

THE 1992 TI SHAFT PAC-10 CHAMPIONSHIPS at Trysting Tree Golf Course May 1-3, 1992

Trysting Tree Golf Course will be the site of the Pacific-10 Men's Conference Championships this spring. Ten schools from the toughest golf conference in the nation will conglomerate in Corvallis beginning May 1, swinging for bragging rights and a Western Regional Tournament bid.

Once again the Pac-10 is loaded with top-ranked teams and top-notch individuals. Arizona State and Arizona were ranked numbers one and two in the nation respectively in the final fall rankings. Stanford was rated 14th while Oregon and Southern California were both ranked 30th.

Arizona State's Phil Mickelson, the 1990 Pac-10 champion, won the 1991 Tuscon Open, an official Professional Golf Association event. Because he was an amateur, Mickelson couldn't accept the \$140,000 dollar pay off. However, he did make the history books as the youngest player ever to win a PGA event as an amateur.

Manny Zerman of Arizona was last year's Pac-10 champion, nudging Washington's O.D. Vincent by a stroke on the final round of play. Zerman is a twotime finalist in the U.S. Amateur, the top amateur tournament in the nation.

David Berganio, also from Arizona, won the 1991 Pub Links Championship last summer. Last spring, Berganio won the U.S. Intercollegiate at the Stanford University Golf Course. Berganio, as well as Zerman and Mickelson, will compete in the Masters this spring in Augusta, Georgia.

Christian Cevaer of Stanford was the Pac-10 champion in 1989. Cevaer, a world cup golf team member for France, and teammate Notay Begay both tied for first place at the Husky Invitational this fall in Seattle while Jeff Lyons of Oregon finished third, only two strokes back.

This is the first time Trysting Tree Golf Course has hosted the Pac-10 Championships. Since its completion in 1988, Trysting Tree has been the home of the Beavers which might serve as a slight advantage for OSU golfers in the Pac-10 Championship especially for hometown favorites Jim Hackenberg and Scott Leritz. The two seniors could be playing their final collegiate tournament, fittingly at Trysting Tree Golf Course.



(2) OREGON STATE HEAD COACH STEVE ALTMAN


Steve Altman begins his first year as head coach of Oregon State's men's golf team. Altman, a former Beaver golfer from 1987-1989, was the team's most valuable player in 1988 and served as the team captain in 1987 and 1988.

After graduating in 1989 with a degree in economics, Altman worked as a sales representative for the Head Sports Golf Company in



Arizona and Nevada. He also worked as an assistant golf professional at Progress Downs Golf Course in Portland before being hired as men's golf coach in September 1991.

Altman turned professional in May of 1991 and is the assistant golf pro a Trysting Tree Golf Course in Corvallis. He believes coaching and being a golf professional is a perfect blend for a golf coach.



A strong believer in education, Altman has set up study tables and provided tutors for his players. Because very few players actually turn professional and enjoy successful careers, Altman stresses the importance of a college degree because it allows a player something to fall back on.

Altman's long term goal is to rebuild the golf program emphasizing the student-athlete. He wants to recruit players with the desire to compete and excel in the classroom and on the golf course.

Tournament preparation and placing in the top five at the Pac-10 championships are Altman's short term goals for the season. He feels the quickest path to the top of the Pac-10 standings is getting his players in the correct frame of mind and having them believe in themselves as competitors.



1992 Men's Golf Outlook

Although the Oregon State men's golf team had a disappointing fall season, first-year coach Steve Altman believes his team will be ready for the high caliber Pac-10 teams this spring.

"We have to get in the attitude that we can compete in the Pac-10 and we certainly have the ability to do that," Altman said.

Once again the Pac-10 is loaded with teams in and around the top 20 in the nation. Arizona, Arizona State and Stanford approach this spring as the favorites for the Pac-10 championship while USC, UCLA and Oregon are legitimate contenders.

"The Pac-10 is by far the toughest Conference in the nation," Altman said. "But if we can get in the right frame of mind, we'll do well this spring."

At the end of the fall season, Altman brought in a sports psychologist who has worked with over 70 touring men and women professionals. He worked on the team's mental approach to golf, spending most of his two days with the team in a classroom and on the putting green.

"Golf is such a unique game in that the mental part plays such a bigger role than most other sports," Altman said. "There are a lot of people with great ability, but if they're not there mentally then they're not going to be real successful."

The Beavers lost four golfers from last year's team, including Warren Vickers, who is currently playing in the South African Professional Golf Association. However, this year's team is by no means short on talent.

Seniors Jim Hackenberg (Grand Forks, ND) and Scott Leritz (Mission Viejo, CA) posted solid scores this fall. Hackenberg placed fourth in the Nike Northwest Classic and averaged 77.4 strokes in five tournaments while Leritz shot the most consistent golf and averaged a team best 76.4 strokes per round.

Besides Hackenberg, sophomore Jeff Johnson (Myrtle Point) was the only other Beaver to play in all five tournaments this fall. Johnson averaged 78.3 strokes per round and shot the lowest round for the Beavers with a 67 at the Husky Invitational.

Sophomore Kevin LaMair (Auburn, CA) appears to play a key role in the future for OSU golf. LaMair finished in second place at the Nike Northwest Classic shooting a 218, and his 76.9 average per round was the second best on the team.

OSU returns junior Aaron Baker (West Linn) sophomore Steve Fowell (Wood Village) and freshmen Anthony Kang (Kailua, HA) and Jeff Canessa (Astoria) all of whom played in at least one tournament last fall.


Freshmen D'arby English (Auburn, WA), Kevin Jordan (Roseburg), Birk Nelson (Pendleton) and Dan Ostrin (Albany) complete the 12-man roster which opens in Eugene for the Duck Invitational on March 9.

SPRING '91: Competed in six of the eight tournaments...led the team at the Thunderbird Invitational, 78-71-78-227 and the Bruin


Desert Golf Classic, 77-75-75-227...placed 50th at Pac-10 Championships, 75-77-77-79-308.






KEVIN LaMAIR SO., 5-10, 160 Auburn, CA (Placer)







OREGON STATE HEAD COACH RISE' LAKOWSKE

Rise' Lakowske is in the middle of her second year as OSU Women's Golf Coach, but has already stockpiled a top-notch team that finds itself ranked 29th in the nation entering the 1992 spring season.

Lakowske was born in Lalurel, Miss. She attended OSU from 1972-77 majoring in history and playing on the golf team where she competed in the nationals as a senior.



Lakowske competed professionally from 1978 until 1981, and finished 12th on the Women's Professional Golf Tour money list in 1981. She also worked as an assistant professional at Jackson Park Golf Course in Seattle in 1980.

Before taking the reigns as women's head coach in the fall of 1990, Lakowske started her coaching career as a volunteer coach for the 1982-



84 OSU women's golf teams.

An advocate of education, Lakowske understands and preaches that the number one priority for her players is academics. However, she also wants her team to know golf is to be taken seriously as well.

Lakowske's objectives are not hard to follow. She wants to increase the skills of each player, but more importantly, encourage and develop their golf management side of the game, so her players can learn to cope with competitive situations on the golf course. Through competitive college golf experience, she hopes her players will have a sense of confidence when confronted with stressful situations off the golf course.

She and her husband, Mason, have two children, Laura, 9, and Joseph, 5.

1992 Women's Golf Outlook

After having one the best fall seasons ever at Oregon State, the women's golf team is optimistic and excited about the 1992 season.

The Beavers finished among the top four teams in three of four tournaments this fall including a first place finish at the Colorado State Invitational concluding the fall season. OSU won that tournament by 20 shots, and also took second place at the Jacoby Collegiate.

Head Coach Rise' Lakowske enters her second year as women's golf coach with a deep and talented team that is ranked 29th in the nation and averaged 80.2 strokes per round in the fall.

"I'm very pleased with the way my team played this fall," Lakowske said. "I think we'll surprise some people this spring."

The Beavers return all but two players from last year's team that played inconsistent golf all year. However, this year's team is capable of shooting low numbers, Lakowske said.

Senior Kari Loberg (Stevensville, MT) led the Beavs this fall winning the Colorado State Invitational shooting a 221 in three rounds of golf. Loberg's 76.6 strokes in the fall was a team best.

Sophomore Margo Evashevski (Corvallis) played in two tournaments in the fall averaging 79 strokes and placing fifth at the Jacoby Collegiate before joining the basketball team in October. Evashevski will miss the first tournament of the season before returning to the golf team in late March.

"Kari has been playing excellent golf all year and Margo will be back with us soon enough to get ready for the Pac-10 Championships," Lakowske said.

Sophomore Danielle Mitchell (Westlake Village, CA) placed third at the Colorado State Invitational and averaged 78.8 strokes for the Beavers. Senior Jennifer Harper (Boise, ID) averaged 82 strokes and adds depth and experience to a team with three sophomores and two freshmen.

Freshmen Mary Sue Serwold (Edmonds, WA) and Sara Berlin (Federal Way, WA) saw significant action for the Beavers in the fall. Serwold played in all four tournaments while Berlin filled in for Evashevski in the final two matches.

"I have at least six players that can play in the top five slots, so that gives us a lot of depth. We can take the players playing the best golf at the time, and in the past, we've never had a strong fifth player who could help the team," Lakowske said.

Junior's Kristen Applegate (Pendleton) and Leina Larsen (The Dalles) and sophomore Jenny Cowart (Portland) round off the nine-member team that begins its season on March 9 at the Dixie Classic in St. George, Utah.

"This is by far the best team I've had," said Lakowske, who played on the 1975 OSU golf team, "This is also probably the best team Oregon State has ever fielded."
