Oregon State University is Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher learning. It uses October 27, 1868 as its Charter Day.

Like many of the leading public universities in the United States, Oregon State was established as a Land Grant or "people's college" under the historic Morrill Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln. The act provided grants of land to the various states to start public colleges that would extend educational opportunities to all who had the will and ability to learn.

In its early years, the school was located in "downtown Corvallis." A 35-acre farm was purchased in 1870 for a new college campus west of town. The first building, Benton Hall, was completed in 1888.

In the beginning, the curriculum was typical of the colleges of that period. There was a classical course leading to the Bachelor of Arts degree and a scientific course leading to the Bachelor of Science.

Agriculture was added in 1869 under the impetus of the Land Grant Act. Commerce, household economy and engineering courses came soon and in 1908, four professional schools were established: Agriculture, Commerce, Engineering and Home Economics.

With 16,000 students now, Oregon State offers a complete university curriculum. The College of Science and the College of Liberal Arts are the largest academic units. Schools include Agriculture, Business and Technology, Education, Engineering, Forestry, Home Economics, Oceanography, Pharmacy and a Division of Health and Physical Education.

OSU's 400-acre tree-lined campus now has about 100 building and research laboratories. Classroom buildings, the library and student activity areas are located in the center. Residence halls and research areas are on the edges.

In September, 1971, Oregon State was designated by the U.S. Commerce Department as one of the nation's first four Sea Grant colleges as well. As such, it is charged with leadership in the wise development of marine resources.

Oregon State's ocean research vessels (four) are docked at Newport on the Oregon coast, just 55 miles from campus. The university's Marine Science Center there has become one of the top tourist attractions in the Northwest.

### HOME OF OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY GOLF --THE CORVALLIS COUNTRY CLUB--

Nestled high in the hills of south Corvallis is Oregon's fourth-oldest golf course, the Corvallis Country Club. First opened in 1917, the original layout consisted of only six holes, but was later expanded to nine, and 18 by 1960. The "target golf course," as it is best described, is laid out on 117 acres. The links are hilly and tight and abundant with trees. Vern Martin is in his 19th year as the club pro. Oregon State also practices and plays some of its matches at the Springhill Country Club in Albany and the Tokatee Golf Club, east of Eugene. Corvallis Country Club is a 5815-yard, par-71 course with a 68 rating. Tokatee is a 6775-yard, par-72 with a 72 rating.



## 1985 SPRING OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY MEN'S GOLF

### OUTLOOK

Oregon State head golf coach Perry Overstreet is expressing great optimism over this year's team. He says this could be his best team in the six years he's been at OSU.

Overstreet said, "With a little improvement over last fall, we could be a very strong team."

The reason for the optimistic view of the 1985 team is overall strength. Overstreet says there are a lot of guys with very similar skills on this team, but feels that top returnee junior Scott Larsen will be the leader. In addition to Larsen, Overstreet will be relying heavily on juniors Scott Kraemer and Brad Leiken, along with sophomore Brad Blind.

Larsen had a good spring season leading the team in scoring in three different tournaments, including an 11th place finish overall in the Pac-10 Championships with a four-round total of 288. In the fall, Scott (stroke average of 76) finished fifth overall at the Air Force Invitational with a three-round total of 224.

The next three or four spots are wide open, according to Overstreet. Scott Kraemer (74) finished as the top Beaver in two fall tournaments. Brad Leiken (77) finished as the top OSU golfer and fifth overall at the Wolf Pack Classic last fall. Brad Blind (76) finished as one of the top three Beavers in three different tournaments. Bob McCallister (76) and Ross Jesswein (78) also made key contributions to the fall team and should continue to perform well this spring.

The Beavers will once again face a tough schedule this spring scheduled for most all the major stops on the western collegiate golf itinerary and Coach Overstreet feels there must be constant improvement during the season to insure good results.

### OREGON STATE MEN'S GOLF COACH

#### PERRY OVERSTREET

Perry Overstreet is going into his sixth year as the volunteer head golf coach at OSU. He is a graduate of Washington State University, where he was a standout golfer in the late 50's. In those six years, he has brought the Beavers from the bottom of the league to Pac-10 Conference contenders.

While at WSU, he was the number two man on the varsity golf team and qualified for the 64-player NCAA Championships in 1959. He also finished in the top ten of the Pac-10 Conference Championship in 1957. Perry attended Lincoln High School in Seattle where he was a member of the state championship team.

In Overstreet's first year at OSU, the team had an average of 82 strokes per round, and only had two golfers under 80. Since then, OSU has steadily improved to where the team carded an average of 77 last fall with six different golfers at 76 or better.

Overstreet received his degree at WSU in 1960 in Hotel and Restaurant Management. He owns two restaurants in the mid-Willamette Valley, the Class Reunion in Corvallis and the Oregon Electric Station in Eugene.

Originally from Seattle, Perry and his wife, Mike, have six children. Laurie is a senior at Washington State, Chip is a junior at Stanford, Kim attends Brooks College in California, Tiffany and Lisa are taking a year off from school, and Leslie is a sophomore in high school.

## MEN'S PROFILES

### BRAD BLIND--6-1, 155, 19, So., Eugene (South Eugene)

Brad was one of the key members of the 1984 fall team, with a stroke average of 76 in 14 rounds, His best effort was a 70 in the OSU Invitational, where he place second on the OSU team with a 221 in three rounds. At South Eugene High School, he lettered in golf all four years, competing in the state tournament his last three years. His senior year, Brad was the number one man as well as receiving all district honors. His biggest thrill was the medalist honors he received playing in the Hogan Cup. Brad is majoring in business at OSU. He was born September 23, 1965 in Eugene. Brad is the son of Ron and Caroline Blind.

### MIKE COPPEDGE--6-1, 170, 19, Fr., Stayton, OR (Stayton)

Mike is coming to OSU after a very successful high school career, playing as the number one man all four years. He finished sixth or better in state all four years, highlighted by a first place finish his junior year. Mike played in one fall tournament averaging 79 strokes in three rounds. In addition to golf he played basketball and football all four years. He is majoring in business at OSU. Mike was born December 21, 1965 in Bozeman, MT. He is the son of Jack and Gay Coppedge.

### ERIC GIFFORD--5-6, 160, 19, So., La Grande, OR (La Grande)

Eric participated in the 1984 OSU Fall Golf Invitational where he shot a 225 in three rounds, firing 74 as his best round. While at LaGrande High School, he lettered in golf three years, highlighted by his appearance in the state tournament his junior season. He was the captain of the golf team his junior and senior years, and was named to the All-Intermountain Conference team his senior season. Eric is majoring in electrical engineering at OSU. He was born in Walla Walla, Washington on May 5, 1965. He is the son of Bob Gifford and Ruth Stebbins.

### ROSS JESSWEIN--5-9, 160, 20, So., Grants Pass, OR (Grants Pass)

Ross played in three tournaments last fall, averaging 78 strokes in eight rounds, with his best coming in the OSU Fall Golf Invitational where he shot a 73. While at Grants Pass, he played number one man all four years. He was the OGA Champion twice, in the 12-13 and 14-15 age groups. In addition to winning the OGA, he also competed in the Hogan Cup for three years. Ross was born December 8, 1964 in Grants Pass. He is the son of Ross Sr. and Marilyn Jesswein.

### TOM KLUTZ--5-10, 140, 20, Jr., Redmond, WA. (Blanchet)

Tom played in the 1984 OSU Fall Golf Invitational where he averaged 77 strokes in three rounds, with a round of 73 being his best. At Blanchet High School, he lettered in golf four years and placed fourth in the Washington State AAA Championship. Tom was also named to the all-metro team twice and, in 1982, he was the conference MVP. After his senior year, he won a trip to San Diego to compete in the National Jamia World Tournament. He is currently a liberal arts major at OSU. Tom was born March 11, 1964 in Louisville, Kentucky. He is the son of Thomas and Dorothy Klutz.

### SCOTT KRAEMER--5-9, 140, 20, Jr., Vancouver, B.C. (St. Georges/Menlo)

Scott participated in three fall golf tournaments averaging 74 strokes per round, with his best round of 72 coming at both the University of Pacific Autumn Invitational and the Stanford Invitaional. In both those tournaments, he was the top OSU finisher with total round scores of 217 and 222. Along with his fall achievement, he was the top Beaver finisher in the Western Intercollegiate Championship last spring with a total of 226. At Menlo High School, he was part of the team that won the Canadian Junior Golf Championships, where he finished third. He is a business major at OSU. Scott was born May 17, 1964 in Edmonton, Alberta. He is the son of Ivan and Sharon Kraemer.



SCOTT LARSEN--5-11, 165, 20, Jr., Eugene (South Eugene)

Scott was one of the top members of the fall team, competing in four tournaments. He averaged 76 strokes per round, with his best coming at both the University of Pacific Autumn Invitational and Air Force Invitational where he shot rounds of 71. At the Air Force Invitational, he finished fifth overall with a three round total of 224 just four shots back. Scott also finished as the top Beaver in the Sacramento State Invitational last spring with a three-round total of 227. He lettered all four years in golf at South Eugene High School. Scott is currently a business major at OSU. He was born on December 2, 1963 in Eugene. He is the son of Theodore and Shannon Larsen.

BRAD LEIKEN--6-4, 215, 21, Jr., Eugene (South Eugene)

Brad was one of the leaders on the fall team playing 14 rounds, averaging 77 strokes per round, with his best coming at the Falcon Invitational, where he shot a 71. He was the top OSU finisher in the Wolf Pack Classic, where he shot a two round total of 155 finishing in a fifth place tie overall. While at South Eugene High School, he lettered in golf for four years, finishing sixth in the state his senior season. He is currently a business major at OSU. Brad was born on October 24, 1964 in Roseburg OR. He is the son of Peter and Glenda Leiken. Leiken.

BOB McCALLISTER--5-9, 140, 18, Fr., Redding, CA (Shasta)

Bob comes to OSU from Shasta High School, where he lettered in golf three years. In those three years, he was number one man his junior and senior seasons compiling a 9-3 record. Along with golf, he also played football, basketball and wrestled at different times in his high school career. He is currently a business major at OSU. Bob was born August 8, 1966 in Pomona California. He is the son of Bob McCallister and Terry Kemple.

MIKE McKENNON--5-9, 155, 19, Fr., Lake Oswego, OR (Lakeridge)

Mike lettered in golf all four years at Lakeridge High School. In those four years, he finished in the top 10 in state every year, and finished first both his junior and senior seasons. He was named an honorable mention all-American his senior year. Mike compiled a perfect record of 28-0 his final two seasons for the Pacers. He is pursuing a major in business at OSU. Mike was born in Corvallis on December 13, 1965. He is the son of Loren and Ardath Flomer.

TOM MORRISH--6-2, 190, 21, Fr., Calgary Alberta (Henry Wisewood)

Tom played in the OSU Invitational last fall, where he averaged 81 strokes per round, with his best being a 77. In high school, he played as the number one man for three years and played on the Alberta Junior team once. Along with golf, he played three years of basketball and volleyball.
