- 1. Did you know a 1,000-pound duck lives on campus? Find him for the perfect place to throw your O!
- 2. Your next stop will take you from big to bigger look for two sculptures of mammoth proportions where Oregon's past is present.
- 3. Leave the past behind and look forward at UO's latest and greatest project. This crown jewel of TrackTown USA is hard to miss from anywhere on campus!
- 4. Ever thought about taking a selfie with a moon goddess? Of course you have and now's your chance! She faces a brick building that is home to one of the largest lecture rooms on campus.
- 5. Let's do the time warp! This historical room has been so well maintained it feels like a blast to the past, and has housed lectures, ceremonies, and even weddings! Find this piece of history in a building named for the first woman Regent of UO.
- 6. A famous writer and Oregon alum is immortalized on campus in a small yet beautiful courtyard of benches and blooming trees. It's a great place to sit down with a good book or just snap a selfie!
- 7. Another stunning courtyard is close nearby, and waiting to serve as a backdrop to your photoshoot. A long, thin pool of blue is flanked by two arched corridors in this beautiful spot, which serves as proof that life imitates art.

- 8. You're over halfway there which means you deserve a break! Sit down and relax at this Duck favorite right off campus for a pitcher of your favorite brew and some of the best tater tots you've ever had.
- 9. At your next stop, it's not all business. Throw your biggest O at this iconic spot for graduation photos!





# THE EMU AND YOU

The Erb Memorial Union, better known as the EMU, is the University of Oregon's epicenter for collaborating, working, creating, socializing and refueling. H. Abbot Lawrence and Ellis F. Lawrence began designing the longawaited student hub in 1945. One year later, Ellis F. Lawrence passed away. Following his father's death, H. Abbot Lawrence finalized design plans with Tucker and Wallmann. Construction of the redesigned building was completed by 1950. The trio named the building after UO war-time president, Donald Erb.

#### A Transformative Era

Over the next 49 years, the EMU underwent different stages of construction until it became the dynamic facility it is today. Some of these designs included the southeast addition, the fishbowl, alterations to the ballrooms, the amphitheater, food services and the east addition—which has been demolished since. Per the 2018 impact report, "EMU programs work across departments, divisions, and institutions to offer enriching services and events to campus and beyond."

## Safe Spaces

The Women's Center provides a wide range of services for students of every gender identity. Their mission statement is to promote social change, end oppression against all people and support personal growth. For parents attending UO, the women's center offers childcare reimbursement, work resources and lactation stations. Volunteers and staff members at the Women's center work to cultivate a safe space on campus where students can learn more about sexual violence prevention and safe sexual relationships. The Women's Center also provides free menstrual and safe sex supplies to students.

### Students and Self-care

Dealing with stress during the school term can be difficult, the Duck Nest on the ground floor of the EMU is here to help. The center is run by a group of peer-wellness advocates who dedicate their time to teaching fellow students about self-care and life balance strategies through a variety of programs. Some of the programs they provide include yoga, meditation, therapy dogs and mental well-being workshops. Student wellness advocates also put on wellness presentations for both campus and community organizations. During these presentations, they focus on stress management, sexual health, relaxation, nutrition and suicide prevention.

#### Law and Order: EMU

For students in need of legal services, the ASUO student legal services office is found on the third floor of the EMU. Since the early 70's, when it was first established, the legal office advocated for students' rights and legal awareness. Eligible students have access to three staff attorneys who will take on cases from landlord disputes to name changes. Services are funded by incidental fees for legal advice or office visits. Any anticipated costs beyond the free services are discussed before charges are applied.


### Surrender to Sustainability



The Sustainability Center, located on the ground level of the EMU, is another student service that aims to assist in student well-being. The center is responsible for the university's waste reduction program. The program provides students and faculty access to reusable bottles, tumblers and glasses. There is also a rental program in which students can borrow silverware and dishware for three hours at a time. All materials are washed upon return, so other students have access to hygienic utensils.
