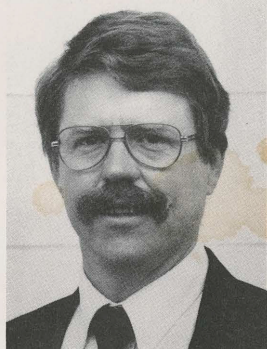

THE COACHING STAFF

DAVE EMIGH

**Seventh-year OSU Head Coach
Ninth-year Men's Coach**
Washington State University
graduate (BA 1973, MS 1979)



Emigh started rowing at Washington State University in 1971. He raced for the WSU Rowing Club during the 1972 and 1973 seasons. He then became a member of the Lake Washington Rowing Club. Emigh competed in open races through 1982.

Emigh coached at Washington State for four years (1976-79). WSU finished fourth in the Pacific-10 during those years. In 1979, the eight year old WSU Rowing Club won the Varsity-4 Intercollegiate National Rowing Championship.

Oregon State won the Intercollegiate Freshman-4 with coxswain and finished second in the Varsity-4 with coxswain during Emigh's first season. In 1987 the men's lightweight 8 boat was the first OSU boat to claim a victory at the San Diego Crew Classic. The 1987 lightweight 8 finished fourth in the nation (OSU's highest finish for an 8 at the National Championships).

Emigh coached at the U.S. Olympic festival in 1989. Nine current or former Beaver rowers won medals in the 1989 U.S. Open National Championships.

ROGER PAYNE

**Seventh-year
OSU Women's Coach**
University of Washington
graduate (1976)



Payne rowed as a lightweight at the University of Washington and had a successful sculling career at the Lake Washington Rowing Club including 10 regional championships and four consecutive Canadian Henley championships in lightweight double sculls.

Roger has coached women at LWRC and Seattle Pacific University. He has worked with several national and Olympic team scullers.

Payne was head coach at the 1989 Women's Development Camp at Lake Placid, NY and at the Olympic Festival in Oklahoma City, OK. He is currently a member of the Lightweight Men's Committee of the U.S. Rowing Association.

Some successful OSU varsity women's crews under Payne include: 1985 Northwest Regional Varsity 8 champion, NW Regional Lightweight 4 Champion in 1986, Fourth place Lightweight 4 and Varsity 4 at Collegiate Rowing Championships in 1987.

After completing a very successful heavyweight career at OSU two years ago, Bjergo has taken over as the men's freshman/novice coach the past two seasons.

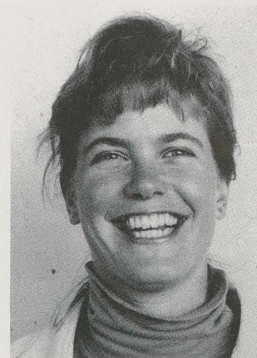
Last year, Bjergo led his lightweight 8 crew through an undefeated season and a championship at the Pacific Coast Rowing Championships. His freshman/novice 4 boat placed fourth at the PCRC's.

Karl has spent the past three summers rowing for Ted Nash at the Penn Athletic Club in Philadelphia, PA. During his career, Bjergo has won eight USRA National Championship medals including four National Championships and three Canadian Henley Championships.

OSU head coach Dave Emigh knows that Bjergo will continue to develop competitive freshman and novices. Bjergo's frosh/novice oarsmen are respected for their discipline and extremely aggressive racing style.

Kneip came to Oregon State after having a very successful rowing career at the University of Washington from 1983-1987. For the past two seasons she has been coaching the women's crew at the University of California-Davis where her 1990 crews were W.I.R.A. Champions. She has

also coached at the Lake Washington Rowing Club and at Washington and was an assistant coach at 1989 Woman's Development Camp and Olympic Festival.

"Cyndi has an excellent rowing and coaching background," said OSU women's head coach Roger Payne. "She is a very good recruiter. This has been one of our best year's ever for freshman participation.

1991 OUTLOOK

Making the Grand Finals and bringing home medals at the Pacific Coast Rowing Championships continues to be the number one goal for the Oregon State crew team.

Last season the Beavers started to take steps towards that goal, when the men's freshman/novice lightweight 8, men's freshman/novice 4, women lightweight 8, and women's novice 4 each qualified for the Grand Finals.

"Our goal is qualify every boat to the Grand Finals at the Pacific Coast Rowing Championships and bring home as many medals as possible," said sixth-year women's head coach Roger Payne.

Both Payne and head men's coach Dave Emigh agree that the boats are trying to peak at the championships, and that the racing season is used to train and prepare to be their best at the end of the season.

Once again, the Beavers have a tough early season schedule, as they face California, Stanford, Victoria, and UC-Davis in the first month. Emigh said that the tough schedule will give the coaches a chance to know where they will be seeded at the championships and what they need to do if they want to achieve their goal.

Another way that the Beavers have prepared is to build a strong freshman/novice program and to separate the heavyweights and lightweights early in their career, said Payne.

"We have set a goal to return one boat load of lightweights and two boats of heavyweights from each frosh/novice class," Payne said. "By returning two boat loads we will have the number of rowers in the varsity program we need to be competitive."

Payne and Emigh said that OSU assistants, Karl Bjergo (men's freshman/novice) and Cyndi Kneip (women's freshman/novice), are building the foundation for the future varsity crews.

Kneip is in her first year at Oregon State after coaching and rowing at Washington and California-Davis, while Bjergo is in his second as an OSU assistant.

AN INFORMAL HISTORY OF OSU CREW

In the fall of 1926, two rowing shells arrived in Corvallis on a train with the California football team. They were a gift from the California rowing club. At the time, OSU had no use for them so they were stored temporarily in the basement of Fairbanks Hall. In 1929 the Oregon State Rowing Club (OSRC) staged and won it's first race against Washington. Crew began to grow and by 1935 the club was traveling to race in California and in Washington. Crew was temporarily discontinued until the end of the second World War.

In 1950 the OSU business office purchased the 160 acres which includes the site of the present rowing facilities. Women began rowing at OSU in 1952 in an intramural program. Throughout its growth since the early thirties, the OSRC had gained recognition as a highly competitive crew and was respected throughout the nation. Acknowledgment of this came in the mid 1960's when the Varsity team organization granted the crew membership and permission to grant eight inch varsity letters. The OSU Board of Intercollegiate Athletics accepted the crew as a varsity sport in 1967. At that

THE HOME COURSE: Willamette River, Corvallis, Oregon

Oregon State Crew will use two race courses in 1989. The 2000 meter (1 1/4 miles) course will be used for the dual races against Western Washington, Class Day races, and Alumni Day these races will be held on the lower course. The lower course begins north of the boathouse around the first major corner of the river, and finishes at the end of the rock fill across Highway 20 from the east entrance to Hewlett-Packard. Good view points are at the rock fill and approximately 1/2 mile down Trysting Tree Golf Course.

For the Corvallis Regatta a 1000 meter (5/8 mile) course will be used. It begins at the corner of the river opposite the Beaver Hut Tavern, and finishes just before the Highway 34 bridge in front of the boathouse. Michael's Landing restaurant is at the approximate midpoint of the course.

FACILITIES

The facilities at the Oregon State crew docks were used by the U.S. Women's National Team in 1985 for olympic development. In 1987 they were expanded to their present size, which includes two boat houses, locker rooms, and the weight barn.

The large boathouse contains, in addition to boats and oars, a training room and a full size shop. The barn houses a video room, a complete weight lifting room, and 18 rowing ergometers.

Both OSU head coaches agree that the facilities at Oregon State are equal in size and layout of any college in America.

time acceptance was limited to the heavyweights. In 1977, both the women's crew and the men's lightweight crew were given varsity sport status.

The 1980's marked progress for the OSU crew, as they sent boats to National Championships and individual rowers to world wide prominence. In 1980 the Women's Senior 8 boat claimed both the National Open and Collegiate championships.

As the Beavers row into the 1990's even greater things are expected. Each year the team sets it's sights on a medal at th Pacific Coast Rowing Championships and a bid at the Collegiate Championships. Last season, OSU set the foundation for the future when the men's freshman/novice lightweight 8 boat went undefeated and won the PCRC championship. The women also got a strong performance from their freshman/novice program. Continued strong performance by freshman and novice programs will pay dividends in the future as they move to the varsity boats.
