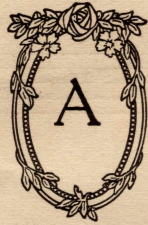

# ASHLAND, OREGON

"Oregon's Famous Spa"



At the foot of the Siskiyou mountains in Southern Oregon. In the immediate vicinity of Ashland are to be found more than fifty mineral springs including lithia, sulphur, sodium, magnesia, iron and cinnabar. Lithia Park contains 51 acres. Many attractions and amusements for visitors. Childrens playgrounds, tennis courts, croquet courts, band stand, rustic summer houses, picnic grounds with tables and seats. Scattered through the park are springs and fountains of mineral water. Adjoining Lithia Park is Chautauqua Park. The population of Ashland is about 6000.

## Crater Lake National Park

"Oregon's Mountain Playground"

Crater Lake is the principal feature of this National Park. The lake is 6177 above sea level and is surrounded by precipitous walls nearly 2000 feet high. Only one trail has ever been found leading from the rim to the waters edge. The lake is of an intense blue. This lake is the deepest of any in the world. Reached by auto stage through Medford or Kirk on Southern Pacific.

## Josephine County Caves

"Marble Halls of Oregon"

About 37 miles from Grants Pass near the California line. Their area is so extensive and their formation so intricate that they have never been fully explored. Entrance to caves is at an elevation of 4000 feet. There are four levels, the upper one has not as yet been explored.
