Oregon State University is Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher learning, dating back to October 27, 1868. It was established as one of the nation's land grant colleges, receiving federal land grants to

help launch its public education-service program.

On September 7, 1971, OSU was designated as one of the nation's first four Sea Grant Colleges, charged to help advance man's wise and orderly use of ocean resources and to provide teaching and research programs related to marine sciences. The Oregon State University Marine Science Center at Newport has become OSU's important "Campus on the Coast." The 177-foot, all weather Wecoma and smaller research vessels operate from there in studying the ocean, estuaries and rivers.

From an initial graduating class of three in 1870, OSU has grown to the point that it now confers about 3,500 degrees each June. Student enrollment during the regular school year is about 16,500; summer term

enrollment now tops 5,000.

The main campus covers nearly 500 acres on which there are 100 major buildings. Experimental farms, an arboretum and teaching-research forests, all located within just a few minutes drive of the campus, make up an additional 18,000 acres.

Oregon State provides the research base for Oregon's two largest industries, forestry and agriculture. In addition to university research facilities and forests, a federal Forest Science Laboratory is located on campus. The Agricultural Experiment Station operates a number of branch stations throughout Oregon for work on specialized, regional problems. Coastal research units, in addition to the Marine Science Center, are the Seafoods Laboratory at Astoria and a fisheries culture station at Netarts

Bay.

Water, key to the future, is getting special attention, including work in water resource management, water quality and reuse, pollution control, oceanography, fisheries and irrigation. One of the three major National Environmental Research Centers operated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is located on campus, and considerable cooperative research is underway. Important additions to the research and training facilities of the Northwest are the OSU Radiation Center, Computer Center, Environmental Health Sciences Center, Air Resources Center and the International Plant Center. Other research units include the Engineering Experiment Station, and the Genetics, Nutrition, Science, Water Resources and Nuclear Science and Engineering Research Institutions. The State Fish and Wildlife Commission's Research Division is headquartered at OSU.

Oregon State University is "extended" into every one of Oregon's 36 counties through the Extension Service. Extension agents in each county help interpret, adapt and disseminate research findings for practical use and assist in such programs as human and natural resources development. The 4-H Club program, which enrolls approximately 50,000 young Oregonians annually, is a part of the OSU Extension Service. The 4-H program is open to all Oregon youth, ages 9-19.

#### 1990-91 OSU SWIMMING OUTLOOK

As good as the Oregon State women's swim team was during the 1989-90 season, the Beavers are looking to improve in 1990-91. OSU has currently a second in the Halloween Invitational, a fourth in the Husky Relay Meet in Seattle, and is 1-1 in dual meets.

Oregon State was 6-2 in dual meets last year and set 15 school records, 14 in the Pacific-10 Conference Championships. Seven different swimmers on this year's squad were involved in record swims last season.

"Our women competed very strongly last year and beating University of Puget Sound, two-time defending NAIA Champions, was a big step for us," said second-year Beaver coach Julie Saunders. "We also pressed the University of Washington and were actually ahead of them for two days at the Pac-10 meet, which is something we had never been able to do. In the third day of the Pac-10 meet, UW swam extremely well and we kind of sputtered out, which was very unfortunate for us because we had an excellent chance of beating them. I feel we have a much stronger team than last year with the combination of our returning swimmers and the incoming women. We definately have a team that is going to surprise a lot of people this year."

Three swimmers on this year's squad, Lisa van Loben Sels, Tammy Scott, and Julie Ahrendt, set school records in four seperate events last year. Senior Lisa van Loben Sels has OSU's top marks in the 50 (23.69) and the 100-yard freestyle (51.57); Julie Ahrendt, a junior, has the top time in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:07.47); and Scott holds the record in the 200-yard freestyle (1:53.15). Last season, the Beavers also broke school records in the 200-yard freestyle relay (1:38.06) with current members Bev Duvall, Julie Hockett, Samantha Holloway, and van Loben Sels; the 400-yard freestyle relay (3:33.77) with Scott, Hockett, Kelly Kaplan, and van Loben Sels; the 200-yard medley relay (1:50.20) with Ahrendt, and van Loben Sels; and the 400-yard medley relay (3:59.28) with Ahrendt, Scott, and van Loben Sels.

Senior Kelly Kaplan was the Beavers' top 1,000 (10:36.54) and 1,650-yard (17:29.92) freestyler a year ago and senior Becky Curtis had the best time in the 400-yard (4:50.97) individual medley. As well as 14 returners, Oregon State brings in 12 newcomers.

"The newcomers who will help us the most are Amy van Loben Sels, Julie Himstreet, Tori Eisenbeis, and Christy Ryerson," said Saunders. "Amy was highly recruited out of high school and we were glad to have her come to OSU. They (Amy and older sister Lisa) will be a tough combination to beat. Julie Himstreet, a transfer from Puget Sound, will add a lot of depth and experience to the team. I am looking for freshmen Tori Eisenbeis and Christy Ryerson to fill empty spots in the backstroke events.

"Last year, we broke 14 school records at the Pac-10 meet and I think we will drop times in some events this year also. The Pac-10 teams didn't expect much from us last year, but this year we hope to surprise some teams with our new girls. We have three or four women who nobody knows about and they are going to open a lot of eyes this season. We have a lot of experienced women returning with eight seniors and five juniors. Experience is something we have not had much of in the past. Our top returners are Lisa van Loben Sels, Kelly Kaplan, Tammy Scott, Julie Hockett, and Bev Duvall, who are all seniors and will need to provide the leadership for the team. Juniors, Julie Ahrendt, Debbie Fagan, Tina Kondo, and Kristen Sprecher, will help us out a lot and also add some good depth."

Up to this point of the season, Lisa van Loben Sels has the Beavers' top times in the 50 (24.64) and 100-yard (53.69) freestyle and the 100-yard butterfly (1:01.51). Tammy Scott has the top times in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:10.49) and 200-yard freestyle (1:57.72), Kelly Kaplan has the top times in the 500 (5:09.96) and 1,000-yard freestyle (10:45.49), Julie Himstreet has the top times in the 200-yard butterfly (2:15.26), the 200 (2:16.19) and 400-yard individual medley (4:46.85). Freshman Tori Eisenbeis has the top times in the 100 (1:02.06) and 200-yard backstroke (2:15.35), and Becky Curtis has the Beavers' top time in the 200-yard breaststroke (2:32.45).

## DALMODAL BALL DOREGON STATE HEAD COACH

JULIE SAUNDERS

Year at OSU: Fifth (second as head coach)

The Oregon State women's swim program continues to improve, and this is a credit to head coach Julie Saunders, who took over for five-year coach Laura Worden a year ago. Last season, the Beavers finished with a 6-2 dual meet record and their highest ever point total at the Pac-10 meet.

Julie Saunders, an excellent swimmer for the Beavers as an undergratuate, was to enter her fourth year as an assistant coach before accepting the job as Interim Head Coach in 1989. The ex-OSU star still holds the school record in the 200-yard butterfly (2:07.65).

Saunders was a great asset to the Beavers, helping the 89-90 squad to the second best dual meet record in six years. Her excellent organizational skills, recruiting background and coaching ability have expectations high for the future of Oregon State swimming.

Saunders, formerly Julie Skowhede, was married in July of '89, after recieving her teaching certificate from Oregon State in the spring.

#### JULIE AHRENDT -- 5-4, JR., CORVALLIS (CORVALLIS)

A three-time all-state swimmer at Corvallis High School, Julie participated in the 1988 Junior National Swim Meet in Browndeer, Wisconsin. She has qualified for the Junior National meet every year since she was 13. She already has times in the 100 (1:07.47) and 200-yard breaststroke (2:27.26) that currently are OSU school records, and is a member of the 200 (1:50.20) and 400-yard medley relay (3:59.28) teams which set school records last season.

#### MONICA AMOS -- 5-6, JR., MILWAUKEE (DAVID DOUGLAS)

Monica was a four-year letterwinner and set records in the 50 and 100-yard freestyle, as well as the 400-yard freestyle relay at David Douglas High School. She was selected All-State for four years and High School Female Athlete of the Year as a senior.

## GAYLE CAMBURN -- 5-4, SR., HILLSBORO (HILLSBORO)

A four-year letterwinner in swimming for Hillsboro, Gayle was also team MVP for four years. She was Senior Class Vice President, Sophomore Class Senator, and Army Reserves National Athlete Award winner in high school.

#### BECKY CURTIS -- 5-8, SR., GOLD BEACH (MARSHFIELD)

A four-year letterwinner in swimming at Marshfield High School, Becky was the 100-yard breaststroke District Champion in 1985 and 1987. She set three school records at Marshfield and qualified for State all four years. Last season, Becky had the Beavers' best time in the 400-yard individual medley (4:50.97).

# KIRA DAVIS -- 5-9, SO., ALBANY (SOUTH ALBANY) Kira earned four letters in swimming at South Albany and set five school records. She was Freshman Class President, Sophomore Class Secretary/Treasurer, and Junior Class Vice President.

#### BEV DUVALL -- 5-8, SR., SPRINGFIELD (SPRINGFIELD)

A four letterwinner in both swimming and water polo at Springfield High School, Bev was selected to the Oregon all-star water polo team as a junior and the US National Development team as a senior. She also earned three letters in soccer and one in track. Bev is a member of last season's record-setting 200-yard freestyle (1:38.06) team.

A four-year letterwinner, Tori was MVP of her swim team and set two school records at Las Lomas High School. She earned three letters in basketball and was a two-time all-league selection. Graduating with a 3.83 GPA from high school, Tori was on the Honor Roll all four years and recipient of three Scholar Athlete Awards.

#### DEBBIE FAGAN -- 5-9, JR., GRESHAM (GRESHAM)

Debbie was a four-year letterwinner in both swimming and water polo at Gresham High School. She was all-league in swimming as a junior and senior. In water polo, she was team captian for two years, all-league for three years and all-state as a senior.

#### MICHELLE FINZER -- 5-9, FR., PORTLAND (SUNSET)

Michelle earned three letters in swimming at Sunset High School. Her biggest athletic thrill to date was getting fourth place and setting a personal best time at the Metro League Championships as a junior.

#### TANYA GOODWIN -- 5-11, SO., AGOURA, CA (AGOURA)

A three letterwinner and all-league selection in tennis, Tanya also lettered in swimming at Agoura. She has one sister, Christina, and enjoys skiing and playing volleyball.

#### JULIE HIMSTREET -- 5-3, JR., BEAVERTON (UNIVERSITY OF PUGET SOUND)

Julie was a four-year letterwinner and a member of the recordsetting 200-yard medley relay team at Sunset High School. She is a transfer from the University of Puget Sound, where she swam for the past two years.

#### JULIE HOCKETT -- 5-7, SR., SPRINGFIELD (SPRINGFIELD)

Julie was a member of two record setting relay teams last season: the 200 (1:38.06) and 400-yard freestyle (3:33.77). In 1988, She was on the 800-yard freestyle relay team, which also set a school record (7:50.52). Julie earned four letters in swimming and three in water polo at Springfield High School.

#### SAMANTHA HOLLOWAY -- 5-3, SR., HOOD RIVER (HOOD RIVER VALLEY)

A transfer from Western Oregon, Samantha swam there for two years and qualified for NAIA Nationals. Last season, She was a member of the 200-yard freestyle relay which set a school record at the Pac-10 Championships with a time of 1:38.06.

#### MICHELLE HOWE -- 5-7, SO., PORTLAND (DAVID DOUGLAS)

A four-year letterwinner in water polo, Michelle led David Douglas to four straight conference championships, and was selected all-state and all-conference as a senior. She also earned three letters in swimming, and was an all-conference selection as a freshman.

Kelly earned two letters in volleyball, track and swimming in high school. She was an all-league selection in volleyball and team captain in swimming. Kelly currently holds the OSU school record in the 1,000-yard freestyle (10:23.50), and was a member of the record setting 400-yard freestyle relay team (3:33.77) last season.

#### TINA KONDO -- 5-5, JR., NAMPA, ID (NAMPA)

Tina earned four letters in swimming at Nampa High School, and was voted most inspirational and most dedicated by her teammates. She also lettered two years in volleyball at NHS.

#### KRISTINE LEWIS -- 5-5, JR., MISSOULA, MT (HELLGATE)

Kristine earned three letters in swimming at Hellgate High School, and was voted most dedicated and most improved by her teammates.

#### ERYN ROBERTS -- 5-8, SO., MILWAUKIE (REX PUTNAM)

A four-year letterwinner, Erin was captain of the Rex Putnam swim team for three years. She also lettered on the ski team.

## CHRISTY RYERSON -- 5-11, FR., GREAT FALLS, MT (CHARLES M. RUSSELL)

Christy earned four letters in swimming and two in basketball while at Charles M. Russell High School. She was a four-time all-state selection, and state champion in the 100-yard freestyle. She was also selected to the Acedemic All-State team.

#### TAMMY SCOTT -- 5-7, SR., RIVERSIDE, CA (RIVERSIDE POLY)

A four-year letterwinner in swimming at Riverside Polytechnic High School, Tammy was also a four-time all-league selection and twice team MVP. She currently holds school records in the 200 (1:53.15) and 500-yard freestyle (5:00.00), as well as the 400-yard freestyle relay (3:33.77) and 400-yard medley relay (3:59.28).

#### ALEX SKINNER -- 5-6, SO., PALO ALTO, CA (SACRED HEART PREP.)

Alex lettered three times at Sacred Heart and set school records in every individual event except the breaststroke. She was selected all-league and team MVP. She also earned two letters in soccer.

A three year letterwinner in swimming at Newberg High School, Kristen was a member on the 200-yard medley relay team that set a school record. She earned a letter in water polo, while leading her team to a second place finish in the state. As a junior, she played in the Junior and Senior National Tournament held in Hawaii.

## OSBORN AQUATIC CENTER

BUILT: 1979

OPENED: May, 1979

COST: 1.8 million dollars

DIMENSIONS: Main pool is 50 meters (Olympic sized) by 56 feet (eight lanes that are seven feet wide each)

Gallons: 1/2 million gallons.

Depth: gradual slope from 3 1/2 feet to 13 feet.

Temperature: 83 degrees

Small pool is 40 feet by 22 feet. Gallons: 20,000. Depth: gradual slope to 4 1/2 feet. Temperature: 93 degrees.

SEATING CAPACITY: The balcony will seat 500 spectators and the pool deck will accommodate another 150, plus up to 550 swimmers. The Osborn Aquatic Center annually hosts a U.S.S. Invitational which draws over 500 swimmers and 500 spectators for a 2 1/2 day meet.

EQUIPMENT: The Osborn Aquatic Center is fully equipped with an electronic timing system by Colorado Timing, including an eight lane electronic scoreboard.

There are two, one meter diving boards and one, three meter diving

board made by Duraflex.

There is a moveable, stainless steel bulkhead with plastic grates that can be positioned to create a 25-yard, 25-meter or 50-meter competition course.
