Byrne, planners nix parking garage next to MU

OSU President John Byrne and the Campus Planning Committee have both rejected plans for a \$2 million parking structure next to the Memorial Union that would have provided 245 parking spaces.

For two years, the Traffic Committee on campus has been studying options that would provide short-term parking on campus that would be convenient and secure. Though other sites for the complex were submitted, the site of current pay lot was judged as the most realistic by the Traffic Committee.

But the Planning Committee rejected the site where the pay lot is now located, largely for aesthetic reasons. Plans for a Kerr Library addition built on the same site will be proposed this

month.

Orville Powell, director of public safety, said the parking complex would have been required to pay for itself. He said the building would probably have been three levels, with one partially underground, and would have contained plenty of lighting and security. It was planned to be open around the clock for anyone who needed to be on campus for a few hours. Fees would have been charged on a half-hourly basis.

But the lack of parking on campus, according to studies made by the Traffic Committee, may have been only a perceived problem.

Statistics figure that only 74 percent of all campus parking is ever utilized. This includes the parking lot near Parker Stadium that has 1,478 spaces available, of which only 382 spaces are occupied at maximum usage.

Powell said parking can be found in these areas, but people dislike walking from there to the center of campus. He also said many people commute from nearby areas and find it difficult to find convenient parking on campus. Faculty, staff and students drive around trying to find a parking space close to their point of destination rather than going out a little further where there is ample parking.

Other plans to increase long-term parking space on campus are costly and would require a 50 percent raise in parking fees for staff and students in the next year. This raise would help pay for repairing existing paved lots, paving gravel lots, improving lighting and widening certain streets for more parking spaces.

Fate of McAlexander turf may be decided this week

The OSU administration will decide within the next 10 days what to do with the artificial turf in McAlexander Fieldhouse.

The artificial turf, which was installed last year, is in three sections — one section that is permanently installed and two other sections that were made to unroll and roll back up.

Unfortunately, they don't.

The mechanism designed to roll and unroll the turf is faulty; the turf may be used only at risk of damaging it. One solution to the problem is to leave the small section of turf rolled out, reducing the size of usable space in McAlexander to only two of the three basketball courts that don't have permanent turf.

Intercollegiate athletics uses the turf floor for football, baseball, softball, and soccer practice, so they would like to see as much of the floor covered with turf as possible.

A meeting among various groups that use the facility was held last Thursday to discuss the issue and help the administration reach a decision.

"It's used for inclement weather (football) practice in the fall," said Dave Kragthorpe, head football coach. "Baseball and softball need the smaller roll out for daily infield practice."

Soccer, according to Kragthorpe, only needs the permanent piece of turf.

The controversy arose because property control sometimes needs space to hold its auction, and student basketball teams and ROTC drill teams need a place to practice. None of these things can be done on a turfed floor.

Tom Kirch, director of recreational sports, said the facility has about 17,000 basketball uses a year — something they can't handle with the turf in place.

"We can't accommodate those users," Kirch said. "Basketball can't be played on turf. It's just not safe."

Kirch said there is already one student filing a claim because of an injury received while playing basketball on the turf.

Gary Chandler, professor of aerospace studies for Air Force ROTC, said their weekly drill exercises can be performed on the turf flooring, their precision drill team can not.

"We tried it on the turf," Chandler said. "We found that it is just not adequate for our needs."

Both the Air Force and Navy drill teams practice at the same time, Chandler said, and there is not enough room for them. They also have not been able to find other facilities in which to practice.

Raymond Leidich, unit commanding officer for Navy ROTC, said one drill team uses two basketball courts to practice. Only three courts are available in McAlexander — when the turf is rolled up. Since both teams drill at the same time, this causes problems that are compounded by having the small section of turf unrolled.

Property control, which holds eight auctions a year in McAlexander, is hampered by the turf because they cannot drive fork lifts on it. If any of the temporary pieces of turf are unrolled, it would effectively "emasculate the program," said Bob Printz, property control supervisor.

Property control has tried alternatives, but they haven't worked.

"We tried (driving on) plywood," said Brian Thorsness, surplus property coordinator for property control. "It didn't work. It shoots out from underneath the tires when you turn."

One suggestion is to glue the small section of turf to the floor and fix the rolling mechanism on the larger piece. But if this is done, then use of the facility by the ROTC drill teams, student basketball teams, and property control would be severely curtailed. But the baseball and softball teams wouldn't have to unroll and roll the section back up when they used it.

Lynn Snyder, athletic director, suggested that Gill Coliseum be opened for student use to compensate for the loss of space in McAlexander, but Kirch pointed out that there is no assurance that Gill would remain open to students as compensation for the lost space in McAlexander.

Ed Coate, vice president for finance and administration, suggested that this might be the course of action to follow. President Byrne, the vice presidents, and the executive council will be making the final decision.

Trees, students suffer broken limbs due to ice

While the snow kept students busy throwing snowballs, it also kept maintenance workers around campus busy cleaning up the mess.

Among the more serious damage done by the snow, an 80-foot oak tree with dry-rotted roots fell on the west side of Langton Hall. Only minor damage was done by the tree, which, according to Jim Miller, grounds shop manager at the Physical Plant, was hampered by the weight of the snow on its branches and from the asphalt walks that are by it.

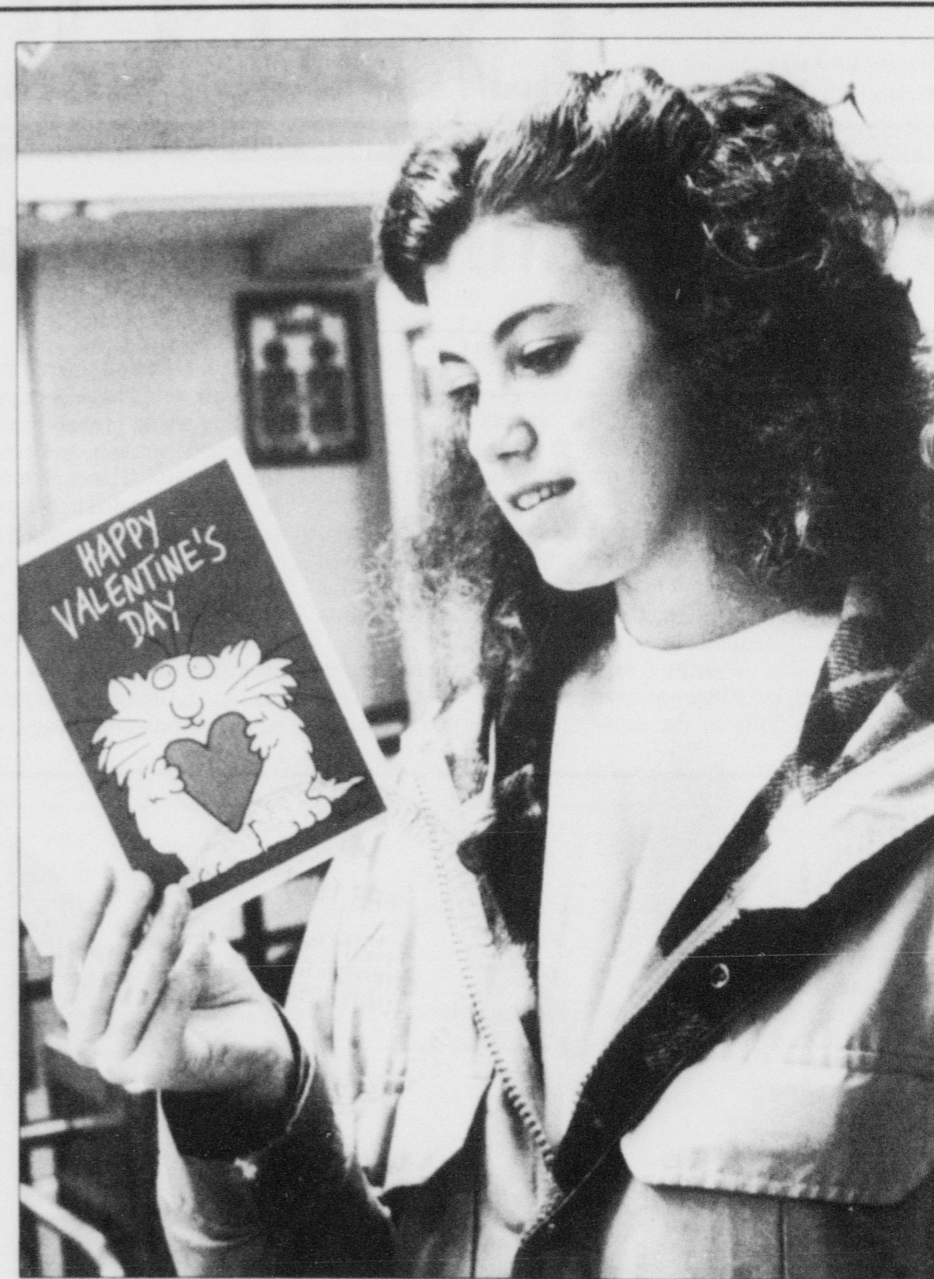
Because of the potential danger to plant workers caused by tension of the upper limbs against the building, Miller said that the job of clean-up might be delegated to a professional tree-falling company. The estimated cost is said to be \$2,000-2,500, but will more than likely be covered by insurance, Miller said.

A tree north of Benton Hall lost a 40-foot-long, 18-inch-wide limb, also due to the snow. No damage was reported.

Frozen pipes were the major problem as the temperatures dipped into the teens last week. Pipes burst in the Memorial Union, Magruder Hall, Strand Agricultural Hall and other locations, causing flood damage.

According to Howard Majors, Physical Plant employee, 45 windows around campus were broken by errantly thrown snowballs. That, along with having to lay ice-melting pellets on sidewalks around campus, cost OSU a lot of money, he said.

The Student Health Center reported that a lot of injuries were caused by slips in the snow and ice last week. Students came in with sprained ankles and broken arms, hands, feet and legs from falls taken. An official estimate on the number of injuries was not available.

Comedy show to debut on KBVR-TV

KBVR-TV studios are introducing a new twist in their programming format — comedy. Premiering three times this week is a new production, "That's Hilarious," which is produced, directed, created and performed by a group of OSU students.

The show airs on channel 31 at 8:30 p.m. tonight and Thursday this week and at 9:30 p.m. on Wednesday.

Publio Castro, one of the three student producers for the show and video promotions director at KBVR-TV, thought of the idea last year as something different.

"We (KBVR-TV) didn't really have an entertainment-type show — mostly the shows are news and documentaries and this is something that I don't think has been done," Castro said.

The show has a format similar to Saturday Night Live. Students, including Castro, act out original skits or parodies of television shows and commercials. Castro said the show started out with a Dating Game format, and switched to a show that would feature stand-up comedy. The latter idea was canned because Castro felt that at the last minute people would back out with one or two comedians doing the show.

The show is interesting because some of the 20-or-so students involved do not major in broadcasting or have not been involved in previous acting. Castro said the group wanted to do it without the hassle of real actors who might not like the way the group wanted to do things.

"Everybody came up with their own ideas, we wanted a challenge," Castro said.

He added that comedy is often hard to do, and getting people to see it your way is difficult.

"We try to make people laugh, get some experience, and get

our feet wet. I'm really happy with the people on our crew," he said.

Castro gives most of the credit to the other two producers, Kim Gowen and Chris Crouch, and the rest of the enthusiastic crew. The crew is divided into three groups under the producers, who all contribute ideas. Then the producers decide on the best ideas and the crew begins taping.

The taping began three weeks ago, and each skit takes on the average five to six hours to tape and edit for showing. Castro pointed out the opening and the use of on-location taping as the technical highlights of the show.

"People will say 'Hey, what's this' when they see the opening. We tried to place people in the right environment" to add to the overall quality of the production, he said.

The opening was filmed in Portland, and the skits have been shot on campus, outdoors, and the Portland airport. Taping and ideas are being produced for a second show, which doesn't have a viewing time yet, and Castro said the crew would like to do a one-hour special after the second show.

One skit set for the second show is titled "Air Jesus," and features a person wearing Birkenstock sandals and a Jesus costume making moves and dunks like basketball star Michael Jordan, who is also famous for his own design of Nike shoes. This idea came from one of Castro's classes when someone called someone else's sandals "Jesus shoes."

With this production Castro said he hopes to show people "a lot of work has gone into it, to see what a professional level we have and what we are capable of doing, (and) what we can do for the campus." Castro said the station gets response and inquiries about some of the other programs.

"The skits are funny, it would be a real good study break," Castro said.

EATF planning newspaper drive later this week

The OSU Environmental Affairs Task Force will be sponsoring a newspaper-only recycling drive this week which will involve all fraternities, sororities, dorms and co-ops on campus.

Recycled newspaper will be picked up at all campus living groups between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. on Wednesday or Thursday.

The drive, the theme of which is "Recycle — Money Really Does Grow on Trees," will award a money tree to the living group with the largest amount of newspaper recycled.

"The goal of this drive is to promote recycling awareness in the campus community," said EATF Director Suzi Traver.

If this increase is implemented, work could be done on the lot behind Wilson Hall, and others like it around campus. General improvements in long-term parking could be made, while the proposed short-term facility would alleviate parking problems near the center, Powell said.

Powell and the Traffic Committee rejected any plan that didn't appear safe or economically feasible. Other sites for the complex were either too expensive or were not going to be utilized sufficiently.

"It should be in a location where the elderly would have easy access and women would be safe after dark," Powell said.

The idea for a complex has the support of the MU board and the OSU Bookstore.

However, it was the concern of the Planning Committee that the structure would not fit in with the aesthetics of the campus, and would increase traffic in the center of campus.

John Hill, director of ASOSU City Affairs Task Force, said he understands the concerns of the Planning Committee.

"It's not going to be a beautiful structure," Hill said. "We would like to see three levels, above ground...because ventilation of a lower level would not be economically feasible."

Hill said he hopes to maintain ASOSU interest and reopen the issue with the Planning Committee this week.

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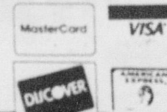

Institute wants medical research rules tightened

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Medical researchers tolerate too many poor practices and the government should create a new office to guard against fraud and sloppy science, an advisory committee said Monday.

Although it offered no statistics on the extent of scientific fraud and other

unethical activities, an Institute of Medicine committee said it believes "cases of serious misconduct in science are rare events."

However, Dr. Arthur Rubenstein, committee chairman and head of the University of Chicago's department of medicine, said the panel also concluded "the

research community currently tolerates too many substandard research practices.

"In the long run, the integrity of the research environment may be more damaged by sloppy or careless research practices and lack of (monitoring) ... than by incidents of outright research fraud."

Among the questionable practices criticized by the panel were: repetitive publication of research results, withholding data from colleagues and "gift authorship" — a practice in which scientists not closely involved with research are listed as authors of scientific papers.

The 17-member panel rejected proposals made by some in the scientific community that laboratories be subjected to audits to check on the validity of research techniques.

Rubenstein said such random checks would be "impractical because of the complex nature of most research." He said the committee feared audits could damage "the spontaneity and

creativity that is essential to a productive research environment."

In order to guard against fraudulent or shoddy research, the panel recommended the government's premier research institution, the National Institutes of Health, set up a special office to promote "high standards in research."

"The federal government should provide leadership to help the biomedical research community in the development and implementation of guidelines for responsible behavior," Rubenstein said at a news conference.

The committee emphasized the new office should be separate from an existing NIH office that helps investigate

cases of alleged scientific fraud. Dr. William Raub, NIH's deputy director, agreed more emphasis is needed on preventing scientific misconduct, but said the agency has not yet decided if another office is needed to accomplish that goal.

The proposed NIH office would provide leadership to research centers, monitor their procedures to promote high research standards and prepare educational materials, the panel said.

The panel emphasized that even with a new government office, the prime responsibility for preventing scientific fraud lies with universities and other centers where research takes place.

Officer embarrasses self with assault-rifle protest

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. (UPI) — An off-duty policeman's protest against his downstairs neighbor's loud music sent his upstairs neighbor to the hospital with a gunshot wound.

Officer Mark Haskins, a police firearms training assistant, told investigators he was lying in bed early Saturday when he was disturbed by loud music from the apartment beneath him, police spokesman Vince Dean said.

Haskins, 29, said he pulled a Frankfurt .223-

caliber assault rifle from under his bed and hit the butt of it on the floor as a signal of complaint to his neighbors below.

The gun went off, wounding a man asleep in the apartment above Haskins.

Todd Dingman, 29, told police he heard a "firecracker-type noise" and then realized he had been shot. Dingman was treated overnight at Erlanger Medical Center and was released Sunday.

Eastern chief OK's magazine

MIAMI (UPI) — Controversial airline boss Frank Lorenzo has ordered Eastern Airlines Inc. to put the latest edition of Fortune magazine back on board its jets, although the issue contains an article critical of him.

"Lorenzo personally instructed that Fortune be put back on the planes," Eastern spokesman Robin Matell said Monday. "He knew nothing about the original decision" to ban the current issue of Fortune from Eastern's skies.

Matell said the magazine, which features Lorenzo on its cover, will be added to the complimentary reading material offered on Eastern's fleet of 250 jets as soon as possible.

Matell said Lorenzo objected on principle to the ban imposed last week. "We are not in the

business of censorship," Matell said, paraphrasing Lorenzo.

Lorenzo is chairman of Texas Air Corp. of Houston, parent company of Eastern and Continental airlines.

Eastern had ordered all copies of the magazine removed from its planes in a terse directive to aircraft service managers around the nation.

"It is imperative that the current issue of Fortune magazine be removed immediately from all Eastern aircraft," the order from middle managers in Miami stated.

"Dispose of all copies locally. Have a member of management audit all aircraft to ensure compliance.

Workers allege shoddy construction

CHRISTMAS VALLEY (UPI) — Construction on the Air Force Over-The-Horizon Backscatter Radar installation in southern Oregon has been halted while military and government officials investigate allegations of improper and substandard construction.

Officials for the Air Force and General Electric Co., the primary contractor, said they're investigating complaints at the site 18 miles east of Christmas Valley. The office of Sen. Mark Hatfield, R-Ore., also is looking into the matter, officials said Monday.

"We have placed an inquiry to the Department of Defense asking them to report their

finding to us," said Julie McGregor, a Hatfield aide.

The \$500 million project begun in 1987 is considered by the Defense Department to be a key system for detecting enemy aircraft.

Construction at the site is 75 percent completed, but Robert Lay, Scott Campbell and other workers contend some of the 216 towers supporting radar antennas aren't built according to blueprints and proper procedures.

The Air Force and GE last week confirmed several problems, including cracked steel mounts on the 135-foot towers and a bent antenna.

But the problems aren't serious enough to warrant delay

of the project, which is ahead of its 1990 schedule, Air Force Lt. Col. David Kloc said.

He said all the problems that have been detected can be corrected, but would not say when.

Lay, 35, and three other tower crew workers allege that subcontractor North Central Construction Co. of Moses Lake, Wash., pushed workers to rush jobs and provided poor supervision.

Scott Campbell, 28; Tom Thompson, 33; and Mike Barker, 40, agreed. The four claim North Central used the wrong procedures or inadequate equipment to build some of the towers.

"I will not do shoddy work,"

Lay said. "I refuse to do it, especially on our national defense system."

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Officials suggest radon testing

PORTLAND (UPI) — Some government health and energy officials say all Oregon homes should be tested for cancer-causing radon gas.

Aerial surveys have found radon hot-spots in north Portland, Hood River, Lakeview and other areas where radon gas seeps up from un-

derground deposits of uranium, Bonneville Power Administration officials said Monday.

A recent test of about 10,000 Oregon homes indicated one in 50 contained radon gas above acceptable levels, BPA investigators said.

U.S. Surgeon General C.

Everett Koop said indoor radon gas pollution is second only to smoking as the leading risk of lung cancer in the United States.

The National Academy of Sciences estimates radon leads to about 13,000 deaths annually in the United States, which account for about 10 percent of all lung cancer deaths in the country each year.

State health officials said radon levels in Oregon are generally below danger levels set by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, but the exact amount of radon that poses a threat to health remains a mystery.

"In the area of radiation, we simply don't know how much is too little" too worry about, said Ray Parris, manager of radiation control for the state health division. "It only takes one atom interacting with one cell to cause a problem."

Spanish galleon sought off the Oregon coast

TILLAMOOK (UPI) — A California man's search for sunken treasure off the Oregon coast will be the subject of a television show next spring.

Bill Warren of Carlsbad, Calif., received a state permit last week to search for a 16th century Spanish galleon he said may have sunk off Nehalem Bay, with as much as \$550 million in riches — by today's standards — aboard.

Representatives of the NBC TV show "Unsolved Mysteries" have been in the area to conduct interviews and film. The program on Warren's quest is scheduled to air May 17.

Warren said actor Clint Eastwood has expressed interest in the project and may fly a helicopter in the search for the vessel 25 miles north of Tillamook.

"He's a risk-taker, like I am," Warren said.

Warren said the search by a helicopter and two boats will include sensitive metal detectors to locate gold, silver and other treasures.

If searchers find the ship, Warren said excavation would take at least several months.

Warren said he has found 22 wrecked ships off the California coast in the past 13 years. Those ships contained \$200,000 in treasure, he said.

Agreement may allow Iran-Contra case to progress

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The judge in the Iran-Contra case sent the jury home again Monday while he weighed whether a government plan for handling state secrets would block a fair trial for former White House aide Oliver North.

U.S. District Judge Gerhard Gesell set a Tuesday hearing to listen to arguments on the details of the proposal thrashed out during the weekend between independent prosecutor Lawrence Walsh and Attorney General Dick Thornburgh.

The Justice Department is fearful that North's lawyers will expose government secrets during the trial and persuaded the Supreme Court Sunday to halt the proceedings until the issue was ironed out.

The government and Walsh agreed on a new procedure for handling classified material during testimony — but the complicated scheme could force Gesell to delay the trial repeatedly, and North's lawyers say such delays will prevent their client from being tried fairly.

Walsh's proposal cited nine areas of secret

information the government does not want revealed and how North's lawyers may use the documents in their effort to prove him innocent of the 12 felony counts with which he is charged.

Prevented from starting North's 12-count felony trial by a Supreme Court order Sunday, Gesell apologized to the nine-woman, three-

man jury and dismissed them at least until Wednesday.

The list of categories in Walsh's proposal was heavily edited before public release Monday, but left in were the categories of CIA activities and the names of countries, other than Brunei and Taiwan, that gave money to the Contra rebels.

Senators ask about North trial

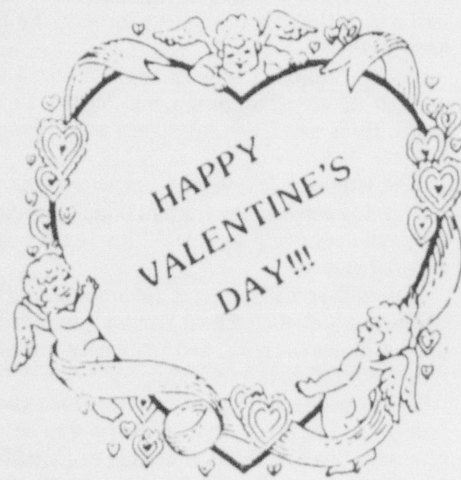
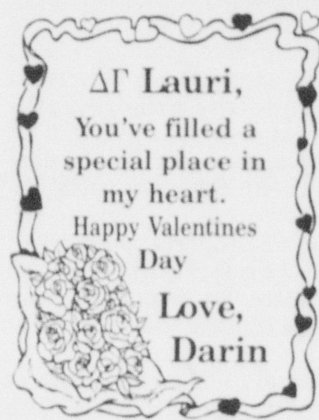
WASHINGTON (UPI) — Senators asked Attorney General Dick Thornburgh Monday to explain why he fought the use of certain sensitive information in the trial of Oliver North, wiping out two central charges in the Iran-Contra case.

Sens. David Boren of Oklahoma and William Cohen of Maine, the Democratic chairman and ranking Republican of the Select Committee on Intelligence, released a letter calling Thornburgh to a closed hearing Feb. 21 along with CIA Director William Webster and others from the intelligence community.

The two key charges against North, con-

spiracy to defraud the government and theft of government property, were dismissed by U.S. District Judge Gerhard Gesell last month after Thornburgh declared certain intelligence information could not be used as evidence in the trial of the former White House aide.

The start of North's trial on 12 remaining felony counts was delayed further last week when Thornburgh's Justice Department went to court to challenge the procedure for protecting additional classified information. Judge Gesell began weighing Monday an agreement worked out by the department and Walsh covering use of the data during trial.



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Arizona falls from No. 1; UCLA jumps into Top 20

NEW YORK (UPI) — Oklahoma regained the No. 1 ranking it lost last week. Maybe this time the Sooners will do a better job of holding onto the slippery role assumed by a different basketball team each of the last five weeks.

The Sooners capitalized on home victories over No. 1 Arizona and No. 3 Missouri to gain overwhelming support for the top spot Monday from UPT's Board of Coaches.

"I think we're going to really pay attention to our games and go about our business," Oklahoma Coach Bill Tubbs said. "I like being No. 1. We'd like to stay there, but we're not going to get really into a hype thing on No. 1. We're experienced at this now so maybe we can do better."

Oklahoma received 35 of 39 first-place votes cast and totaled 579 of a possible 585 points. Arizona fell a notch to No. 2 after losing 82-80 Sunday at Oklahoma. The Wildcats claimed two first-place votes and 508 points. Florida State and Indiana split the other two No. 1 votes.

Rounding out the Top 20 were: No. 3 Missouri, No. 4 Georgetown, No. 5 Syracuse, No. 6 Illinois, No. 7 North Carolina, No. 8 Indiana, No. 9 Florida State, No. 10 Louisville, No. 11 Seton Hall, No. 12 Duke, No. 13

Michigan, No. 14 West Virginia, No. 15 Iowa, No. 16 Stanford, No. 17 Nevada-Las Vegas, No. 18 North Carolina State, No. 19 Ohio State, and co-Nos. 20 Texas-El Paso and UCLA.

Oklahoma, which had fallen to No. 5 last week after losing to Oklahoma State, rebounded by beating two of the toughest teams in the nation in a four-day span.

"Those are the types of games that you're not really concerned with your team being ready to play," Oklahoma Coach Billy Tubbs said. "If you can't get ready to play games like that, you'll never get ready for anything. It's a little tougher playing them that close together because it doesn't seem like you're having the time to prepare."

"Keep in mind, we had three games over a six-day period. That made it tough because we had Iowa State in there. The thing that we were fortunate in was the fact that those all came at home."

The fact Missouri and Arizona lost at Oklahoma explains why they didn't drop much in the rankings. The Sooners have won 91 of their last 93 home games and they received tight battles from the Tigers and the Wildcats. Missouri lost by 5 points and Arizona by 2.

Oklahoma has an excellent chance of retain-

ing the No. 1 ranking this week, something no team has done since Duke held it for the first nine weeks. The Sooners have road games at Kansas and Colorado. Wednesday's game in Lawrence will be a rematch of last season's NCAA final.

"I know they're a capable team and I know it's going to be a tough game and it's another big challenge for us," Tubbs said.

Each of last week's top four teams lost, but Louisville was affected the most. The Car-

dinals, who tumbled from fourth to 10th, lost to Florida State and UCLA. Georgetown slipped from second to fourth after losing to Pittsburgh.

Syracuse and Indiana made the most noteworthy leaps in the rankings. The Orangemen went from 10th to fifth and had won six straight entering Monday night's Big East battle with Georgetown. Indiana, which has taken control in the Big Ten, improved from 12th to eighth.

Landry shuffles coaches, plans to stay with Dallas into 1990s

DALLAS (UPI) — Dallas Cowboys Coach Tom Landry on Monday announced a major shakeup in his coaching staff and said he had told his new assistants that if management did not fire him, he would stay on to lead the team into the 1990s.

Landry, who will turn 65 on Sept. 11, is working under a three-year contract that expires at the end of the 1989 season. He is the only head coach in Cowboys' history, but the team has been beset by a 2 1/2-year losing skid and is up for sale by its managing partner, Dallas financier H.R. "Bum" Bright.

"Who knows what management will want to do," Landry said. "But if anybody would want me, I would be available to continue coaching. I've made a commitment to the new coaches that I will stay on past next year unless I'm forced to do otherwise."

"Surprisingly, I've survived the onslaught. I might not survive the next one. I never said I wouldn't be around after next year. I'll go when I decide it's time — or when management decides it's time."

Cowboys president and general manager Tex Schramm said he agreed Landry should stay on but tempered his remarks with an indication he hoped to see progress in the team.

"Anybody who has had the success that he has had over 29 years deserves to end his career in a manner he would choose to do it," Schramm said. "Next year, that will be weighed for what is best for the Cowboys."

Landry announced he had hired one-time Cowboys quarterback Jerry Rhome, most recently offensive coordinator with the San Diego Chargers, to serve as passing coordinator and quarterback coach. He also hired George Hill,

fired by the Indianapolis Colts at the end of the 1989 season, as defensive coordinator.

Pushed aside were Paul Hackett, hired in 1986 to coach the team's quarterbacks, and Hall of Famer Ernie Stautner, who has been with Landry since 1966.

Both men will remain with the team in non-coaching capacities, although Hackett is likely to leave as soon as he can find another job. Stautner will retire following the 1989 season.

The moves were a reflection of the Cowboys' 3-13 record last season and the team's ability to halt a slide that began midway through the 1986 season.

As for Stautner, Landry said: "I can't say enough about what Ernie has meant to the team. He is one I will miss very much for my staff."

The longtime friendship, however, was not enough to keep Landry from making a move he felt was necessary to rebuild his team's sagging defense.

Hill will be in charge of revamping Dallas' defense, which throughout Landry's career has used a four-man front and primarily man-for-man coverage in the secondary.

It has been called the "flex" defense and is based on the belief that if every gap in the offensive line was filled, it would be difficult for teams to run against. In this era of pass-minded offenses, however, the flex has grown obsolete.

"Our future lies in the quarterback," Landry said, "whether that quarterback is Steve Pelluer, Troy Aikman, Scott Secules or Danny White."

"I am going to spend a lot of time in that area."





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Drexler, Duckworth enjoy NBA All-Star Game

PORTLAND (UPI) — Clyde Drexler played out of position some of the time and Kevin Duckworth wasn't in his accustomed starting role, but both Portland Trail Blazers had a ball in the 39th-annual NBA All-Star Game.

With Magic Johnson of the Los Angeles Lakers out because of an injury, Drexler played both point and off guard for the West in a 143-134 victory over the East Sunday in the All-Star Game at Houston.

Drexler, an off guard for the Blazers, had 14 points, 12 rebounds, four assists and two steals in 25 minutes. He also had six turnovers, most of them coming when he was in the role of playmaker.

But Drexler said he thoroughly enjoyed playing the point in front of family and friends in the city where he grew up and began developing the moves that made him an all-star.

"I enjoyed it," Drexler said. "It's not my regular position, but it is a fun position. To play it in an All-Star Game is a lot of fun."

But Drexler said he has no desire to play point guard full time.

"I officially resign the point guard position," he said.

It was Drexler's third All-Star Game in his six-year professional career. Duckworth, a third-year pro, saw only seven minutes of action in his first All-Star Game.

Duckworth, the Blazers' starting center, scored five points and had a rebound. Afterward, he said being chosen to the team by Western Conference coaches was more meaningful than if he had been selected in balloting by the fans to be a starter.

"The fans may not recognize what I can do, but the coaches do," Duckworth said. "I think it's a greater honor to be chosen by the coaches than the fans because the fans tend to overlook

things. It tends to be a popularity contest to start for one of the teams."

Duckworth, at 24 the youngest member of the West team, saw less playing time with the addition of Lakers' center Kareem Abdul-Jabbar to the squad after Johnson was sidelined.

With the addition of Abdul-Jabbar and the loss of Johnson, the West team had four centers and only one true point guard, Utah's John Stockton.

Duckworth was the last player in the game for the West.

"I was beginning to wonder if I'd ever get in the game," Duckworth said, adding that his chief goal was "to keep making a fool of myself."

Abdul-Jabbar had only four points in his 19th and final All-Star Game. He has announced his retirement at the end of this season.

Who's the heroes?

Baseball has always been America's favorite pastime, and soon the 1989 season will be under way, with fans by the thousands pouring into the stadiums to watch their favorite superstars. But who are they? In years past the word "hero" brought to mind images of Babe Ruth, Joe DiMaggio and Lou Gehrig. But today's youth are hard pressed to find such clear-cut heroes.

There is little doubt that the sports heroes of the past were larger than life and immortalized by America's youth. But today's athletes do not seem to project that same type of image. More often than not, today's headlines are speaking of drug abuse, contract disputes and bench-clearing brawls.

What has caused the decline of the sports hero. Will we ever be able to recapture the image of heroes past?

In the past century, more heroes have come from baseball than any other sport. The mystique of these legendary figures has grown over time.

Payton picks up another honor

For the third time this season, Oregon State point guard Gary Payton, a 6-3 junior from Oakland, Calif., was chosen as the Pacific 10 Conference Player of the Week as he led the Beavers to a pair of wins last week.

Payton scored 30 points in an 89-83 triumph over Arizona State and came back with a 24-point performance in a 76-73 victory over Marquette.

In a game in which the Beavers had to fight hard for the win against the Sun Devils, Payton exploded in the first half, making five-of-six 3-point attempts for 23 points. He also added four assists and five steals in the first 20 minutes of play.

The Sun Devils went to a diamond and one on Payton in the

second half, which slowed down the Beavers in the second half, but the flashy guard still finished with a game-high 30 points.

Against Marquette, Payton sank two free throws with 1:08 left to give Oregon State a 75-71 lead and came back to make one of two free throws with 31 seconds left to cap the Beavers' scoring and secure the 76-73 win.

Payton scored 24 points and added eight assists to go along with fellow backcourt member Eric Knox's 28 points and nine assists.

In conference games only, Payton leads the league in scoring, assists and steals and is fifth in blocked shots. He equals Stanford guard Todd Lichti by being picked as the Pac-10 Player of the Week for the third time this season. No other player in the league has won the award more than once.

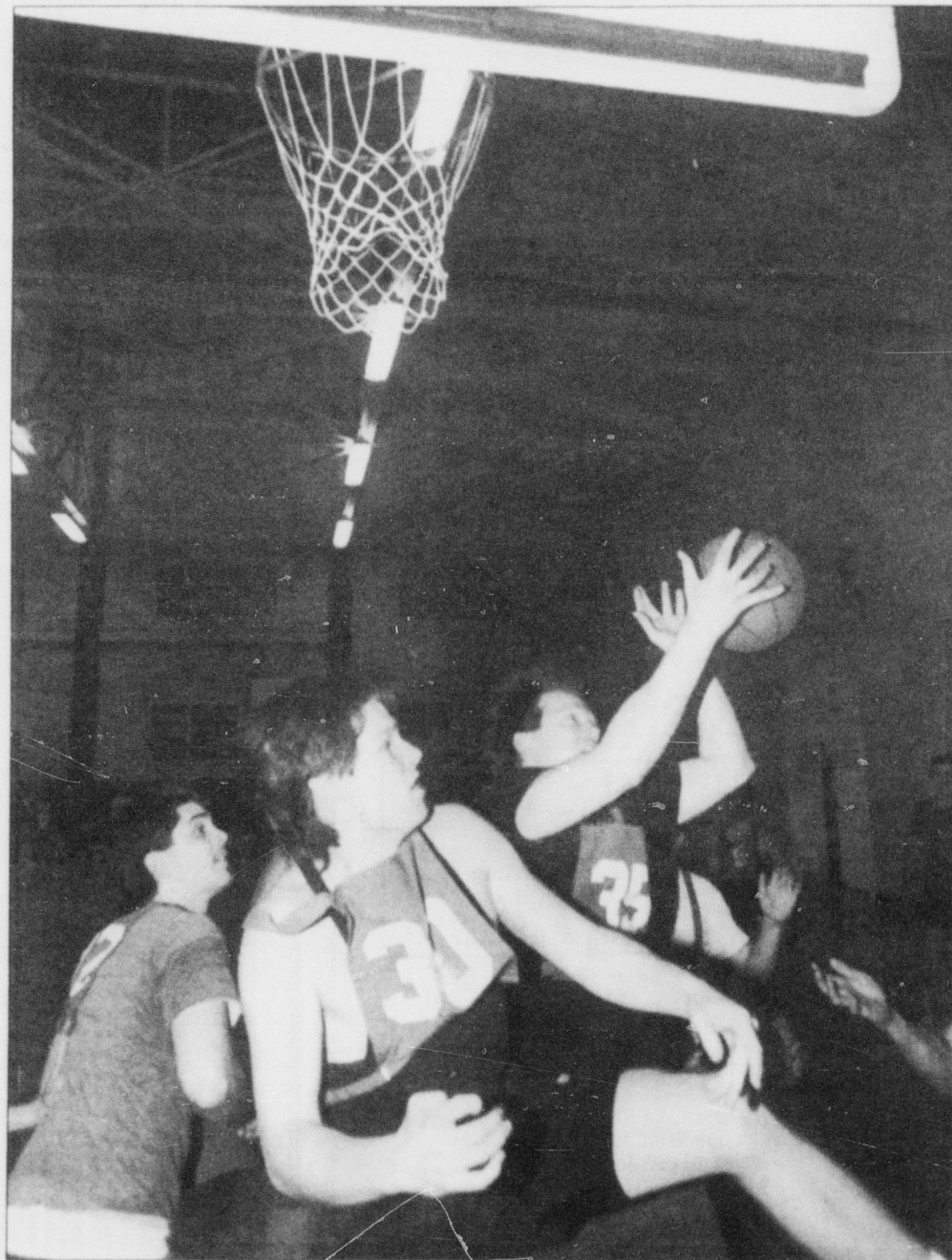
