



Wayne Valley Field

Oregon State University has constructed the nation's most modern track and field facility when it was dedicated March 30, 1974.

The USA's first international track (400 Meters), Wayne Valley Field is made of the most resilient surfacing yet produced. Although it is ironically called a Chevron 440 track, the 400 meter facility is one of the nation's most imaginative and modernistic facility in terms of layout, surface, spectator viewing and provision for electronic aids. All electronic connections are installed with world record distances possible in all field events and running events.

Wayne Valley Field is named in memory of the late Wayne Valley, a former student-athlete who died in 1969 and in recognition of major contributions which his father by the same name, also an OSU graduate, has made to the athletic program.

Wayne Valley Sr. is a highly-successful businessman in the Bay Area and was at one time a principal owner of the Oakland Raiders professional football team. The late son was a lineman on the 1964, 1965 and 1966 OSU football teams. In 1964, he went to the Rose Bowl coached by Tommy Prothro. He drowned while on a picnic outing near Mehama, Oregon in 1969.

The facility has a seating capacity of 4,000 currently with portable bleachers for seating with the possibility of expansion in the near future along with other facilities for Wayne Valley Field.

Oregon State University is Oregon's oldest state-supported institution of higher learning. It uses Oct. 27, 1868 as its Charter Day.

Like many of the leading public universities in the U.S., Oregon State was established as a Land Grant or ''people's college'' under the historic Morrill Act signed by President Abraham Lincoln. The act provided grants of lands to the various states to start public colleges that would extend educational opportunities to all who had the will and ability to learn.

In its early years, the school was located in ''downtown Corvallis.'' A 35-acre farm was purchased in 1870 for a new college campus west of town. The first building, Benton Hall, was completed in 1888.

In the beginning, the curriculum was typical of the colleges of the period. There was a classical course leading to the Bachelor of Arts degree and a scientific course leading to the Bachelor of Science.

Agriculture was added in 1869 under the impetus of the Land Grant Act. Commerce, household economy and engineering courses came soon too and in 1908, four professional schools were established: Agriculture, Commerce, Engineering, and Home Economics.

With 16,630 students now, Oregon State offers a complete university curriculum. The College of Science and the College of Liberal Arts are the largest academic units. Schools include Agriculture, Business and Technology, Education, Engineering, Forestry, Home Economics, Oceanography, Pharmacy, and a Division of Health and Physical Education.

OSU's 400-acre, tree-lined campus now has about 100 buildings and research laboratories. Classroom buildings, the library, and student activity areas are located in the center. Residence halls and research areas are on the edges.

In September 1971, Oregon State was designated by the U.S. Commerce Department as one of the nation's first four Sea Grant colleges as well. As such, it is charged with leadership in the wise development of marine resources.

Oregon State's ocean research vessels (four) are docked at Newport on the Oregon Coast, just 55 miles from the campus. The university's Marine Science Center there has become one of the top tourist attractions in the Northwest.

The Coaching Staff Frank Morris — Head Track Coach

Frank Morris, 46, a highly successful assistant track coach at the University of Oregon since 1973, is the new head track coach at OSU.



Morris had coached and developed some of the nation's top athletes in the weight, hurdles, jumping events and the decathlon. Former world record holder and Olympic champion Mac Wilkins in the discus is one of Frank's greatest supporters and credits Morris' coaching for his success.

Morris is a 1961 graduate of Oregon with a B.S. degree in Education. He completed his M.A. in Education at Oregon in 1972. From 1962 through 1972, he coached football, basketball as well as track on the high school level in Oregon, first at Powers, then Rogue River and the final two years at Sprinofield.

A 1951 graduate of Medford high school, Morris was a star in football, basketball and track. He is a former state record holder in the high and low hurdles and his record in the highs stood for eight years. He competed in track as a freshman at Washington before transferring to Oregon. He was the Northern Division champion at Washington in the high and low hurdles.

He is a member of the U.S. Olympic Development staff and was a coach for the West team in the first National Sports Festival two years ago. Last year he was the Meet Director for the Sports Festival and the head coach for the United States Decathlon team which competed against Canada, Great Britain and the Soviet Union last August.

Frank has gained the respect of those he trains having coached four athletes over 200 feet in the discus, four over 60 feet in the shot put, hurdlers under 14.0 in the highs, decathlete Craig Brigham who has scored over 8,000 points and an NCAA runnerup in the pole vault.

OSU athletic director Dee Andros commented upon the hiring of Morris, 'Frank is just an outstanding selection and will do a fantastic job of rebuilding our track program.'' Upon his appointment Morris commented, ''My immediate goal is to get our dual meets back on proper schedule, put some people in the stands and attract some outstanding athletes to Oregon State.'' If his first year's work in recruiting with the likes of Ken Scott, Ron Schmidt, Mike Miller, Dick Oldfield, Lyle Purdue and Mike Roe are any indication of things to come, OSU track is back.

Vic Casteel — Assistant Coach

Vic Casteel, 32, is the Beavers new assistant track coach under new head mentor Frank Morris. Casteel, is a native of Amity, Oregon, having



graduated from there in 1966. He then proceeded to 0.C.E. where he graduated in 1970 with a Physical Education degree. He then did post graduate work at the University of Oregon. At OCE, Casteel lettered in track, cross country and basketball. He was a four-year lettermen in track.

From 1971-74 he was the head track coach at McKenzie high school leading them to a state championship in cross country in 1973 following a runnerup finish in track in 1972. He had dual meet records of 6-2, 7-1 and 7-1 while coaching two 2-time state individual champions.

In 1975 he was the cross country coach at Sheridan High school before moving on for a year at OCE as an assistant, in charge of the distance runners. Since 1977, he had been the head track and cross country coach at McNary high school in Salem.

In 1973, he was voted the state A cross country coach of the year in the prep ranks. He will be working primarily with the OSU distance runners. He is married to the former Pam Pillette and has one daughter, Karen, 2.

1980 OSU Track Outlook

With the hiring of Frank Morris as the Beavers new head track coach, many feel that Oregon State track will be back on the map nationally before long. With the new coach has come already a new organization of the program along with some excellent recruits to go along with a small nucleus of returning veterans who surprised with a strong showing at the NCAA finale last spring.

The Beavers closed out last track season with a 15th placing, scoring 17 points as All-American sprinter Kasheef Hassan won the NCAA 400-meter in a school record 45.18 clocking while Tim Fox took third place with a new career-best 202-3 mark in the discus, the second longest throw in OSU history. Dan Fulton was the other scorer with a sixth place showing in the 5,000 meter run in another school record time of 13:50.27. Fulton has graduated but nearly the rest of the team returns. Although intermediate hurdler Andrew Fields and Hassan have decided to red-shirt this coming track season, Hassan will concentrate on qualifying for the Olympics for his native country, Sudan.

The Beavers sprint corps is thin but does have talented Mike Washington (10.8, 21.2) returning for both the 100 and 200 meters while freshman John Anderson from Aloha High School (22.04, 48.2) will add depth. He won the Oregon prep 400 last year and anchored the state winning 400 relay team. Chester Pepple (48.2) will also run in the 400 with the absence of Hassan this year.

The 800 meter will be a young but very talented group of freshmen providing the points. Tigard-product Mike Miller (1:50.73) won the state last year in record time while Corvallis High star Dick Oldfield (1:52.87) will compete there along with all-star Lyle Purdue (1:52.9) the state winner at the AA level. At 1500, senior Rick Kumm (3:45.2) returns along with talested containing the product of the state way. talented sophomore Mark Fricker, who ran a 3:47.0 last year.

The distance corps is thin with Yair Karni leading the way with bests in the 5,000 (14:43.0) and 10,000 (31:21.0) while Jim Langley, Bob Green, Tim Cobb and transfer Dave East from Oregon will add depth.

The hurdlers could be the most talented group for the Beavers this year. Senior Ken Spearing returns after a year's absence due to injury. Spearing has a best of 14.2 in the high hurdles but he will be pushed by freshman sensation Ken Scott from Beaverton's Aloha High School, Scott had the state best times in both the highs and intermediates with 14.3 and 36.1 clockings. His intermediate time was the fastest prep time in the nation last year. He added that by winning the prestigious Golden West Invitational intermediates with a 52.29 time for the collegiate barriers. He also finished third in the national AAU meet, lowering his best to an excellent 52.08. Add to the hurdle list talented Mark White in the intermediates (53.4) who was hurt all last spring but had the 3rd fastest time as a prep junior in the country. The potential is there for the Beavers to be strong. Especially when Fields returns next year with his best of 51.46.

In the weights, seniors Tim Fox and Tom Schillinger will lead the way. Fox has a best of 202-3 in the discus with Schillinger threatening with a 188-7 toss. Schillinger leads in the shot put with a best of 55-7. Add to this group talented freshman Ron Schmidt, whose older brother Butch, holds the OSU record for the shot with a 64-2 toss in 1975. Ron has some impressive credentials of his own with a state A mark of 63-111¼ in the shot and a 187-6 toss in the discus last spring at Wahtonka high school near The Dalles. Fox, Schillinger and Art Klosterman will provide the competition for the Beavers in the hammer as well.

In the jumping events, Dave Grossnicklaus returns in the high jump with a best of 6-10 but freshman Mike Roe from Siuslaw high school has already gone that high last year to set a new state mark for AA schools. Also Scott Watkins (6-8) will be a threat. The Beavers are not strong in the long jump with transfer Karl Koenig (23-11 $\frac{1}{4}$) with the best mark while triple jumpers John Launer (48-0 $\frac{1}{2}$), a sophomore and freshmen Brett Starr (45-11 $\frac{3}{4}$) and John Keizer (45-0) have potential.

In the javelin, Bruce Alexander (241-1) returns for his senior year but has been plagued with injuries. JC transfers Mike Hesseltine (241-0) and Rich Wolf (228-0) could also score points. In the pole vault, freshman redshirt Shannon Sullivan shows signs of being a great one having already gone 16-6 last year while Dennis Hackney (15-6) will back him up.

In decathlon competition for the conference and national meets, the Beavers will send Tim Sim, Ted Whiteman and Kit Redman to the line. Sim has a best of 7,170 points which he scored his senior year at Central Linn high school two years ago. He did not participate in track last year. He won three straight Oregon AAU decathlon championships and finished second in the national AAU junior Olympics. He was high point man for the 1977 state meet and holds the state AA record with a 13.9 clocking in the high hurdles. Whiteman has a best of 6,311 while Redman has scored 6.180 in limited action.

against Washington State at Wayne Valley Field . . . finished a disappointing eighth in the Pac-10 conference meet last year with a 215-3 mark . . . left-handed thrower who has improved his best from 224-6 his sophomore year . . . was injured two years ago and then redshirted . he threw in only six meets last year . . could be a big boost for the Beavers this season if he can regain his form and improve upon it . . . born 8/17/57.

JOHN ANDERSON, 6-0, 165, Fr., Beaverton (Aloha) — One of the Beavers top recruits from the Oregon prep ranks this year . . . he was




one of the top sprinters in the state last year at Aloha high school ... he anchored the state winning 400 relay team in a meet record time of 42.24 . . . John also won the state 400 meter run in 48.71 last spring . . . as a junior, he was 5th in the 400 at the state meet . . . he has bests of 10.6 in the 100 meters, 22.1 (200) and 48.2 in the 400 meters . . . he will be one of the Beavers top 400 meter runners this year especially if Kasheef Hassan redshirts for the Olympics . . . he could also see some action in the 200 meters for 0SU as well as the relays born 9/13/60.

ANDREW FIELDS, 5-10, 168, Sr., Sacramento, CA (Grant) — Andrew is going to redshirt this year like Hassan and come back the following



track season for the Beavers . . . he has been the top intermediate hurdler at OSU lately . . . has a best of 51.46, which he ran his sophomore year and ranks as the fourth best in OSU history . . . he finished fifth at the conference meet that year . . . was also the team's most improved athlete his sophomore year . . . last season ran only 52.2 and that was in the first meet of the year . . failed to place in the conference meet as well . . . can run the open 400 meters as well . . . will give the Beavers great depth at the hurdles upon his return with the top recruits Morris brought in . . . born 3/15/58.

TIM FOX, 6-1, 225, Sr., Bend — Tim had an exceptional year last spring winning the discus in the Pac-10 conference meet and finishing third at



the NCAA's with a career best of 202-3 . . . that is second only to former All-American Tim Vollmer's school record of 204-2 which Fox hopes to surpass this year . . . he was very consistent throughout the season last year with all his marks over the 190-feet barrier culminating with his win over Oregon's Ray Burton at the Pac-10's and his placing ahead of him at the NCAA's . . also throws the shot put for the Beavers when needed . . also throws the hammer with a best of 186-7, the second best mark in the school history as well, behind 2-time All-American Steve

DeAutremont's (1970) record of 207-2 . . . his best came against Colorado last spring . . . born 12/29/56.

MARK FRICKER, 5-10, 165, Soph., Hemet, CA (Hemet) — Mark is considered one of the Beavers top hopefuls in the middle distances . . . has



an 800 meter best of 1:51.0 which he ran against Washington last spring as a freshman . . . he also will double in the 1500 meter run where he has a high best of 3:47.6 but has yet to meet that mark in college . . . has run a 3:50.8 at OSU . . . he did not place at the Pac-10 meet last year but should improve with an additional year of seasoning . . . finished fourth in the California state meet in the 800 his senior year . . . placed in both the international prep meet and the Golden West Invitational meet two years ago . . . other prep bests were 4:07.9 in the mile and 49.4 in the 440 . . . born 11/23/59.

DAVE GROSSNICKLAUS, 6-3, 176, Sr., Shedd (Central Linn) — Dave will push for the number one high jumping position on the Beaver squad



this year . . . has a career best of 6-10 set against Washington last spring . . . he lost both his state meet and state AA high jump records to incoming freshman Mike Roe of Siuslaw this past spring . . . he was a consistent 6-8 jumper last year finishing ninth in the Pac-10's at that height . . . will need to improve his heighth if he is going to score consistently this year for the Beavers . . . was a walk-on for the OSU basketball team the past two years also . . . had a best of 6-7½ in high school . . . born 4/16/58.

KASHEEF HASSAN, 5-9, 150, Jr., Khartown, Sudan — The premier athlete on the Beavers squad but will redshirt this season to prepare for



the Olympics and run for his country, Sudan . . . has a long list of accomplishments from last year as he won the 1979 World Cup 400 meters (45.39), set a new OSU record in the 400 meters winning the NCAA's in 45.18, the 8th fastest time in the world last year, won the Pac-10's in 45.39 while winning 10 of the 11 races he ran in last spring . . . this year he is ranked No. 2 in the World at 400 meters . . . his redshirting will hurt the Beavers but his return in a year, along with Morris's second recruiting season, should give the Beavers guite an improved look . . . he was a

member of the Sudan Olympic team in 1976 that boycotted while in 1978 he won both the 400 (45.23) and the 200 meters (20.77) at the African Games . . . he also set a World Indoor record of 46.6 at the Ali Meet in 1978 but was disqualified later . . . was ranked 9th in the world in 1978 . . . born 3/26/56.

MIKE HESSELTINE, 6-5, 228, Jr., DuBois, Wyoming (DuBois) — Mike is a transfer from Linn-Benton Community College where he finished 12th in




the nation last year in the NJCAA javelin finals ... originally was at Ricks College where he was named that team's outstanding track athlete where he won the conference shot put title and finished second in the javelin ... has a best of 241-0 but has vastly improved according to the OSU coaching staff so is expected to be a big boost this year, barring injuries ... could become the Beavers number one thrower ... attended DuBois high school in Wyoming originally ... has sat out two years previously ... born 12/19/54.

YAIR KARNI, 5-9, 150, Jr., Kibbutz Haogen, Israel — Is one of the Beavers top distance runners, although the distance corps is thin . . .



ran his first 10,000 meters of the year in the Pac-10 conference meet last spring finishing eighth in 31:28.6 . . . was used primarily in the steeplechase last year with a best of 9:09.29 against Washington State . . . comes from Israel where he holds five national records from the 800 through the 3000 meter steeplechase . . has a mile best of 4:06.6 and a 1500 best of 3:49.1 . . . will run the 5,000, 10,000 and steeplechase for OSU this spring . . . born 5/17/51.

RICK KUMM, 6-2, 165, Sr., Salem (Sprague) — One of the Beavers top returning middle distance runners . . . has had tremendous potential



ever since graduating from Sprague high school where he won the 800 meters and the mile races at the state AAA meet. . . has been bothered by injuries throughout his career . . . ran the 800 and 1500 primarily last year but didn't race after the Washington meet in the middle of the season . . . has a best of 1:50.5 in the 800 and 3:45.2 in the 1500 meter run for the Beavers . . his 1:51.4 converted 880 time in high school is the 4th fastest ever in Oregon prep history while his 3:48.1 converted mile time is also the 4th best ever . . . opened up last season with an 8:45.48


two-mile time in the OSU Preview meet, the third fastest in OSU history but tailed off from there on . . . his 800 best last year was only 1:51.6 while his 1500 best in 1979 was 3:47.37 . . . born 6/19/58.

JOHN LAUNER, 6-2, 165, Soph., Salem (South) — He was the Beavers top triple jumper last year but needs to improve considerably if he is



going to consistently score points for the Beavers this year . . . had a disappointing freshman year after coming to OSU from South Salem high school where he had the state best prep mark the year before at $48\text{-}0^{1/2}$. . . finished second in the state meet with only a $44\text{-}9^{1/2}$ jump . . . had a best of $44\text{-}9^{3/4}$ last year for the Beavers . . . he did not qualify for any post-season meets for OSU but is expected to make a turnaround this year . . . born 10/28/60.

MIKE MILLER, 6-0, 160, Fr., Tigard — Mike comes to Oregon State with impressive credentials from Tigard high school . . . he won the state



AAA 800 meters in a record time of 1:50.73, which was also his personal best . . . he also won his qualifyng heat at the state meet last year . . . Miller won the Wilco league 800 as well and has improved considerably since his junior year when his best was only 1:56.4, which did rank him 18th in the state that year . . his PR ranked him with the No. 1 time in the state last year and was the 6th fastest time in the nation . . as a senior, Mike also was the Wilco league cross country champion and finished 13th in the state cross country meet . . . has a best of 4:07 in the

1500 meters but will mainly concentrate on the 800 for the Beavers as one of three freshmen expected to run there . . . was named to the high school All-American track team for his state meet efforts . . . is a three-year track letterman and two-year cross country award winner . . . born 9/5/60.

DICK OLDFIELD, 6-3, 165, Fr., Corvallis (Corvallis) — Dick has been one of the top prep half-milers in the state the past two years at Corvallis high



school . . has had the third fastest time in the state both his junior and senior years with a best last year of 1:52.87 . . . as a senior, he finished third in the state AAA meet but won the Valley league 800 title . . . as a junior, he finished second in the state meet . . he joins an excellent recruited group of 800 runners in Miller and Purdue . . Dick also led the Spartans to a perfect 13-0 record in football as he quarterbacked the 1978 team to the state championship . . he also was selected to the North-South Shrine football game last summer . . his football teams were

29-3 during his three varsity years . . . also was 55-21 in three years of basketball which saw him named second team on the all-tournament team at state and to the all-league team . . . has been named all-state in track the past two years . . . born 12/5/60.

CHESTER PEPPLE, 6-2, 175, Fr., Roseburg — Chester was redshirted last year as a freshman so still has four years left at OSU . . . will



concentrate on the 400 meters and relays for the Beavers . . . had the second fastest time in the state a year ago with a 48.2 clocking . . . also has a best of 22.1 in the 200 meters . . he finished second at the state meet in the 400 to Beaver footballer Mike Smith with a time of 48.24 . . . he also anchored Roseburg to a win at the state meet in the mile relay . . . has also run the 800 meters with a best of 1:55.9 his senior year . . . born

LYLE PURDUE, 5-8, 140, Fr., Brookings — Lyle is another top freshman middle distance runner the Beavers brought in this year . . . running for



AA Brookings high school, Lyle was a two-time AA winner of the state 800 meters . . . has a best of 1:52.9 which was the state's best mark at all levels until teammate Mike Miller clipped it with his winning effort at the state meet . . . as a junior, he had the best time on the AA level with a 1:54.1 clocking and improved it with his PR last year . . . his senior year, Lyle helped Brookings to the state cross country championship (AA) in 1978 . . . as a sophomore, he finished third at state in the 400 and followed it with his two consecutive titles at the 800 level his final two years

as a prepper won the 1,000-yard run at the Oregon Indoor as well . . . ran a 1:53.2 clocking in the Pre-Classic last summer and finished sixth at the Golden West Invitational with a 1:53.69 . . . born 2/23/61.

MIKE ROE, 6-3, 175, Fr., Florence (Siuslaw) — Mike comes to Oregon State hoping to build upon the fine high jumping tradition that the



Beavers have and if his high school credentials are any indication, he could do just that . . . he is a two-time AA state high jump champion . . . won his district three straight years . . . as a junior, he had a best of 6-7, the top mark in the AA ranks and went on to win the state title . . . as a senior, he won the state meet again with a record jump of 6-8 but recorded a PR of 6-10 last year, the best mark in the state on any level . . . he is a 'flopper' in style and head coach Frank Morris feels with added strength he could be the Beavers next 7-0 high jumper having had seven

already . . . lettered four years in track and three in basketball where he was all-league all three . . . Siuslaw won their league and finished 5th at state as well . . . helped lead Siuslaw to the state AA track title last year with his winning high jump mark, finishing third in the triple jump (45-134) . . . born 11/10/60.

TOM SCHILLINGER, 6-1, 245, Sr., Burns — Tom has been a valuable addition to the track program since he transferred from Wyoming after his



freshman year . . . as a sophomore at OSU, he took third in the discus at the conference championships with a best of 182-6 and 55-7 in the shot put, the 10th best effort ever at OSU . . . he was named the Beavers most valuable track athlete after that year . . . last year he improved his discus best to 188-7, the third best ever at OSU but could only throw 52-7¼ in the shot put, down from a year ago . . . he also has a best of 157-4 in the hammer . . . his 188-7 effort came against Oregon last year in the discus, behind Tim Fox's 194-0 effort . . . he finished sixth in the

conference discus competition with a 187-6 but failed to place . . . has been the Beavers most consistent defensive lineman the past two years and has been named honorable mention all-conference . . . as a prepper at AA Burns high school, Tom won both the AA state shot put and discus titles and holds the all-time state high school best in the discus with a 194-0 heave . . . also had a prep best of 59-6½ in the shot and 195-0 in the javelin . . . he set his discus mark at the state meet in Corvallis in 1975 . . . he was also an all-state offensive and defensive tackle and earned prep All-America honors . . . he was the state AA heavyweight wrestling champion as well . . . should be the Beavers No. 1 shot putter this year again and is hoping to crack the 190-foot level this year in the discus . . . born 1/30/57.

RON SCHMIDT, 6-4, 220, Fr., The Dalles (Wahtonka) — Ron has been the premier weight man in Oregon the past two years at Wahtonka high



school . . . he has won the state titles in both the shot put and discus at the AA level his junior year and at the A level last year as Wahtonka moved down a level . . . he would have won at any level last year with bests of 63-11¼ in the shot put, smashing the state meet record on the A level and 179-10 in the discus . . . the discus mark was not his best as he has recorded a best of 187-6 which ranked 11th in the country last year, while his shot put mark was the 10th best in the nation . . his 63-11¼ best in the shot is the second best effort ever in Oregon at any level behind Curt

Denny's mark of 64-9½ he set in 1975 at AA Burns . . . his discus best (187-6) is the 6th best ever in the state . . . he lettered two years in basketball being named all-league his senior year and three years in football while playing in the Shrine game last year as well . . . he helped lead Wahtonka to the league track title as well . . . he is the younger brother of OSU shot put record holder (64-2) Butch Schmidt who graduated in 1975 . . . born 6/19/61.

KEN SCOTT, **6-3**, **175**, **Fr.**, **Beaverton (Aloha)** — Ken comes into the program with probably the best credentials of any athlete . . . after missing



the state meet as a junior, Scott pushed to the head of the hurdling corps in the state by winning both the 110 meter high hurdles and the 300 meter intermediate hurdles races at the AAA state meet . . . his time of 36.1 at the state meet was a new state record and was the fastest time in the nation . . . he then followed that with a win at the prestigious Golden West Invitational running the 400 meter intermediates in 52.08, the second fastest prep time at that distance in the country . . . he was the high point individual at the 1979 state meet with 25 points as Aloha High School

finished second (51 points) behind South Eugene by only three points . . . besides his wins in both hurdles, he and fellow teammate John Anderson alternated anchoring the winning mile and 400 meter relays . . . his best in the high hurdles is 14.3 . . . he led the state with fastest times in both events . . . the 400 meter relay time of 42.24 set a new state record as well . . . was named the outstanding graduating athlete at Aloha . . . also won both hurdles and relays in Metro league . . has PR's of 10.8 in 100, 21.42 in 200 and 47.8 in the open 400 . . . was named the most valuable 1979 track man in Who's Who in Oregon track and MVP at Aloha too . . . born 4/18/61.

TIM SIM, 6-1, 192, Fr., Halsey (Central Linn) — Tim participated in spring football last year so will be entering the track program as a freshman



this season as a decathlete . . . one of the most heralded athletes to come out of the state, Sim, as a senior, scored 26 ¼ points of Central Linn's 41 state championship AA points by winning the 110 high hurdles and the 300 meter intermediates, placing third in the long jump and running a leg on the 400 meter relay team that finished sixth . . . he also was the high point man the year before with 26 points . . . he holds the state AA record for his 13.9 clocking in the high hurdles and has a best of 38.9 in the intermediates . . . he has won three straight Oregon AAU decathlon champion-

ships, the last time with a record 7,170 points . . . as a junior, he finish-

ed second in the national AAU junior olympics decathlon with 6,903 points . . . his decathlon track bests are: 100-11.1, long jump - 22-3, shot put - 45-10, high jump - 6-4, 400 - 50.3, 110 HH - 13.9, discus -133-8, pole vault - 12-10, javelin - 170-1 and the 1500 meters - 4:43.0 . . he earned 11 varsity letters at Central Linn high school . . . was named "Prep Athlete of the Year" by the Eugene Register-Guard for leading Central Linn to the track title and to the school's first-ever appearances in the state football playoffs and basketball tournaments . . he was all-state in both sports and rushed for over 2,000 yards as a tailback during his career while scoring nearly 20 points a game his senior year in basketball . . . he was a starting tailback for the Beavers in football his freshman year although he was injured last year for most of the season . . . born 3/5/60.

KEN SPEARING, 6-2, 185, Sr., Portland (Madison) — Ken redshirted last year due to an injury and is expected to lend experience if not talent to an




already strong hurdle group for the Beavers . . . originally from Portland's Madison high school, Ken was the state AAA high hurdles champion as a senior and had a best of 14.0 in the preps . . he also was a decathlete while scoring 6,530 points in the decathlon . . . has improved his PR at Oregon State from 14.4 in the highs as a freshman to 14.2 two years ago as a junior . . . his 14.0 prep time ranks as the eighth fastest time ever in Oregon tieing him with four others . . . his 38.2 converted intermediate time is the 7th best ever in the state . . . born 9/7/57.

BRETT STARR, 6-3, 178, Fr., Portland (Jackson) — Brett was the state triple jump champion last year from Portland's Jackson high school with



a mark of 45-11¼, also the top distance in the state last year . . . as a junior, he placed sixth in the state with a jump of 43-6¼ but had a best that year of 45-1, the 6th best mark that year . . . he was a walk-on wide receiver for the Oregon State football team last fall but is expected to devote full time to track this spring . . he has the potential to be the Beavers best triple jumper but needs to improve his marks considerably if he is going to place consistently in dual meets . . . born 5/4/61.

SHANNON SULLIVAN, 6-0, 170, Fr., Troutdale (Reynolds) — Shannon is the number one pole vault prospect for the Beavers after redshirting his



freshman year last season . . . two years ago, Shannon as a senior at Reynolds high school, finished second in the state meet with a vault of 14-8, which was also the third best mark that year in the state . . . he later cleared 15-0 for his prep best . . . since then he has cleared 16-6 at OSU in his limited competition showing great improvement and promise for the future . . head coach Frank Morris feels he could be the Beavers next 17-foot pole vaulter . . . he also finished second in the state decathlon his senior year listing bests in the decathlon as 11.5 (100), 23.6 (200), 51.7

(400), 4:36 in the 1500, 21-7 in the long jump, 150-feet in the javelin, 42-6 in the shot put, 140 (discus), 15.0 (HH), 39.7 (IH) and his high school prep best of 15-0 in the pole vault . . . he obviously has improved all these marks since his graduation . . . could double up in the decathlon for the Beavers as well this spring . . . born 10/15/59.

MIKE WASHINGTON, 6-1, 183, Soph., Sacramento, CA (Burbank) -Mike is the top OSU sprinter returning but had an up and down season



last year . . . he has a best of 10.8 in the 100 meters but has run a 9.64 100-yarder in high school so the potential is there for improvement . . . his 200 meter best at OSU is 21.49 and ran a 21.2 wind-aided mark in high school . . . had a hest of 10.56 in the 100 meters his junior year at Burbank high school in Sacramento . . . he was the Metro league champion, the sectional winner, sub-sectional champion while also placing in the Golden West Invitational and AAU Junior Olympics . . . he ran only a 22.13 in the Pac-10 meet failing to place . . . he ran in only three dual meets

. a healthy year with improvement could really help the due to injuries . .

talent-thin sprint corps for the Beavers . . . born 6/18/60.

MARK WHITE, 6-1, 155, Soph., Richmond, CA (Richmond) - Mark returns as another top Oregon State hurdler but struggled somewhat his



freshman year with injuries and so his performances were down . . . is expected back to full strength though this spring . . . ran the intermediates only twice last year with a best of 53.5 . . . ran the highs twice but struggled to a 14.7 best . . . in high school, he had the second fastest intermediate time in the nation at 53.53 in the 440 IH . . . he went to the state meet three years in a row while also competing on the junior USA team in Japan and Canada . . . his high school best in the highs was 14.0 and he also ran

a 1:55.6 880-yard time as a prepper . . . also ran a 48.8 quarter in high school . . . Mark's twin brother, Mike, is a top 800-meter runner at California . . . could be a big help if he returns

to top form . . . born 4/19/59.

RICH WOLF, 6-2, 165, Soph., Eugene (Churchill-Lane CC) - Rich transferred to Oregon State from Lane Community College in Eugene after



only one year there . . . a much improved javelin thrower, Rich began with a best of 197-3 as a junior, the 10th best in the state . . . then he repeated as the league champion his senior year and went on to finish second in the state meet with a 202-11 throw . . . his best though was 224-5, the second best toss in the state that year . . at Lane CC. he set a new school mark with a 241-10 toss, won the OCCAA league javelin title, finished second at the regionals and then took a second place at the NJCAA nationals making first

team All-American . . . that toss was the fourth best in junior college history . . . he enters OSU as a sophomore . . . born 12/11/59.

A Look at OSU's National High Jump History

Many called it the High Jump Capital of the World as Oregon State, at one time, was the only school in NCAA history to have three 7-foot high jumpers on the same team, or to have three 7-4 high jumpers from the same school. OSU also had America's top woman high jumper, at the time, in Joni Huntley. She was the first American woman to clear 6-0 and had a best of 6-23/4 at Oregon State.








OSU NCAA Cross Country Champions In 1961

Oregon State, led by All-American Dale Story, captured its first and so far only NCAA championship, a cross country title in 1961.

On that winning team were Story, Rich Cuddihy, Bill Boyd, Cliff Thompson and Jerry Brady. Sam Bell, now at Indiana, was the head coach of the national champions for the Beavers.

Story, a former national high school mile record holder from Orange, Ca. who had transferred to OSU that fall from Santa Ana JC as only a sophomore, won the individual championship with a time of 19:46.6 over the 4-mile course at Michigan State in East Lansing, Michigan. He outdistanced his nearest competitor by eleven seconds.

Other OSU placers were Cuddihy finishing 12th, Boyd in 16th, then Thompson at 25th and Brady at 51st. Story's split times were 10:04.4 at the 2-mile mark and 14:53.0 at the 3-mile mark.
