OREGON STATE HEAD COACH STEVE ALTMAN

Steve Altman enters his second year as head coach of Oregon State's men's golf team. Altman, a former Beaver golfer from 1987-1989, was the team's most valuable player in 1988 and served as the team captain in 1987 and 1988.

After graduating in 1989 with a degree in economics, Altman worked as a sales representative for the Head Sports Golf Company in



Arizona and Nevada. He also worked as an assistant golf professional at Progress Downs Golf Course in Portland before being hired as men's golf coach in September 1991.

Altman turned professional in May of 1991 and is the assistant golf pro at Trysting Tree Golf Club in Corvallis. He believes coaching and being a professional is the perfect mix for a golf coach.



An avid believer in education, Altman has set up study tables and provided tutors for his players. Because very few players actually turn professional and enjoy successful golf careers, Altman stresses the importance of a college degree.

Altman's long term goal is to make the Beavers a regional and national power while emphasiizing the student-athlete. He wants to recruit players with the desire to compete and excel in the classroom as well as on the golf course.

Making the western regionals is Altman's goal this spring. He feels if his team can play consistent golf all spring, the Beavers hold an excellent shot at attaining this goal.

1993 MEN'S GOLF OUTLOOK

A year ago, the Oregon State men's golf team played lackluster golf, placing eighth in the Pacific-10 Championships played on its home course at Trysting Tree Golf Club.

But what a difference a year makes.

Second year Head Coach Steve Altman has pumped in some enthusiasm and his young and talented team has responded. Oregon State won the Nike Northwest Classic last fall shooting even par 288 on the last round to edge second place Pacific by a single stroke. The tournament victory marked the first time OSU had won a major tournament since April, 1982. Soon after, the Beavers found themselves in the national rankings, rated 28th in the final Golfweek/Taylor Made collegiate rankings. Altman credits the Beaver turnaround to their restructured quality practice rounds.

"Over the summer, I went to the Stanford Golf Camp and learned some good ideas," Altman said. "We've placed a greater emphasis in our short game practice sessions. Sixty percent of golf is the short game, and I think this has really helped their game."

The Beavers open their season in Eugene for the Oregon Duck Invitational on March 8 followed by four more tournaments each leading to biggest tournament of the year, the Pacific-10 Conference

Championships played in San Luis Obispo May 1-3. However, Altman is far more concerned than just the Pac-10 Championships.

"Our goal is to make the Regionals," Altman said. "In order to do that, we have to play consistent golf all spring, and not just for one tournament."

The Beavers only have one senior and a total of eight underclassmen. The future appears bright for Altman and his golf program.

Leading the way last fall for the Beavers were sophomores Anthony "Manny" Kang (Kailua, HA) and Birk Nelson (Pendleton). Kang twice placed in the top 10 and averaged a team best 74.6 strokes per round. His best tournament was at the Robertson Homes Invitational where he fired a 1-under par 215 placing ninth. He was seventh at the Nike Northwest Classic with a 220 carding a final round score of 69.

"Manny is so mentally mature," Altman said. "He doesn't let bad shots effect him and he doesn't get to excited when he plays well. He golfs within his limits."

Nelson twice placed fourth in two tournaments, and averaged 75.4 shots per 18 holes. Nelson took fourth at the Husky Men's Golf Classic firing a 1-under 215 and also placed fourth shooting a 1-over 217 at the Nike Northwest Classic. He almost landed another top 10 placing at the Columbia Lakes Invitational but settled for 13th carding a 225.

"Birk loves golf," Altman said. "His scoring average is around 74, but it easily could be 72 or under par. He probably is my most talented golfer."

Juniors Kevin LaMair (Auburn, CA) and Jeff Johnson (Myrtle Point) have the most experience which is why Altman named the two team captains. LaMair played in five tournaments this fall and was an honorable mention All-Pacific 10 Conference selection last spring. LaMair placed 10th at the Nike Northwest Classic with a 221.

Johnson scorched Trysting Tree in the first round of the Nike Northwest Classic firing a 4under 68, the team's lowest round of the year. Johnson, last year, led the team with a low round of 67. He placed sixth at the Nike tournament posting a 218.

"Kevin has the most experience on our team, and will continue to play in a lot of tournaments," Altman said. "Jeff is a great athlete who has lived off his physical talents. He has the ability to hang in there and not give up."

Joining the seasoned veterans LaMair, Johnson, and Aaron Baker (West Linn) are five newcomers who saw significant action in the fall.

Freshman Marty James (Clarksdale, AZ) made his college debut at the Husky Golf Classic and showed no signs of pressure placing 14th with a 4-over 220. Junior Chris Thurman (Redding, CA) transferred from Shasta Junior College, and played in two matches. Thurman placed 12th with a 222 at the Nike Northwest Classic.

Extraordinary athlete Casey Winters (Toledo, WA) transferred from Lower Columbia Community College. Winters didn't play golf in high school, yet competed in two tournaments this fall for the Beavers.

Freshmen Greg Mills (Danville, CA) and Jason Carroll (Salem) should see valuable time as their golf careers progress, and teamed with sophomores Dan Ostrin (Albany) and D'arby English (Auburn, WA), Altman has a deep and talented squad. "Everybody has a strong desire to become better players, and there's a lot of competitiveness between the guys," Altman said. "They all want to step up to the next level."

OREGON STATE HEAD COACH RISE' LAKOWSKE


Rise' Lakowske is in her third year as Oregon State women's golf coach. Lakowske attended OSU from 1972-77 majoring in history and playing on the golf team where she competed in the nationals as a senior.

Born in Lalurel, Miss., Lakowske competed professionally from 1978 until 1981, and finished 12th on the Women's Professional Golf Tour money list in 1981. She also worked as an assistant profes-



sional at Jackson Park Golf Course in Seattle in 1980.

Before taking the reigns of the woman's program in the fall of 1990, Lakowske served as a volunteer coach for the OSU women's golf teams from 1982-84.



An advocate of education, Lakowske understands and preaches that the number one priority for her players is academics. However, she also wants her team to know that golf is to be taken seriously as well.

Lakowske's objectives are simple. She wants to increase the skills of each player, but more importantly, encourage and develop their golf management side of the game, so her players can learn to cope with competitive situations on the golf course. Through competitive college golf experience, she hopes her players will have a sense of confidence when confronted with stressful situations off the golf course.

She and her husband, Mason, have two children, Laura, 10, and Joseph, 6.

Oregon State Golf 1993 WOMEN'S GOLF OUTLOOK

The Oregon State women's golf team lost two valuable seniors last year in Kari Loberg and Jennifer Harper, but third-year coach Rise' Lakowske has reloaded bringing in five freshmen for this year.

The Beavers lack a senior and have a total of seven underclassmen making this Lakowske's youngest team ever. However, this team has the most potential compared to her past teams according to Lakowske.

The Beavers pack a powerful 1-2 punch in Margo Evashevski (Corvallis) and Danielle Mitchell (Westlake Village, CA). A superb athlete, Evashevski has been sharing her time with the basketball court. Evashevski is currently playing in her final year as a starting guard for the women's basketball team, but she will be ready to go for the golf season opener on Feb. 22nd for the Arizona Invitational in Tucson, AZ. Evashevski averaged 79 strokes per 18 holes last fall. She fired an even par 73 in the second round at the Stanford Women's Invitational where she placed eighth with a 225.



Mitchell led the team averaging 78.4 shots per round, and also led the team with a low round of 72. She consistently shot in the mid 230's, and placed 10th at the Edean Ihlanfeldt's Invitational carding 233.

"Margo is such a gifted athlete that she can react to any pressure situation, and Danielle can hit the ball farther than some of the guys on the men's team," Lakowske said. "Margo and Danielle both have incredible physical ability and mental toughness, they have a real solid chance for post-season play."

Sophomores Sara Berlin (Federal Way, WA) and Mary Sue Serwold (Edmonds, WA) look to build off of successful first-year seasons. Both were thrusted into the starting lineup competing in every tournament last spring. Berlin played in all four matches last fall averaging 83.1 strokes per round. She placed 56th at the Stanford Women's Invitational posting a 256. Berlin fired her low round of 79 at the Bruin Golf Classic where she placed 53rd with a 249.

Serwold played in all but one tournament. She fired her low round of 79 at the Oregon Golf Invitational where she placed 50th shooting 252. Serwold averaged 86 shots per round.

"Sara and Mary Sue have really matured and accepted responsibility for themselves and its paying off in their game," Lakowske said. "I expect a lot out of them in the years to come."

Four of Lakowske's five freshmen made their college debuts in the fall for the Beavers. Mitzi Krivanek (Sparks, NV) played in two matches averaging 86 shots per 18 holes. Krivanek fired a low round of 79 at the Stanford Women's Invitational, and placed 46th shooting 254 at the Edean Ihlanfeldt's Invitational. Dawn Baxter (Salem), Angela Brown (McMinnville) and Felicia Galindo (Eaton, CO) all played in one tournament. Baxter carded a 271 at the Oregon Golf Invitational, Brown shot 256 at the Stanford Women's Invitational and Galindo fired a 250 at the Bruin Golf Classic.

"Because we have so many newcomers, we don't have a very deep team, but when they gain more tournament experience we will have deep team," Lakowske said.

Juniors Jenny Cowart (Portland) and Leina Larsen (The Dalles) each have tournament experience and together with talented freshman Courtney Resch (Chandler, AZ), the Beavers appear prime to make a run at the Western Regionals.

"Placing sixth or seventh at the Pac-10's should be good enough to qualify for the Regionals," Lakowske explained. "If we can shoot consistently around 950 we have a chance to achieve that goal."

Oregon State hosts the OSU Nike Invitational at Trysting Tree Golf Club on Apr. 9-10, and competes in four other tournaments this spring including the Pacific-10 Championships held in Walla Walla, WA.
