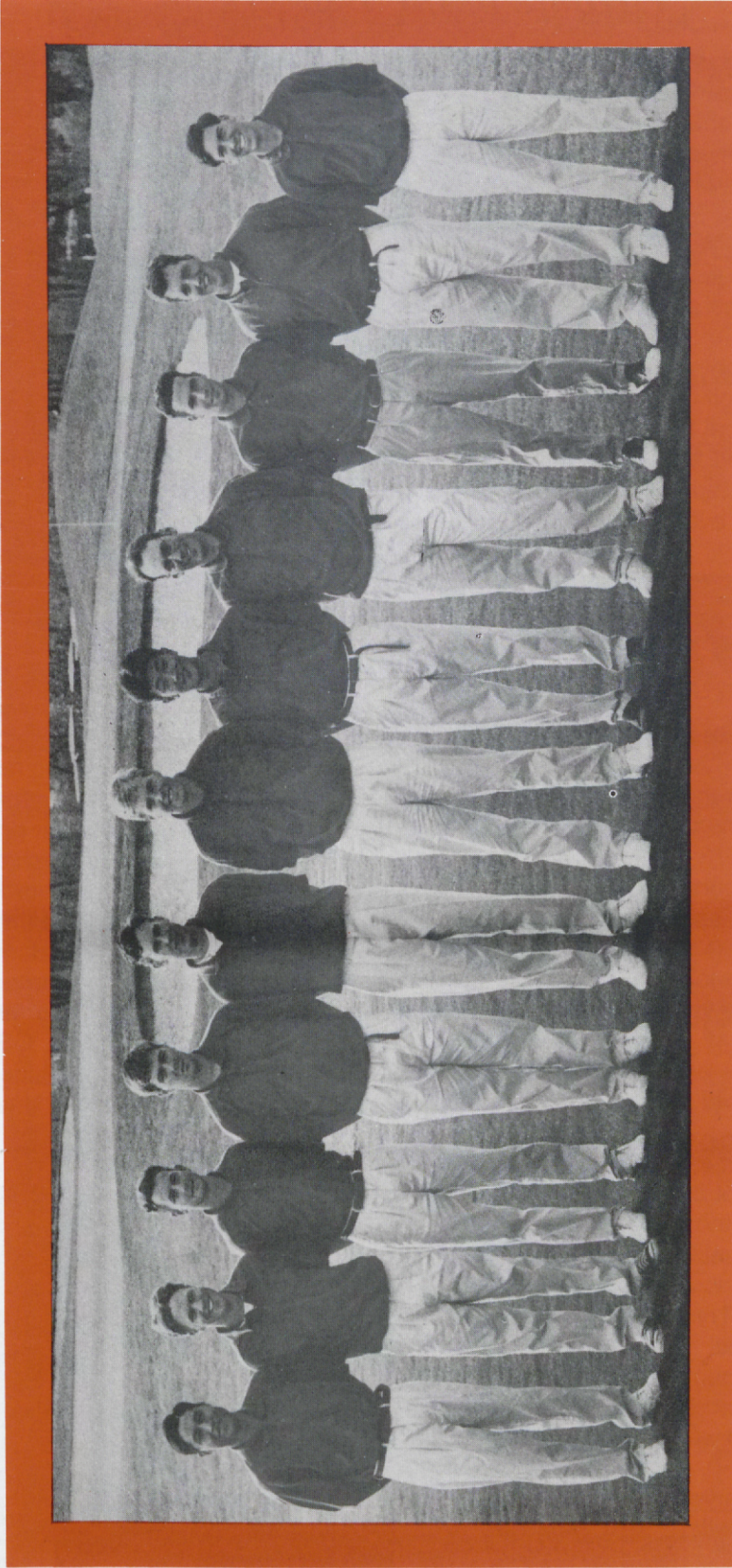

Trysting Tree Golf Course Home of the Beavers

Trysting Tree Golf Club is still in its early stages of growth but since its grand opening in the summer of 1988, the spacious course has quickly developed into one of the Northwest's finest public golf courses and one of the nation's premier collegiate facilities.

Despite being only five-years-old, the idea of building an 18-hole golf course just off highway 34 and along the Willamette River dates all the way back to 1951.

In that year, OSU bought the 175 acres solely planning on building a public golf course, but funding difficulties and debates with local farmers and Linn County commissioners prevented its beginning stages. Finally, Trysting Tree was granted approval and has been the home of the Beavers ever since.

Each fall and spring, Trysting Tree is the site of the Nike golf tournaments which attract schools from all over the country. This fall, the University of Oregon won the women's title and Brigham Young University won the men's tournament. Trysting Tree made quite an impression on BYU coach Bruce Brockbank.

"This is a great golf course," Brockbank said. "This facility is as good as I've seen, it's very comparable to Arizona State's facility (Karsten Golf Course). Oregon State has done a great job with this facility and the city of Corvallis ought to be very proud of what they have here."

Brockbank's comments are echoed by other coaches and players who marvel at Trysting Tree's appearance.

"It's fun to bring a team to a golf course where the people in charge show a lot of pride," Stanford coach Wally Goodwin said. "I thought the fairways at Stanford were in great shape until I saw these. This course is unbelievable, it's a tribute to Corvallis."

In the spring of 1992, Trysting Tree hosted the 1992 Pacific-10 Championships. Top ranked Arizona State and second-ranked Arizona strutted in with their heavy hitters Phil Mickelson and Manny Zerman, but it was 20th-ranked Stanford who walked away with the crown.

"These greens are marvelous. In terms of condition, you can't find any better," said 1992 Pac-10 Champion Christian Cevaer.

Thanks to a very particular grounds crew, the course is in superb shape all year round, uncanny for a public golf course. Just five minutes away from the



OSU campus, Trysting Tree is a versatile golf course varying in length anywhere from 5,500 to 7,000 yards and carries a par of 72. Trysting Tree offers a variety of shots and golfers can experience all types of weather conditions. Because of its superb drainage, Trysting Tree is an excellent winter golf course.

The OSU men's and women's golf teams are blessed to have one of the best practice facilities on the West Coast. Playing consistently on a championship course, OSU golfers can quickly increase their skills. Both coaches stress the importance of playing quality golf from within 100 yards which is why the golfers have their own short game practice area. The teams constantly work at hitting targets placed at different yardages. In addition, OSU has its own two-tier putting green with a green side bunker, and has access to their own side of the driving range.

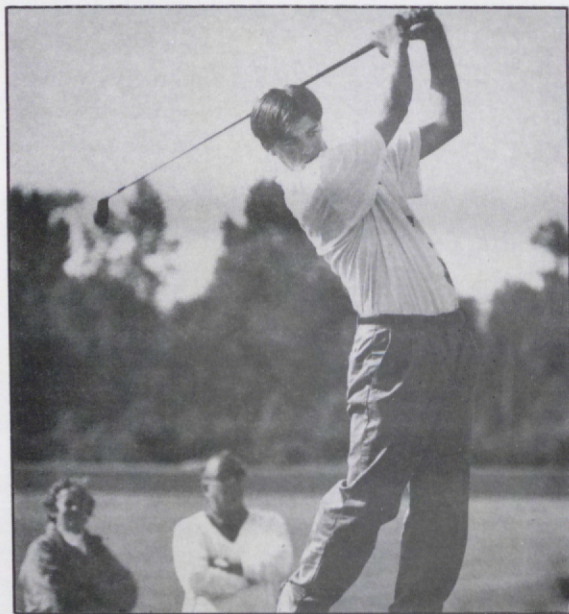
The Oregon State men's golf team enjoyed a terrific season a year ago. The Beavers won their first major tournament in 10 years, battled Arizona State and Arizona in the final round of the Pacific-10 Championships before placing fifth, and qualified for regional play for the first time since 1973.

These feats are impressive when you consider the program was mired in mediocrity not long ago. The team returns all but two players from last year's club which explains third-year head coach Steve Altman's optimism for this spring.

"We definitely have high hopes for this spring," Altman said. "Last year I had a good idea who my top five players were, but now I have about eight players competing for five or six spots."

The Beavers bring back two-time Pac-10 honorable mention nominee Kevin LaMair as well as Anthony Kang and Birk Nelson who also earned honorable mention honors.

LaMair (Auburn, CA) enters his final year of collegiate golf. He leads the team with experience playing in a total of 33 tournaments since his freshman year. Last spring, LaMair won the U.S. Intercollegiate at the Stanford Golf Course firing a 2-under-par 211. LaMair entered final round action trailing by three strokes and sunk a five foot putt on the first hole of sudden death to win the tournament.

LaMair finished the season with four top 20 placings and three top 10 finishes.

Nelson (Pendleton) paced OSU last year averaging a team-best 74.8 shots per round. Nelson placed in the top 20 six times including four top four finishes. His blistering rounds of 73-71-72-71—287 at the 1993 Pac-10 Championships put him fourth on the OSU all-time list for best four round scores. Nelson placed fourth at the Pac-10s just three shots off the leader. In the fall, Nelson fired a final round 69 at the Husky Invitational tying for seventh with a 222.

Kang (Kailua, HA) led the Beavers at the NCAA West Regional tying for 55th carding a 74-78-72—224. With the exception of two tournaments, Kang never placed lower than 39th and placed in the top 10 three times. He finished the year averaging 75 shots per 18 holes.

"Kevin, Birk and Anthony have played the most of anybody on our team," Altman said. "They've all had success at the college level, they've experienced the up side and down side of golf, and that has really helped the mature and become more consistent."

In the fall, freshman Charles Kingsbaker (Scottsdale, AZ) shined for OSU averaging a team best 74 shots per round. Kingsbaker played in three of four tournaments placing in the top 20 in all three events. He fired a 2-under 70 in the final round of the Nike Northwest Classic tying for 13th with a 1-over 217. Kingsbaker rallied from a disappointing first round of 79 to fire back-to-back rounds of 71 tying for 19th at the Robertson Homes Invitational.

Another youngster making an impact is sophomore Marty James (Clarksdale, AZ). Last spring, James tied a school record when he scorched the North Ranch Country Club posting a 5-under 66 in the final round of the Southwestern Intercollegiate. James finished in the top 20 in three of nine tournaments and averaged 74.9 strokes.

"Marty and Charles have had a lot of experience in junior golf and they've earned quite a few accomplishments at a young age," Altman said. "Instead of wondering if they would play, they came to OSU knowing they would play."

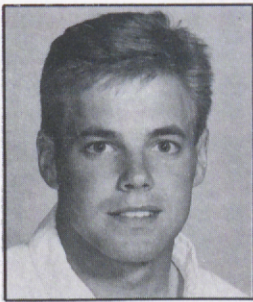
Junior Dan Ostrin (Albany) emerged late in the season and took his level of play up a step. Ostrin was called upon to play in the last three tournaments of the year after competing in only two preceding events. He competed in the U.S. Intercollegiate, Pac-10's and the NCAA West Regional averaging just over 75 shots per 18 holes. Ostrin opened with rounds of 71 and 74 in the regionals before slipping in the final round. In the fall, Ostrin led OSU at the Nike Northwest Classic shooting a even-par 216 tying for 11th.

Junior Casey Winters (Toledo, WA) saw significant action last year and in the fall. Winters played in five tournaments last spring and was one of two golfers to play in every tournament in the fall. Infatuated with improving his play, Winters played in 13 tournaments over the summer. He led the Beavers at the UCLA Pioneer Classic tying for 18th shooting 231.

Sophomore D'arby English (Auburn, WA) looks to get back into the swing of things after redshirting last season. The Beavers lone newcomers are freshmen Alex Palm (Roseburg) and Darin Vaughan (Spokane, WA). Palm will redshirt this season while Vaughan competed in three fall tournaments.

"For the first time in a long time, we have tremendous depth on this team," Altman said. "The players we have don't like to finish in the middle of the pack. These guys want to compete at the highest level and they expect a lot of themselves."

In just his third year as head coach of the Oregon State men's golf team, Steve Altman has rallied a program that was awash in mediocrity. Last spring Altman guided the Beavers

to the NCAA West Regional for the first time since 1973, and the team appears headed for its second straight appearance.

Altman played on the OSU golf team from 1987-89 and was the team's most valuable player in 1988. He also served as the team captain in 1987 and 1988. Altman averaged 74.9 shots per round his senior year, and finished with a career mark of just over 76 strokes per 18 holes.

Steve was recruited by the University of Arizona after graduating from South Salem High School in 1985, but returned to Oregon the following year. Altman earned a degree in economics in 1989 and began working as a sales representative for the Head Sports Golf Company in Arizona and Nevada. He also worked as an assistant golf professional at Progress Downs Golf Course in Portland.

Altman was hired as the men's golf coach in September, 1991 and worked at Trysting Tree Golf Club as an assistant pro until this fall. Steve believes working as a full-time coach will help the program become as competitive as ever. Altman is hoping to get his amateur standing back and has plans of running junior golf camps during the summers.

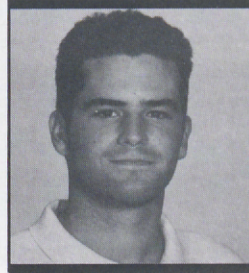
An advocate of education, Steve has set up study tables and provided tutors for his players. Because very few players actually turn professional and enjoy successful golf careers, Altman stresses the importance of a college degree.

Altman continues to seek new ways to improve his players skills by upgrading their practice sessions. An avid believer of the short game, Altman has fine tuned the practice area where his players can constantly work on their game from within 100 yards. Altman's long term goal is to make the Beavers a regional and national power while emphasizing the student-athlete. He wants to recruit players with the desire to compete and excel in the classroom as well as on the golf course.

Qualifying for the NCAA Golf Championships is Altman's goal this spring. With most of his team returning from last year, Altman feels his team holds an excellent shot of attaining this goal.

Recently, Steve married Kirstin Lynn Leek from Corvallis and is looking forward to settling down.
