14 walks last year in 95 innings . . . career-wise, Ken has walked only 48 in 266 innings pitched . . . he has a career ERA of 2.32 which ranks him 5th on the OSU list going into this season . . . last year in 12 starts, Ken finished five games and had one shutout . . . this year, he will be counted upon heavily for experience and a steady performance as a third year starter . . . he has recorded one-hit shutout in his career . . . he had a phenomenal 0.45 ERA his senior year at Philomath High School while claiming all-league honors in both baseball and basketball . . . Ken was named to the Pacific-8 Northern Division all-conference team two years ago . . . he was a 4-year letterman in baseball and won three in both football and basketball . . . he was a starting pitcher for the Alaska Valley Green Giants and Alaska Fairbanks Goldpanners the past two summers . . . born 4-10-56.

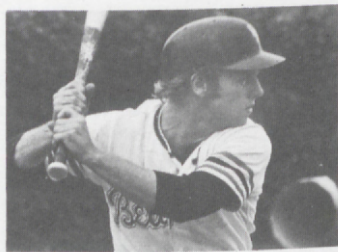


KEN NOBLE, 6-4, 214, Sr., Pitcher

Considered to be the Beavers steadiest outfielder, Jerry returns as a leading candidate for post-season honors . . . last season was a big year for Jerry as he hovered near the .300 mark all season but settled for a .287 batting mark . . . was third on the team in hits behind a couple of All-Coast choices in Pete Rowe and Jeff Doyle, both playing pro ball now . . . was the Beavers number two hitter in the lineup most of last year but may be ticketed for the leadoff spot this season as he has added speed and a year's experience . . . had six doubles and three triples his sophomore season last year . . . had 30 rbi's to go with 30 runs scored . . . coaches feel he has improved over last season where he played flawless ball defensively . . . covers centerfield very well while getting a good jump on the ball . . . a former 3-time all-leaguer at Corvallis High School, his prep team was 60-30 during his career there . . . played in the State-Metro All-Star Series his senior year and won the MVP award for the Series . . . had big games against Arizona State going 3-5 and tore up University of Oregon pitching in two games as he went 3-3 with two rbi's and 4-6 with three rbi's . . . born 11-25-56.

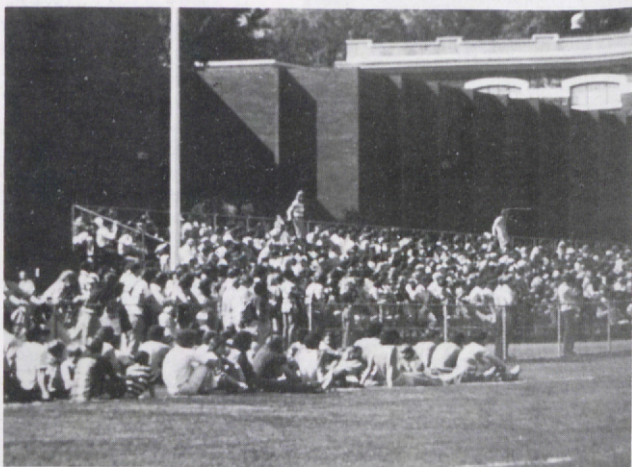

COLEMAN FIELD

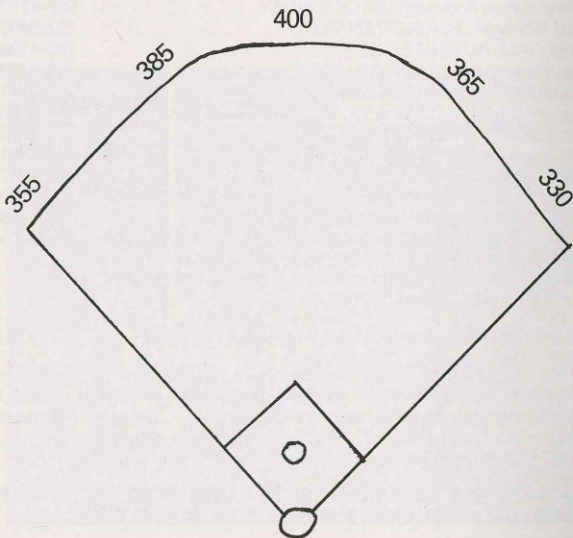
All of Oregon State's home baseball games are played at Coleman Field, located on Washington Way next to Dixon Recreation Center on the OSU campus. Coleman Field has a seating capacity of 3,000 permanent bleachers. The playing field itself has long been recognized as one of the best in collegiate baseball. The field is surrounded by a six foot fence while the distances are 355 to left field, 400 to center field and 330 down the right field line. It is 385 to left-center and 365 to right-center. Coleman Field is not lighted.

COLEMAN FIELD PRESS BOX

The Coleman Field press box is located behind home plate and has a capacity of six working press members, plus two radio originations. COLEMAN FIELD

Jack Riley

Head Baseball Coach



Jack Riley has been the Beavers' head baseball coach the past five years and has been quite successful in posting a 123-83 win-loss record while leading Oregon State to one Pacific-8 conference Northern Division co-championship two years ago and two consecutive runnerup spots. Each of those three years, OSU has produced outstanding records going 28-10 in 1975, 31-15 in 1976, and 31-17 last year. The 31 wins included an excellent 18-1 record at home in 1975 at Coleman Field. Last year the Beavers were 13-3 at home.

He attended Grant High School in Portland and gained All-State honors in basketball and was the second leading scorer in the state his senior year. Riley is a 1960 graduate of Linfield College where he became the first player in history at that school to be named to the Northwest conference All-Star team four straight years. He also was named to four All-American teams while at Linfield. He holds the all-time scoring record at Linfield with 2,166 points in basketball while he also earned three all-conference awards in baseball and as a senior led the NAIA in stolen bases. Following his graduation, he was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers and played with the Salem Dodgers from 1961-1963.

Riley has a wide coaching background which began at Portland's Jefferson High School. He was assistant baseball and assistant basketball coach from 1960-1962. Then he was named head basketball coach and took his teams to third and fourth place finishes at the State AAA Tournament.

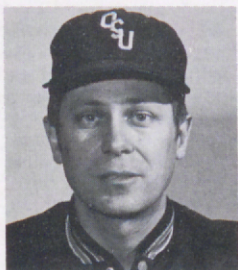
From Jefferson he undertook the head baseball and basketball duties at Lower Columbia College in Longview, Washington while also taking over the athletic directorship. During his tenure at LC, his baseball teams won four straight Coastal Division championships while sweeping the state title in 1970. He also had finishes of second, third and fourth in the state. Overall, his baseball record was 97-31 at Lower Columbia.

Upon arriving at Oregon State, Riley inherited a young and splintered program and in just two years turned it around to one of the most successful and dedicated ones in the country. The last three years of 28-10 (13-5 in conference action), 31-15 (12-6 in league), and last year's 31-17 mark and 12-6 conference finish give evidence to it. The program entails practicing year round, whether it be outside or in what is commonly called "Riley's Refinery", the McAlexander Fieldhouse.

He holds a masters degree from OSU in 1971. Jack and his wife Jean have two sons, Mike (18), and Mickey (16), and one daughter, Pam, who is 14.

Del Kerber

Assistant Baseball Coach



Del Kerber is in his third year at Oregon State University as assistant baseball coach in charge of handling the pitchers. Originally from Salem, he is a graduate of Oregon State, with a B.S. degree in Physical Education in 1964. He followed that with his masters degree at OSU in 1967.

Before joining the OSU staff, Kerber was one of Oregon's most successful high school coaches in the state coaching at Dallas High School from 1965 through 1970. His teams claimed one league championship along with two second place finishes and three third place finishes.

From Dallas, Kerber came to OSU and coached the junior varsity program from 1970-71. He also coached at Grants Pass High School from 1971-1975. Two summers ago, he took the Oregon State stocked City Beaver Portland summer league team to the city championship and produced an excellent 25-13 overall record. They finished fifth in the state playoffs. Last summer, they won the championship again, posting a 22-8 record.

Kerber was a four-sport letterman for three years at Serra High School in Salem from 1955-59. He is single.

MIKE PAUL

Assistant Varsity Coach



Mike Paul is in his first year as a varsity assistant coach helping head coach Jack Riley with the pitching staff this year. Mike is a recent graduate of the Beaver program where he was a starting pitcher last year for OSU. He recorded a 4-1 record completing four of six starts last year with a 2.50 ERA. Two years ago, Mike led the City Beavers summer team in Portland to the city championship with a 7-1 mark and an impressive 1.72 ERA. He is a former preppeur from

Portland's Jackson High School, where he lettered three years in both baseball and football and also basketball while being named to the all-city team and honorable mention all-state squad. He was born 12-22-54.

SCOTT TUBBS

JV Baseball Coach



Scott Tubbs will serve as the JV baseball coach for the Beavers this year. He is a former Rapid City, South Dakota preppeur in high school where he earned four baseball letters and two football letters at Stevens High School. His team went 65-9 his senior year while his American Legion team has won seven straight state titles in the Midwest state. He is a former second baseman who is working toward his degree at Oregon State, majoring in religious studies. He

will also help with the varsity program. Scott was born 7-8-56 in Frankfurt, Germany.

Tom is currently in his fourth year as Oregon State's varsity baseball manager. A former three-sport athlete at Central Linn High School in Halsey, Oregon, Tom is also an excellent student. 1978 Baseball Outlook

Oregon State is coming off of another excellent season which saw Jack Riley's team produce a 31-17 season record and a runnerup spot in the Pacific-8 Northern Division with a 12-6 mark. Included in that mark was an excellent 13-3 home record at Coleman Field. Beavers have been tough at home with an outstanding 31-4 mark the last two years.

With the loss of key players such as infielder Jeff Doyle, who broke no less than five single season OSU records while also tying two single season marks, Pete Rowe, who set new OSU career marks in at bats, runs, hits, doubles and rbi's, Rich Dodge, the OSU career homerun leader and pitchers Scott Anderson and Tom Chamberlain, the Beavers would give the impression they are on a rebuilding season. But that is not entirely true. Riley feels that he has a fine nucleus returning along with probably the finest recruiting class he has ever had at OSU. Mix that with a greater contribution out of some veterans and you have another in a line of big winning seasons that have become synonymous with Oregon State baseball under Jack Riley.

The Beavers still figure to be an improved team with team speed, defense and base-running skills the biggest improvement. Pitching will be a big key for the Beavers as Ken Noble, 9-6 with a 2.83 ERA, returns to lead the starters along with Pat Barry, who was 4-4 and a team-leading 2.11 ERA. Newcomers will have to fill the gaps in the starting rotation. Those of note will be freshmen Eric Sallee and Tim Crowover along with junior college transfer Bob Flynn, who led his team to the California JC title last year at Diablo Valley. In the bullpen, OSU will have veteran lefthander Bruce Plato (2-1, 2.42 ERA) returning.

Hitting, especially the possible lack of power, will be a question mark for OSU this year. With Dodge, Rowe and Doyle since departed, the Beavers will need to replace it with inexperience. First baseman Rick Gonzalez returns as the leading rbi man with three homeruns and 33 rbi's last year. Second base will be handled by slick fielding Mike Gianotti while at shortstop, freshman Dave Backen seems to have the inside track. Third base is still a question area with freshman Pat Shaw, letterman Jerry Yung and Mike Rowe battling for starting berths.

The outfield will have veterans Jerry Miller (.287), Gary Richter (.298), Steve Rudolph (.275) and Dave Simmons (.333) returning. Freshman Mike Hearing could press for a starting berth due to his excellent defensive skills.

Riley feels that catcher Rich Harper could be a key for the Beavers this year. He is counting him for strong leadership and catching, something the Beavers have had in Pete Rowe in the past.

OSU will be in another dogfight with Washington State for the Pacific-8 Northern Division title again this year. The Cougars lost heavily due to graduation and the draft, as did the Beavers, so another close race is predicted. Vastly improved Washington could enter the picture while Oregon is rebounding also to give the league perhaps its best balance in some time.
